World Trade Organization (WTO)

Ecuador's import surcharge still under review as WTO members remain divided

On 29 November 2016, the WTO reported that most WTO members welcomed Ecuador's efforts to lower its import surcharge rates and reduce the number of tariff lines affected by this measure at a meeting of the Committee on Balance-of-Payments Restrictions on 29 November but they remain divided on whether the measure is in conformity with WTO rules. Consultations with Ecuador will resume in April 2017. Ecuador reaffirmed its intention to phase out the import surcharge completely by June 2017, a year later than originally agreed.

Chile, Swaziland, Dominica and Mongolia ratify TFA

On 21 November 2016, the WTO announced that Chile and Swaziland have ratified the Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA), making them the 97th and 98th WTO members to do so. Their submission of the instruments of acceptance to the WTO on 21 November means that nearly 90 per cent of the ratifications needed to bring

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the TFA into force have now been received. The TFA will enter into force once two-thirds of the WTO membership has formally accepted the Agreement. The TFA contains provisions for expediting the movement, release and clearance of goods, including goods in transit. It also sets out measures for effective cooperation between customs and other appropriate authorities on trade facilitation and customs compliance issues. It further contains provisions for technical assistance and capacity building in this area.

On 29 November the WTO announced that Dominica and Mongolia have ratified the TFA, putting the total number of ratifications from members at 100. With just 10 more ratifications from members needed to bring the TFA into force, the final countdown begins for realizing a global deal that could boost global merchandise exports by up to \$1 trillion per annum by slashing trade costs and cutting red tape at the border.

Majority of participants have now implemented ITA expansion commitments

On 1 November 2016, the WTO announced that a large majority of participants in the newly-expanded Information Technology Agreement (ITA) have now implemented their tariff commitments under the deal, with full implementation on track for the near future. To date, 18 of the 24 participants in the expanded ITA have now submitted modified tariff schedules and that others were on track to do so. The announcement said that:

The agreement received a major boost on 26 October 2016 when China submitted its ITA expansion commitments to WTO Director-General Roberto Azevêdo for inclusion in its WTO schedule of concessions. China's commitments were ratified by the country's Standing Committee of the National People's Congress on 3 September 2016, and China started implementing its first tariff cuts on covered goods from 15 September 2016.

Canada [reporting on behalf of the ITA Expansion group to the WTO's ITA Committee] said it was also pleased to report that Macao, China, has initiated the process to join the expanded ITA and that it was currently working on its draft schedule. Other WTO members have expressed an interest in joining the expanded ITA in the near future, Canada said.

The expansion of the ITA, agreed at the Nairobi Ministerial Conference in December 2015, eliminates tariffs on products valued at over \$1.3 trillion in annual trade. These are in addition to the products covered under the original ITA concluded in December 1996, which accounted for an estimated \$1.6 trillion in global trade in 2013.

The expanded ITA was concluded by 24 participants representing 53 WTO members, but the benefits are being extended to all 164 WTO members, meaning they will all enjoy duty-free access to the markets of the members eliminating tariffs on these products.

The new deal provides for the elimination of import tariffs and other duties and charges on an additional 201 new-generation information and communication technology products either immediately or progressively over three years. By 2019, it is estimated that 95.4 per cent of participants' import duties on these products will be fully eliminated, with tariffs remaining on a small range of products to be completely removed by 2021 or 2023 at the latest.

Panama publishes 2017 Tariff

On 21 November 2016, the *Official Gazette* published <u>Cabinet Decree № 35 of 15 November 2016</u>, which adopts the WCO Sixth Amendment to Harmonized System Nomenclature, and incorporates into the National Import Tariff the 10 digit Spanish version adopted by the Council of Ministers for Economic Integration Resolution № 372-2015 (COMIECO-LXXIV) on 4 December 2015. The new Tariff is effective 1 January 2017. The Decree also establishes the Spanish version of the Explanatory Notes as the official interpretation of the National Import Tariff.

Canada

Legislation introduced to implement Canada-Ukraine Free Trade Agreement

On November 3, 2016, the Government announced that the Hon. Chrystia Freeland, Minister of International Trade, introduced legislation in the House of Commons to implement the Canada-Ukraine Free Trade Agreement (CUFTA). The legislation will be subject to all required stages of the legislative process. Canada is committed to the timely ratification of CUFTA so Canadians and Ukrainians alike can take advantage of its benefits as soon as possible. The Government said that, when implemented, the CUFTA will generate opportunities for Canadians and Ukrainians, create new job opportunities, and help to grow the middle class and those working hard to join it. The announcement said that:

When CUFTA enters into force, Canada will immediately eliminate duties on 99.9 percent of imports from Ukraine. Similarly, Ukraine will eliminate tariffs on approximately 86 percent of Canadian exports, with the balance of tariff concessions to be implemented over a period of up to seven years. CUFTA will thus eliminate essentially all tariffs on goods currently traded between Canada and Ukraine.

Canada is deeply committed to working with the people of Ukraine to help implement important economic and democratic reforms and to strengthen business ties between the two countries.

Canada expands sanctions against North Korea

On October 21, 2016, the Government of Canada published amendments to its trade and economic sanctions against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea ("DPRK") in the Regulations Amending the Regulations Implementing the United Nations Resolutions on the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) (SOR/2016-278, Oct. 21, 2016) (the "Regulations") made under the United Nations Act.

Amending the Regulations enables the Government of Canada to incorporate into Canadian law the additional sanctions measures adopted by the United Nations Security Council in Resolution 2270. Resolution 2270 was adopted on March 2, 2016 in response to the DPRK's nuclear test conducted on January 6, 2016, and use of ballistic missile technology to launch a long-range rocket on February 7, 2016.

