IDE is a newly formed energy infrastructure company, a wholly owned subsidiary of Medco Daya Abadi Lestari (MDAL). MDAL is the ultimate shareholder of the Medco Energi group of companies. Fazil's previous position was as founder and president director of PT Medco Power Indonesia for 14 years. He is an expert of power generation business development, project finance, as well oil and gas project development. He also holds a Black Belt for Six Sigma quality management experience.

In 1995, John was managing director when Vietnam's first 100% foreign own environmental consulting firm was established. In 2000, he founded Pacific Rim Investment and Management Inc. (PRIM) out of LA, California to work with private international companies on foreign direct investments in greater Saigon region and Me Kong Delta. In 2012, he started investments in wind and solar power projects as part of Vietnam's renewable energy policy. Today, he holds board positions at PRIM and ABBO, which today is handling an investment profile of over USD 650 million (2016) in Vietnam. He also chairs the Power and Energy Working Group of the Vietnam Business Forum (Ministry of Planning and Investment, IFC, World Bank and 17 International Chambers of Commerce and Business Associations). Since 2017, John is the executive director of the American Chamber of Commerce in Ho Chi Minh, and also heads Vietnam Business Forum's Power and Energy Sub-Working Group.



Yuichiro Yoi, Unit Head for Indonesia, Private Sector Operations Department, Asian Development Bank (ADB)

Yuichiro is the unit head for Indonesia at the Private Sector Operations Department of the Asian Development Bank (ADB). He joined ADB in 2014, and has been covering Indonesia's infrastructure projects from the bank's Manila headquarters since then. His recent work includes Rantau Dedap geothermal IPP financing (signed on March 2018) and Vena Energy (formerly known as Equis Energy) wind and solar IPP financings. He and his team are also mandated on two other IPPs in Indonesia.

Prior to ADB, Yuichiro worked at the Japan Bank for International Cooperation (JBIC), where he led his team on numerous IPP deals in the region, including Gulf Nong Saeng (Thailand, gas-fired), Gulf U-Thai (Thailand, gas-fired), Sarulla (Indonesia, geothermal), and Rajamandala (Indonesia, hydro).
