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




AI Act 101

Based on EU product safety laws, and applies a risk-based approach to certain supply chain actors (providers, deployers, importers, distributors, etc.).

Unacceptable risk: prohibited



Social scoring, certain biometric categorization systems, subliminal techniques causing significant harm, expanding facial recognition databases through untargeted scraping and others

Certain remote facial recognition, education, employment, certain machinery, critical infrastructure, law enforcement, AI as a medical device, and others

Transparency

Minimal risk: Voluntary code of conduct



Art 50

Al systems interacting with natural persons (e.g., chat bots – even if only internal), gen Al, deep fakes, emotion recognition, and biometric categorisation

Art 95

Spam filters, video games




Excluded from scope: Al systems for sole purpose of scientific R&D, and free and open source Al systems that are not high-risk



General purpose Al models are not high risk but they are highly regulated: trained on large amount of data, displays generality, can perform wide range of tasks and can be integrated into downstream systems