The additional sanctions measures contained in the amendments to the Regulations include the following:

- A ban on the sale, supply or transfer of aviation fuel destined for the DPRK or for any person in the DPRK (except for aviation fuel provided to a DPRK passenger aircraft for its return flight to the DPRK);
- A ban on the import, purchase or acquisition of coal, iron, iron ore, gold, titanium ore, vanadium ore and rare earth minerals from the DPRK or from any person in the DPRK:
- A ban on providing teaching or training to any national of the DPRK in disciplines which could contribute to proliferation-sensitive nuclear activities or the development of nuclear weapon delivery systems in the DPRK, including in advanced physics, advanced computer simulation and related computer sciences, geospa-

tial navigation, nuclear engineering, aerospace engineering, aeronautical engineering and related disciplines;

- A ban on the provision, under lease or charter, of a Canadian-flagged vessel or aircraft, or crew services for such a vessel or aircraft;
- A ban on registering a vessel in the DPRK; obtaining authorization for a vessel to fly the DPRK flag; owning, leasing, operating or insuring any DPRK-flagged vessel; and providing any vessel classification, certification or related service for any DPRK-flagged vessel;
- The addition, to the list of entities that must determine on a continuing basis whether they are in possession or control of property that is owned, held or controlled by or on behalf of a designated person, of "persons and entities engaged in the business of foreign exchange dealing, of remitting funds or transmitting funds by any means or through any person, entity or electronic funds transfer network, or of issuing or redeeming money orders, traveller's cheques or other similar negotiable instruments except for cheques payable to a named person or entity", if the activity involves the opening of an account for a client;
- A new provision allowing a Canadian federal or provincial "official" to disclose personal information to the Minister of Foreign Affairs, who in turn may disclose personal information to the United Nations Security Council, the Panel of Experts established under Security Council Resolution 1874 or the Focal Point for Delisting;
- A ban on legal proceedings in Canada at the instance of the Government of the DPRK, any person in the DPRK, any designated person or any person claiming through or acting on behalf of any designated person, in connection with any contract or other dealing if its performance was prevented by the Regulations.

It is worth noting that Canada also imposes sanctions against the DPRK pursuant to regulations made under the Special Economic Measures Act ("SEMA"). Under SEMA, the Government of Canada has imposed broad trade embargoes, including in part bans on all imports from and exports to the DPRK, and a ban on investments in any entity in the DPRK that involve a dealing in any property, wherever situated, held by or on behalf of the DPRK, any person in the DPRK, or a national of the DPRK who does not ordinarily reside in Canada. The sanctions against the DPRK made under SEMA were not amended at this time.

eManifest requirements for freight forwarders

Under eManifest, freight forwarders are required to transmit advance house bill data electronically to the CBSA. The data must be received and validated by the CBSA prior to arrival, within the prescribed mode-specific time frames. Regulatory amendments supporting the eManifest initiative were published on May 6, 2015, in the Canada Gazette Part II. Customs Notice 16-17 provided the time frames shown below.

Following a voluntary compliance period, the implementation timeline below applies to eManifest requirements for freight forwarders to electronically transmit advance house bill data on consolidated freight to the CBSA within the prescribed mode-specific time frames:

November 7, 2016, to January 10, 2017, the CBSA will provide freight forwarders with a period of transition during which penalties for non-compliance will not be issued and the CBSA will work closely with freight forwarders on corrective

- January 11, 2017, to July 11, 2017, freight forwarders deemed to be noncompliant with eManifest requirements may be issued zero-rated penalties (nonmonetary) under the CBSA's Administrative Monetary Penalty System (AMPS).
- Beginning July 12, 2017, freight forwarders deemed to be non-compliant with eManifest requirements may be issued monetary AMPS penalties.

Consolidated shipments arriving in Canada on or after November 7, 2016, are subject to advance electronic house bill requirements even if the movement begins prior to this time frame. Information regarding the application of penalties is outlined in the above bullets.

Mexico

Special border tariff treatment extended until 2019

On November 17, 2016, the Diario Oficial de la Federacion (Federal Official Gazette) published the Decree amending and extending the life of the Decree by which the general import tax is established for the border region and the northern border, which extends the special tariff treatment for the border area and northern border that is due to expire on December 31, 2016 until December 31, 2019, in order to strengthen the competitiveness of business activities in those areas. The special tariff treatment permits certain goods to be relieved of duties and others to be taxed at a 5% rate, in lieu of the normal import taxes.

President continues national emergency with respect to Burundi

On November 14, 2016, the Federal Register published Presidential Notice of November 9, 2016 - Continuation of the National Emergency With Respect to Burundi, which extends for an additional year the national emergency first declared in Executive Order (EO) 13712 of November 22, 2015 to deal with the unusual and extraordinary threat to the national security and foreign policy of the United States constituted by the situation in Burundi, which has been marked by the killing of and violence against civilians, unrest, the incitement of imminent violence, and significant political repression, and which threatens the peace, security, and stability of Burundi. The national emergency is being extended because the situation in Burundi continues to pose an unusual and extraordinary threat to the national security and foreign policy of the United States.

President continues national emergency with respect to WMDs

On November 10, 2016, the Federal Register published Presidential Notice of November 8, 2016 - Continuation of the National Emergency With Respect to the Proliferation of Weapons of Mass Destruction, which extends for an additional year the national emergency first declared in Executive Order (EO) 12938 of November 14, 1994 to deal with the unusual and extraordinary threat to the national security, foreign policy, and economy of the United States posed by the proliferation of nuclear, biological, and chemical weapons (weapons of mass destruction) and the means of delivering such weapons. EO 13094 (July 28, 1998) and EO 13382 (June 28, 2005) amended EO 12938. The national emergency is being extended because the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and the means of delivering them continues to pose an unusual and extraordinary threat to the national security, foreign policy, and economy of the United States.

President continues national emergency with respect to Iran

On November 7, 2016, the Federal Register published Presidential Notice of November 3, 2016 - Continuation of the National Emergency With Respect to Iran, which extends the national emergency first declared in Executive Order (EO) 12170 of November 14, 1979 to deal with the unusual and extraordinary threat to the national security, foreign policy, and economy of the United States constituted by the situation in Iran. The emergency is being continued because our relations with Iran have not yet returned to normal, and the process of implementing the agreements with Iran, dated January 19, 1981, is still under way.

President continues national emergency with respect to Sudan

On November 2, 2016, the Federal Register published Presidential Notice of October 31, 2016 - Continuation of the National Emergency With Respect to Sudan which extends for an additional year the national emergency first declared in Executive Order (EO) 13067 of November 3, 1997. The national emergency is being continued because the actions and policies of the Government of Sudan continue to pose an unusual and extraordinary threat to the national security and foreign policy of the United States, the national emergency declared in EO 13067, expanded on April 26, 2006, and with respect to which additional steps were taken on October 13, 2006.

USTR makes import statistics available for GSP CNLs

On November 16, 2016, the Office of the United States Trade Representative.(USTR) published in the Federal Register a notice inform the public of the availability of import statistics for the first nine months of 2016 relating to competitive need limitations (CNLs) under the Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) program. These import statistics identify some articles for which the 2016 trade levels may exceed statutory CNLs. Interested parties may find this information useful in deciding whether to submit a petition to waive the CNLs for individual beneficiary developing countries (BDCs) with respect to specific GSP-eligible articles.

DHS adopts rulemaking petition procedures

On November 28, 2016, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. DHS-2009-0009] adopting a process under which interested persons may petition the Department to issue, amend, or repeal a rule. The rule is effective December 28, 2016.

DHS issues FOIA amendments that apply to CBP

On November 22, 2016, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. DHS-2009-0036] that amends the DHS regulations under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). The regulations have been revised to update and streamline the language of several procedural provisions, and to incorporate changes brought about by the amendments to the FOIA under the OPEN Government Act of 2007. Additionally, the regulations have been updated to reflect developments in the case law. The amendments include section 5.12 "Confidential commercial information; CBP procedures" which sets forth notification and disclosure policy when commercial information provided to U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) by a business submitter is requested under FOIA.

The amendments are effective December 22, 2016.

CBP provides notice of 2017 Customs Broker User Fee

On November 29, 2016, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the Federal Register a general notice providing notice to customs brokers that the annual user fee of \$138 that is assessed for each permit held by a broker, whether it may be an individual, partnership, association, or corporation, is due by February 3, 2017.

CBP adopts final rule for APEC Business Travel Card

On November 23, 2016, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. USCBP-2013-0029; CBP Decision No. 16-20] that adopts with two changes interim amendments to the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) regulations published in the Federal Register on May 13, 2014 establishing the U.S. Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Business Travel Card Program. The U.S. APEC Business Travel Card Program provides qualified U.S. business travelers engaged in business in the APEC region, or U.S. Government officials actively engaged in APEC business, the ability to access fast-track immigration lanes at participating airports in foreign APEC economies. This rule is effective on December 23, 2016.

CBP extends import restriction on certain archaeological and ethnological material from Greece

On November 23, 2016, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the Federal Register a final rule [CBP Dec. 16-21] that amends the CBP regulations to reflect the extension of import restrictions on certain archaeological and ethnological material from the Hellenic Republic (Greece). The restrictions, which were originally imposed by CBP Decision (CBP Dec.) 11-25, are due to expire on November 21, 2016. The Assistant Secretary for Educational and Cultural Affairs, United States Department of State, has determined that factors continue to warrant the imposition of import restrictions and no cause for suspension exists. Accordingly, these import restrictions will remain in effect for an additional five years, and the CBP regulations are being amended to reflect this extension until November 21, 2021. These restrictions are being extended pursuant to determinations of the United States Department of State made under the terms of the Convention on Cultural Property Implementation Act that implemented the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Convention on the Means of Prohibiting and Preventing the Illicit Import, Export and Transfer of Ownership of Cultural Property. CBP Dec. 11-25 contains the Designated List of

archaeological and ecclesiastical ethnological material from Greece, to which the restrictions apply.

CBP establishes new e-commerce and small business team

On November 25, 2016, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) announced the establishment of the E-Commerce and Small Business Branch within the agency's Office of Trade. Worldwide e-commerce sales are expected to reach over \$4 trillion by 2020 - the branch will work to address the various complexities resulting from this new global shift.

CBP stated that it is committed to ensuring the safe and legitimate flow of trade, while at the same time identifying and preventing inferior and unsafe merchandise from entering into the global commerce. As the holiday shopping season approaches and as Small Business Saturday and Cyber Monday sales spike, CBP warns consumers that the benefits afforded by online platforms also elevate the risk and opportunity for criminal trade.

CBP signs MOU with Ghana Revenue Authority

On November 2, 2016, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) announced that:

...Commissioner Kerlikowske traveled to Ghana and South Africa to meet with government officials. Discussion focused on the current partnerships and existing work as well as areas for future collaboration focusing on enhancing border security and trade

facilitation. The Commissioner also signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Commissioner John Vianny Kuudamnuru of the Ghana Revenue Authority. The MOU is an example of how this collaboration can further enhance the exchange of customs information and expertise between the two countries.

CBP issues final determinations in procurement cases

CBP has published in the Federal Register the following determinations concerning the country of origin of merchandise for purposes of US Government procurement under the Trade Agreements Act. A copy of the final determination may be reviewed by clicking on the ruling number. Any party-at-interest may seek judicial review of the final determination within 30 days of the date of publication in the Federal Register.

Consultation rules for exports of unclassified nuclear technology

On November 15, 2016, the National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA), Department of Energy (DOE); Department of State (State), and Department of Commerce (Commerce) published in the Federal Register a notice regarding consultations with the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) with respect to certain exports of unclassified nuclear technology and assistance. Section 3136 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2016 (NDAA) mandates that the ODNI also be consulted with respect to each authorization under section 57b.(2) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (AEA) [which is implemented through 10 C.F.R. Part 810], to a covered foreign country as defined in section 3136(i)(2) of the NDAA. The notice amends the Procedures Established Pursuant to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act of 1978 to implement this consultation requirement.

FinCEN imposes Special Measure against North Korea

On November 9, 2016, the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN) published in the Federal Register a final rule imposing additional restrictions on North Korean banks and other financial institutions. The final rule prohibits "covered financial institutions" (CFIs) from opening or maintaining a correspondent account for, or on behalf of, North Korean banking institutions. The rule further prohibits CFIs from processing transactions for the correspondent account of a foreign bank in the United States if such a transaction involves a North Korean financial institution, and requires CFIs to apply special due diligence to guard against such use by North Korean financial institutions.

For purposes of these rules, "CFIs" generally include the following: insured banks; commercial banks; agencies or branches of a foreign bank in the United States;

federally insured credit unions; savings associations; certain banking corporations authorized to do foreign banking business; federally-regulated trust banks or trust companies; certain brokers or dealers in securities; certain futures commission merchants or introducing brokers; and mutual funds.

The final rule is effective December 9, 2016.

FinCEN amends Bank Secrecy regulations

On November 4, 2016, the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN) published in the Federal Register a final rule that updates various sections of the regulations implementing the Bank Secrecy Act ("BSA") by removing or replacing outdated references to obsolete BSA forms, removing references to outdated recordkeeping storage media, and replacing several other outdated terms and references.

FinCEN has transitioned from industry-specific forms to an industry-wide, single BSA form for currency transactions—the Bank Secrecy Act Currency Transaction Report. FinCEN has also replaced the five industry-specific suspicious activity reports with a combined suspicious activity report, the Bank Secrecy Act Suspicious Activity Report, which is now used by various financial industry segments. This final rule revises the BSA regulations by updating them to reflect the names of the new reports. The revised regulations also removes references to microfilm—that is no longer in wide use (or in many cases not even available) for copies of records required to be kept.

Finally, the final rule replaces several other outdated terms or references where appropriate such as the reference to filing reports with the Commissioner of Internal Revenue ("IRS"). Effective July 1, 2011, all BSA reports are electronically filed with FinCEN, not the IRS.

The updated regulations were effective on publication.

OFAC removes Liberian sanctions and fax on demand references

On November 4, 2016, the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) published in the Federal Register a final rule removing from the Code of Federal Regulations the Former Liberian Regime of Charles Taylor Sanctions Regulations as a result of the termination of the national emergency on which the regulations were based. OFAC also is amending the Reporting, Procedures and Penalties Regulations and Appendix A to chapter V by making technical changes including to remove references to OFAC's fax-on-demand service in order to reflect the discontinuation of that service.

The revisions were effective on publication.

BIS seeks comments on effects of CWC on commercial activities

On November 30, 2016, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the Federal Register a notice of inquiry [Docket No. 161024999-6999-01] seeking public comments on the impact that implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC), through the Chemical Weapons Convention Implementation Act (CWCIA) and the Chemical Weapons Convention Regulations (CWCR), has had on commercial activities involving "Schedule 1" chemicals during calendar year 2016. The purpose of the notice of inquiry is to collect information to assist BIS in its preparation of the annual certification to Congress on whether the legit-

imate commercial activities and interests of chemical, biotechnology, and pharmaceutical firms are being harmed by such implementation. This certification is required under Condition 9 of Senate Resolution 75, April 24, 1997, in which the Senate gave its advice and consent to the ratification of the CWC.

Comments must be received by December 30, 2016.

BIS removes certain Nuclear Nonproliferation (NP) column 2 controls from CCL

On November 25, 2016, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. 160718621-6621-01] that amends the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) to remove nuclear nonproliferation (NP) Column 2 license requirements from certain pressure tubes, pipes, fittings, pipe valves, pumps, numerically controlled machine tools, oscilloscopes, and transient recorders on the Commerce Control List (CCL). These changes are intended to revise the EAR controls on these items by making them more consistent with the export controls of other countries that manufacture these items and that, together with the United States, are participating countries in the Nuclear Suppliers Group (NSG). As a result of the changes made by this rule, some of these items are no longer listed under an Export Control Classification Number (ECCN) on the CCL. However, such items remain subject to the EAR under the designation EAR99. This rule also creates four new ECCNs to maintain antiterrorism (AT) controls on certain affected commodities and related "software" and "technology." All items subject to the EAR, regardless of whether they are listed on the CCL, may require a license for reasons described elsewhere in the EAR (e.g., license requirements based on end-user/end-use controls, embargoes, or other special controls).

This rule is effective on publication. However, "software" "specially designed" for the "development," "production," or "use" of items previously controlled under ECCN 3A292 will continue to be classified and licensed by BIS under the designation EAR99 through January 31, 2017. As of February 1, 2017, such "software" will be classified and licensed by BIS under ECCN 3D991.

BIS and State revise license requirements for military aircraft, gas turbine engines and related items

On November 21, 2016, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. 151030999-6552-02] that modifies the Commerce Control List (CCL) entries for two types of items: Military aircraft and related items, and military gas turbine engines and related items. The rule adds clarifying text to the descriptions of the types of military aircraft controlled on the CCL. The lists of items that are subject only to the anti-terrorism reason for control are clarified and expanded. This rule, which is being published simultaneously with a rule by the Department of State (see below), is based on a review of Categories VIII and XIX of the United States Munitions List (USML).

On November 21, 2016, the Department of State published in the Federal Register a final rule [Public Notice: 9604] that amends the International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR) to revise Categories VIII (aircraft and related articles) and XIX (gas turbine engines and associated equipment) of the U.S. Munitions List (USML) to describe more precisely the articles warranting control on the USML. The revisions contained in the rule are part of the Department of State's retrospective plan under E.O. 13563.

Both rules are part of a plan to review rules published as part of the Export Control Reform Initiative (ECRI) and are effective December 31, 2016.

BIS extends validity of temporary general license

On November 18, 2016, BIS published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. 160106014-6728-04] revising the Temporary General License rule published on March 24, 2016 to remove the expiration date of November 28, 2016, and to substitute the date of February 27, 2017. The final rule published by BIS on March 24 created a temporary general license that restored, for a specified time period, the licensing requirements and policies under the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) for exports, reexports, and transfers (in-country) as of March 7, 2016, to two entities (ZTE Corporation and ZTE Kangxun) that were added to the Entity List on March 8, 2016. At this time, the U.S. Government has decided to extend the temporary general license until February 27, 2017. In order to implement this decision, the final rule revises the temporary general license to remove the expiration date of November 28, 2016, and to substitute the date of February 27, 2017. The final rule makes no other changes to the EAR.

BIS updates legal authority for EAR

On November 4, 2016, BIS published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. 161012953-6953-011 that updates the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) legal authority paragraphs in the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) to cite the most recent Presidential notice continuing an emergency declared pursuant to the International Emergency Economic Powers Act. This is a non-substantive rule that only updates authority paragraphs of the EAR. It does not alter any right, obligation or prohibition that applies to any person under the EAR.

BIS amends EAR to update various arms embargoes and recognize India as member of MTCR

On November 4, 2016, BIS published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. 160810723-6723-01] that amends the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) to implement changes in controls on arms and related materiel to Côte d'Ivoire, Liberia, Sri Lanka, and Vietnam. BIS also updates the EAR to recognize the accession of India as a member of the Missile Technology Control Regime (MTCR).

United Nations Security Council Resolutions (UNSCRs) adopted in 2016 terminated arms embargoes against Côte d'Ivoire (UNSCR 2283) and Liberia (UNSCR 2288). The rule removes the United Nations Embargo (UN) controls on Côte d'Ivoire and Liberia by removing those countries from the names of UNSC arms embargoed countries in §746.1(b) and from Country Group D:5 in Supplement No. 1 to part 740 of the EAR.

BIS is removing U.S. arms embargo-related controls on Sri Lanka to reflect the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2016. On May 4, 2016, DDTC announced that it would begin reviewing license applications for Sri Lanka on a case-by-case basis. Accordingly, this rule removes Sri Lanka from Country Group D:5 in Supplement No. 1 to part 740 of the EAR. on May 23, 2016, in furtherance of deepening and broadening ties between the United States and Vietnam since the normalization of diplomatic relations. Accordingly, BIS removes Vietnam from Country Group D:5 in Supplement No. 1 to part 740 the EAR.

On June 27, 2016, India acceded to the MTCR as the 35th member. BIS formally recognizes India's status as a member of MTCR by removing the reference to India as only an "MTCR adherent" from paragraph (d) of § 742.5 of the EAR.

The revisions were effective on publication.

DDTC posts DECCS Release #1 on Commodity Jurisdictions

The Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC) has announced that beginning November 21, 2016 a new online system for Commodity Jurisdiction (CJ) determination requests will be available and the External Form Submission (EFS) will no longer be available to use for CJ determination requests. The last day to submit a CJ determination request through EFS is Wednesday, November 16, 2016. The posting said:

As part of the DDTC IT Modernization effort, DDTC has been diligently reviewing all current processes and procedures. In April of 2016 the updated data collection was approved for use by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). Once approval was received, DDTC developed an updated external application for CJ determination requests as well as working in tandem with Defense Technology Security Administration (DTSA) to update the internal USXPORTS application.

Therefore, on November 21, 2016 the new CJ application will be available as the first release of the Defense Export Control and Compliance System (DECCS). The new DECCS CJ application will replace of the Electronic Filing System (EFS) to submit a CJ determination requests. However, ELISA will still be available for users to track the status of their requests.

CPSC concludes initial test of ITDS/ACE electronic filing of targeting and enforcement data

On November 23, 2016, the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) published in the Federal Register a notice regarding the conclusion of CPSC International Trade Data System (ITDS) initial test concerning the electronic filing of targeting/enforcement data. The CPSC in consultation with U.S. Customs & Border Protection (CBP) previously announced a test to assess the electronic filing of certain data via the Partner Government Agency (PGA) Message Set to the CBPauthorized Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) system known as the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE). Test participants collaborated with CBP and CPSC in examining the effectiveness of the "single window" capability and assessing the concept of a data registry (the Product Registry), maintained by CPSC. CBP and CPSC have determined that the test, which the CPSC refers to as the "eFiling Alpha Pilot," was successful, in that participating firms were able to file CPSC's PGA Message Set data as part of an ACE entry, CPSC was able to receive the PGA Message Set data from CBP, and CPSC was able to accept the data into CPSC's system for risk analysis. Accordingly, the notice announces that the initial test, the eFiling Alpha Pilot, will conclude on December 31, 2016.

CPSC publishes adjusted civil penalties amounts

On November 23, 2016, the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) published in the Federal Register a notice of adjusted maximum civil penalty amounts. In 1990, Congress enacted statutory amendments that provided for periodic adjustments to the maximum civil penalty amounts authorized under the Consumer Product Safety Act, the Federal Hazardous Substances Act, and the Flammable Fabrics Act. On August 14, 2009, the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 (CPSIA) increased the maximum civil penalty amounts to \$100,000 for each violation and \$15,000,000 for any related series of violations. The CPSIA also revised the starting date, from December 1, 1994 to December 1, 2011, and December 1 of each fifth calendar year thereafter, on which the CPSC must prescribe and publish in the Federal Register, the schedule of maximum authorized penalties. As calculated in accordance with the amendments, the new amounts are \$110,000 for each violation, and \$16,025,000 for any related series of violations.

The new amounts will become effective on January 1, 2017.

FDA adopts rule for filing import data in ACE

On November 29, 2016, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. FDA-2016-N-1487] to establish requirements for the electronic filing of entries of FDA-regulated products in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) or any other electronic data interchange (EDI) system authorized by the U.S. Customs and Border Protection Agency (CBP), in order for the filing to be processed by CBP and to help FDA in determining admissibility of that product by increasing the opportunity for automated review by FDA's Operational and Administrative System for Import Support (OA-SIS). ACE is a commercial trade processing system operated by CBP that is designed to implement the International Trade Data System (ITDS), automate import and export processing, enhance border security, and foster U.S. economic security through lawful international trade and policy. FDA is a Partner Government Agency (PGA) for purposes of submission of import data in ACE. As of July 23, 2016, ACE became the sole EDI system authorized by CBP for entry of FDAregulated articles into the United States. We also updated certain sections of FDA regulations related to imports. This rule will facilitate effective and efficient admissibility review by the Agency and protect public health by allowing FDA to focus its limited resources on those FDA-regulated products being imported or offered for import that may be associated with a greater public health risk.

This rule is effective December 29, 2016.

FDA announces guidance for Voluntary Qualified Importer Program

On November 14, 2016, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) published in the Federal Register a notice [Docket No. FDA-2011-N-0144] announcing the availability of a guidance for industry entitled "FDA's Voluntary Qualified Importer Program." The guidance describes the Voluntary Qualified Importer Program (VQIP), which provides for expedited review and importation of food offered for importation by importers who voluntarily agree to participate in the program. The guidance describes the eligibility criteria for, and benefits of, participation in VQIP. The guidance also provides information on submitting an application for VQIP participation, obtaining a facility certification for the foreign supplier of a food imported under VQIP, the VQIP user fee, conditions that might result in the revocation of

VQIP eligibility, and criteria for reinstatement of eligibility. The guidance represents the current thinking of FDA on this topic. It does not establish any rights for any person and is not binding on FDA or the public. An alternative approach may be used if it satisfies the requirements of the applicable statutes and regulations.

CCC issues final rule on Cotton and Wool Apparel Manufacturers Trust Fund programs

On November 18, 2016, the Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) and Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) published in the Federal Register a final rule that makes amendments to the final rule, with request for comments, published in the Federal Register on March 9, 2015, that established regulations for the Pima Agriculture Cotton Trust Fund (Agriculture Pima Trust) and the Agriculture Wool Apparel Manufacturers Trust Fund (Agriculture Wool Trust) programs. The final rule is amended based on comments received and to add details for the Refund of Duties Paid on Imports of Certain Wool Products (Wool Duty Refund) payment. The administration of the Wool Duty Refund payment was transferred to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) beginning in calendar year (CY) 2016 and assigned to the Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS). It was previously administered by U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP), Department of Homeland Security. The final rule is effective November 18, 2016.

Australia

Bill to implement the Expanded Information Technology Agreement introduced

On 20 October 2016, the Assistant Minister for Immigration and Border Protection introduced the <u>Customs Tariff Amendment (Expanded Information Technology Agreement Implementation and Other Measures) Bill 2016</u> (the Bill) into the House of Representatives. Subject to the Bill becoming an act of Parliament it will amend the <u>Customs Tariff Act 1995</u> (the Customs Tariff Act) to incrementally reduce customs duty rates to 'Free' on a range of information technology products.

The Bill gives effect to Australia's obligations under the World Trade Organization's Expanded Information Technology Agreement (the Expanded ITA) and the 2016-17 Budget Measure 'World Trade Organization – Information Technology Agreement'. The Australian Government consulted domestic manufacturers and importers during the Expanded ITA negotiation process in 2012-15.

Further information including the text of the Bill, explanatory memorandum and second reading speech can be found on the Parliament House website.

The Bill contains two schedules. The amendments to give effect to the Expanded Information Technology Agreement are in Schedule 1. Schedule 2 contains other minor technical amendments that serve to reduce the size to the Customs Tariff by removing a large number of obsolete customs duty rates.

Timing of reductions

The first incremental customs duty rate reductions will occur on 1 January 2017. Annual reductions will then commence from 1 July 2017 until 1 July 2021.

Staging categories

The size and timing of the reduction to customs duty rates is determined by the staging category assigned to each affected tariff subheading. There are seven staging under the Expanded ITA outlined in Table 1. The staging category assigned to an individual tariff subheading is determined by the commitments made under the Expanded ITA.

The details of the staging categories, including the tariff subheadings assigned to each staging category can be found at Attachment A to <u>Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) Notice No. 2016/36.</u>

Concordance

New tariff classifications have been created to separately identify specific information technology products. This will result in a transfer of goods between tariff subheadings. A concordance of the amendments proposed by the Bill is at Attachment B to DIBP Notice No. 2016/36. This information is a guide only. For entry purposes, goods should still be classified in accordance with all of the relevant provisions of the Customs Tariff Act.

Other measures

The amendments to the Customs Tariff Act proposed in Schedule 2 of the Bill are minor technical amendments and remove redundant information. These amendments will not change the collection of customs duties.

Interaction with the 2017 Harmonized System Changes

The provisions in the Bill are drafted to be consistent with the amendments proposed by the Customs Tariff Amendment (2017 Harmonized System Changes) Bill 2016 (the Harmonized System Bill), which is currently before the Parliament (see DIBPN 2016/34).

Subject to both Bills becoming Acts of Parliament, the provisions in Schedule 1 of the Bill will commence immediately following the Harmonized System Bill.

The Bill introduces new subheadings, where required, to separately identify specific goods. Any margins of tariff preference will be maintained. The Bill also makes relevant corresponding changes to Schedules 5 to 12.

New Zealand

Parliament passes TPP bill

On 15 November 2016, the New Zealand parliament passed by a 61-57 vote, the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement Amendment Bill, which is an omnibus bill that would amend 11 different NZ laws to meet obligations in the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement (TPP) and enable New Zealand to ratify the agreement. The Bill passed despite some opposition claims that passage was a waste of time in view of the position taken by President-Elect Trump of the United States during his campaign. Under formulas required to bring the TPP into force, United States participation is essential. It is understood that the National, ACT and United Future parties supported it, while the Labour, the Greens, NZ First and the Maori Party opposed it. Royal Assent (approval from the Governor-General representing the Crown) is still required before it becomes law. The law will take effect only from the date that TPP enters into force for New Zealand.

Testing underway for last stage of Trade Single Window

The New Zealand Customs Service (NZCS) and the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) announced that they have begun testing the nearly-completed Trade Single Window (TSW) with industry.

The last stage of TSW, which was officially handed over by IBM this month, is now in what's known as User Acceptance Testing.

Customs is providing access to an external test environment to enable industry partners to test the new messages. This will allow NZCS and MPI to tweak the system based on their feedback where necessary for 'go live'. Then the live pilots of the new functionality will be phased in to make sure the end to end processes are ready for full take up.

Nine industry partners are expected to test the latest version over the next three weeks.

Customs and MPI expect to set a "go live date" shortly for early 2017.

The new TSW functionality will deliver:

- The Inward Cargo Report (the most complex message set) that includes electronically requesting approval to move consignments out of the port or airline store if they have not been cleared already.
- Electronic messages for industry to report ship arrivals and departures. As a result, Ministry of Health officers will access TSW to provide instructions to the ship about approval to berth. And Maritime NZ will also get fuller electronic data to manage its safety and billing functions.
- Industry will be able to submit excise lodgements directly into TSW for the first time, with minimal Customs interaction. This will improve the efficiency of the excise declaration process.
- Extending the Trader self service capability introduced in March 2015 allowing brokers and traders to manage how their staff use the system.
- Providing officers with full access to transactions in TSW so they can help traders with any issues they have with completing the fields.

Revised Tariff in effect from 1 January 2017

New Zealand is incorporating the WCO's 2017 Harmonized System (HS) Amendments into the Tariff of New Zealand. A project team, from NZ Customs and Statistics New Zealand, has been working to incorporate the amendments and draft legislation to ensure that the 2017 Tariff will be ready for use on 1 January 2017. The Tariff (Harmonised System) Amendment Order 2016 was published in the New Zealand Gazette on 24 November with an effective date of 1 January 2017.

It is important to note that the changes to the Tariff are structural only and do not change the rates of duty.

The Correlation Key correlating the 2012 Tariff with the 2017 Tariff is available here, and a few of the more important changes are listed here. A full list of the changes to the HS Nomenclature is available from the WCO Website.

Consequential amendments to the Excise and Excise-equivalent Duty Table

As a result of the changes to the Tariff, the Excise and Excise-equivalent Duties Table (the Table) is amended (on 1 January 2017) as follows:

- 1. Amendments to tariff items for grape wine to account for the new Tariff subheading for grape wine in containers holdings more than 2L but not more than 10L
- 2. Adding of 'saké' to the Excise and Tariff headings that cover 'other fermented beverages'
- 3. Amendments to tariff items for methanol and ethyl alcohol used as a fuel to account for changes to the Tariff to put into effect recommendations under the international Chemical Weapons Convention.

These amendments will be incorporated in the Table that will be reprinted in the Working Tariff Document of New Zealand.

The changes to the Table are structural only and do not change the rates of excise duties.

Singapore

Singapore revokes Côte d'Ivoire and Liberian measures

From 3 November 2016, Singapore revoked the United Nations (Freezing of Assets of Persons - Cote d'Ivoire) Regulations 2006 (Cote d'Ivoire Regulations) and the United Nations (Freezing of Assets of Former President of Liberia and Connected Persons) Regulations 2004 (Liberia Regulations).

1. Revocation of the Cote d'Ivoire Regulations

The revocation of the Cote d'Ivoire Regulations gives effect to Resolution 2283 (2016) by the Security Council of the United Nations (UNSC) dated 28 April 2016 (Resolution 2283) following various progresses on the stabilisation of Cote d'Ivoire.

Resolution 2283 terminated all sanctions measures regarding Cote d'Ivoire, including asset freezing measures established under Resolution 1572 (2004) (Resolution 1572) and Resolution 1975 (2011) and Resolution 2219 (2015).

Resolution 2283 also dissolved the Committee established by Resolution 1572. As a result, the list of individuals and entities subject to sanctions previously maintained by this Committee (Cote d'Ivoire List) was also abolished on 28 April 2016.

Earlier this year on 22 August 2016, the Monetary Authority of Singapore (MAS) also revoked the MAS (Freezing of Assets of Persons - Cote d'Ivoire) Regulations 2006. This revocation took effect from 28 April 2016, thus relieving financial institutions from the relevant asset freezing obligations.

As such, with the revocation of the Cote d'Ivoire Regulations, all the asset freezing obligations no longer apply to all Singapore persons (not just financial institutions) in relation to the Cote d'Ivoire List.

2. Revocation of the Liberia Regulations

The revocation of the Liberia Regulations gives effect to Resolution 2237 (2015) by the UNSC dated 2 September 2015 (Resolution 2237) following various progresses regarding the establishment and maintenance of stability in Liberia and the sub-region. This resolution terminated all travel and financial measures set forth in Resolution 1521 (2003) and Resolution 1532 (2004).

Similar to the Cote d'Ivoire Regulations, earlier this year on 4 February 2016, MAS also revoked the MAS (Freezing of Assets of Former President of Liberia and Connected Persons) Regulations 2004. This MAS revocation took effect from 2 September 2015, thus relieving financial institutions from the relevant asset freezing obligations.

As such, with the revocation of the Liberia Regulations, all the asset freezing obligations no longer apply to all Singapore persons (and just financial institutions) in relation to the former President of Liberia, Charles Taylor, and connected persons.

Europe

European Union and EFTA

EFTA Ministers discuss UK relations and future free trade agreements

On 21 November 2016, the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) held its biannual Ministerial Meeting in Geneva. EFTA reported that:

The EFTA Ministers discussed the possible consequences of the United Kingdom leaving the European Union and emphasised the importance of maintaining close economic and trade relations with the United Kingdom as an important trading partner of the EFTA countries. The Ministers also underlined the need to provide stability and predictability in a transition to a new legal framework for economic relations with the United Kingdom and to preserve the current conditions for economic exchange and cooperation. The EFTA States will consult each other towards this goal.

The Ministers reiterated their keen interest in concluding free trade agreements with India and Indonesia in 2017. Concluding these two agreements would secure improved market access to two growing economies with large domestic markets and constitutes a key objective for EFTA. At the same time they affirmed EFTA's commitment to advancing negotiations with Malaysia and Vietnam with the aim of concluding as soon as possible. They expressed their satisfaction with the start of negotiations with Ecuador. The Ministers also expressed their support for the on-going negotiations to revise and expand the Agreement with Mexico and the upcoming negotiations with Chile. Regarding the revision and expansion of other existing free trade agreements, they underlined the readiness of the EFTA States to resume the negotiations with Tur-

key, to start negotiations with the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) and to continue to explore the possibility of entering into negotiations with Canada.

The Ministers welcomed the conclusion of the exploratory talks with the Mercosur States, paving the way for possible free trade negotiations in the coming year. They took note of the ongoing trade policy dialogue with the US and expressed their interest in continuing this dialogue.

The Ministers noted that the negotiating processes with Algeria, Thailand and Russia/Belarus/Kazakhstan remained on hold and agreed to continue to monitor the situa-

The EFTA Parliamentary Committee met with Ministers to discuss recent developments and priorities in EFTA's trade relations with the world.

EFTA's network of preferential trade relations outside the European Union currently comprises 27 free trade agreements with 38 countries and territories. Over 12 percent of EFTA's total exports go to these trade partners and they are the source of 7.5 percent of EFTA imports. This network is complemented by 6 joint declarations on cooperation.

Commission proposes changes to EU anti-dumping, anti-subsidy rules

On 9 November 2016, the European Commission announced that it presented a proposal for a new method for calculating dumping on imports from countries where there are significant market distortions, or where the state has a pervasive influence on the economy. The purpose is to make sure that Europe has trade defence instruments that are able to deal with current realities - notably overcapacities – in the international trading environment, while fully respecting the EU's international obligations in the legal framework of the WTO. The proposal, which introduces changes to the EU's anti-dumping and anti-subsidy legislation, follows a broad public consultation and is accompanied by an impact assessment.

Binding Tariff Information

Binding Tariff Information is issued on request to economic operators by the customs authorities of the Member States. It is valid throughout the Community, regardless of the Member State which issued it. For information about an existing BTI, you may want to contact the <u>customs administration of the Member State</u> which issued it. However, remember that, according to the provisions for data protection, there are limitations as to the information an administration can provide. You can search and consult existing BTIs on the EBTI-database.

Iceland

Iceland ratifies Trade Facilitation Agreement

The WTO announced that Iceland has ratified the Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA), becoming the 96th member of the WTO to do so. WTO ambassador Högni S. Kristjánsson submitted his country's instrument of acceptance to WTO Director-General Roberto Azevêdo on 31 October.

United Kingdom

UK Export Control Organisation updates 5 dual-use open export licences and revokes 1

The UK Export Control Organisation ("ECO") has made updates to five UK open general export licences ("OGELs") and revoked one OGEL, following updates to the EU dual-use control list and changes to EU sanctions regimes.

The amended OGELs, which all apply to dual-use items, are the following:

- Export after exhibition;
- Export after repair/replacement under warranty;
- Export for repair/replacement under warranty;
- PCBs and components; and
- Oil and gas exploration.

The main amendments are as follows:

- updates to the goods schedules in each of the above, reflecting the amendments to the EU dual-use control list brought in by Council Delegated Regulation (EU) 2016/1969; and
- removal of Côte d'Ivoire and Liberia from the list of prohibited destinations under the OGEL for PCBs and components for dual-use items, following the lifting of EU sanctions in June 2016.

The "international non-proliferation regime decontrols: dual-use items" OGEL has been revoked.

Exporters making use of any of the licences above should assess whether they now require an individual licence, whether their goods are no longer subject to controls, or whether any other changes are necessary in order to reflect the changes.

UK amends North Korean and Iran sanctions orders

On 23 November 2016, the UK posted SI 2016/1119 - The North Korea and Iran (United Nations Sanctions) (Amendment) Order 2016. Articles 3 to 19 of this Order amend the North Korea (United Nations Sanctions) Order 2009 (S.I. 2009/1749), as amended, giving effect to certain aspects of further United Nations sanctions imposed against North Korea by the United Nations Security Council in resolution 2270, adopted on 2nd March 2016.

The Explanatory Note states that, in particular, the Order amends the offences related to carriage of goods to and from North Korea, and broadens the categories of goods to which offences apply. It also broadens the offences under the Order in relation to supplying services to North Korean ships. New offences are created in respect of leasing, chartering or provision of crew services, registration of ships, and access to ports.

Articles 21 and 22 of this Order make minor amendments to provisions of the Iran (United Nations Sanctions) Order 2009 (S.I. 2009/886), which were inserted by S.I. 2016/378, to rectify omissions.

High Court rules that Article 50 cannot be invoked without reference to Parliament

On 3 November 2016, the High Court handed down its judgment in the highly publicised judicial review proceedings (R (Miller) v Secretary of state for Exiting the EU, concerning the constitutional requirements for the UK's withdrawal from the European Union (EU) and approach to invocation of the notification procedure under Article 50 of the Treaty on European Union. The Court has ruled that, according to fundamental principles of constitutional law, the Government does not have the power to trigger Article 50 without reference to Parliament.

The specific question for the court to determine was whether, as a matter of constitutional law, the Government is entitled to use prerogative powers to trigger Article 50. Prerogative powers are a body of discretionary powers held by the Crown and exercised by Government in carrying out executive functions. The exercise of prerogative power does not require prior parliamentary approval. The Government argued that the Article 50 process for withdrawal from the treaties effecting membership of the EU could be triggered by prerogative power and without further reference to Parliament as would be the case in other matters affecting international relations. It suggested that Parliament must have intended that the prerogative to withdraw would remain with Government when the European Communities Act 1972 was enacted. However, the Court agreed with the Claimants that the proposed actions would affect not only international relations but also domestic law and the rights of individuals acquired under EU law, such as free movement between Member States. The Court's view was that Parliament cannot have intended that the "profound effects" of the European Communities Act 1972, which introduced EU law into domestic law with all the rights that this

entailed, could be abrogated by the unilateral exercise of prerogative power by the Government.

The Government has already announced it will appeal the judgment. Given the constitutional importance of this case and the Prime Minister's announcement that Article 50 will be triggered by the end of March 2017, the appeal will be heard on 7/8 December by the UK Supreme Court – so leapfrogging the Court of Appeal, which is the usual venue for High Court appeals.

The Court stressed that its judgment addressed a pure question of law, as to the process for exercise of Article 50, rather than any political issue on the merits of leaving the EU. However, the judgment likely will fuel the debate about Brexit and the result of the referendum on 23 June 2016 yet further.

CBSA Advance Rulings

No new <u>advance rulings</u> were posted by the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) this past month. In September of 2014, the CBSA enhanced the Advance Ruling (Tariff Classification and Origin) and National Customs Ruling programs by publishing ruling letters in their entirety, with the applicant's consent, on the CBSA Web site.

It is important to note that rulings are binding only between the CBSA and the applicant. While posted rulings are for reference purposes only, they provide meaningful guidance and help other importers in complying with Canada's trade legislation.
