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WORLD TRADE ORGANIZATION (WTO)

COVID-19: Trade and trade-related measures

The WTO has set up a [dedicated webpage](#) to help governments, business, the media and the public track the latest information on trade-related responses to the COVID-19 outbreak. China, the EU and other members notified the WTO of the multi-party provisional appeal arbitration arrangement

The Chinese Ministry of Commerce (MOFCOM) [announced](#) that on April 30, China, the EU and 17 other members formally submitted a notice to the WTO to jointly establish a multi-party temporary appeal arbitration arrangement to maintain the operation of the WTO dispute settlement mechanism during the suspension of the appeal body.

The multi-party provisional appeal arbitration arrangement stipulates that during the suspension of the appellate body, the participating parties will handle the disputed cases brought through the arbitration procedure stipulated in Article 25 of the WTO Understanding on Dispute Resolution Rules and Procedures. Participants determined the rules of appeal arbitration procedures based on the current WTO rules and practices on appeal procedures to ensure the consistency and predictability of the awards. This arrangement shows the confidence and support of all parties in the multilateral trading system and is conducive to maintaining the rules-based multilateral trading system.

Apart from China and the EU, participants in the multi-party provisional appeal arbitration arrangement include Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Hong Kong, China, Iceland, Mexico, New Zealand, Norway, Pakistan, Singapore, Switzerland, Ukraine and Uruguay. This arrangement is open to all WTO members, and other members are welcome to participate.

The multi-party temporary appeal arbitration arrangement is a temporary measure during the suspension of the appeal body, and the ultimate goal of each party is still to restore the normal operation of the appeal body. China will work with other WTO members to continue to resolve the issue of the suspension of the appellate body and jointly safeguard the rules-based multilateral trading system.

TBT Notifications

Member countries of the WTO are required under the *Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade* (TBT Agreement) to report to the WTO all proposed technical regulations that could affect trade with other Member countries. The WTO Secretariat distributes this information in the form of "notifications" to all Member countries. WORLD CUSTOMS ORGANIZATION (WCO)

WCO list of temporary import and export measures related to COVID-19

The WCO has created a special [Web Page](#) dedicated to Coronavirus import and export measures where it will share advice, tools and best practices not only to Customs but also to the public. In addition, it has developed lists of national legislation of countries that adopted temporary import support (lowering or waiving of direct and indirect duties and taxes) and export restrictions on certain categories of critical medical supplies in response to COVID-19. The lists are not exhaustive and are regularly updated by the WCO based on the official information provided by countries. WCO/WHO prepare revised classification references for Covid-19 supplies and medicines

The WCO [announced](#) that to respond to the unprecedented demand in medical supplies amid the current global COVID-19 pandemic around the world, and in order to help countries speed up the cross-border movement of these critical products, the WCO and the World Health Organization (WHO) joined hands to strengthen their cooperation by establishing a coordinated approach in their response to the pandemic. As a result of this joint effort of the two organizations, the [HS Classification Reference for COVID-19 Medical Supplies \(2.1 Ed.\)](#) was updated. The latest edition covers a greater range of medical equipment and supplies that are required as critical items by the WHO, such as oxygen concentrators and sample collection sets. In addition to [English](#), it is available in [Spanish](#), [Arabic](#) and [Russian](#). The updated list is provided as an indicative list with a view to facilitating the classification of COVID-19 medical supplies at the international level (6 digit of the HS). Economic operators are advised to consult with the relevant Customs administrations in relation to classification at domestic levels (7 or more digits) or in the event of any discrepancy between their practices and this list. This list is not legally binding.

In addition, the WCO-WHO have produced a [list of medicines](#) for COVID-19, which will serve to help customs and economic operators identify them and facilitate their classification at the border. The list contains medicines used in the general management of hospitalised patients and some medicines being used as part of the direct treatment against COVID-19 with their suggested HS codes. Where appropriate, medicines are identified by their International Nonproprietary Names (INN).

CANADA

Contraventions Regulations amended to cover Quarantine Act

On April 14, 2020, the [Canada Gazette](#) published the *Regulations Amending the Contraventions Regulations (Quarantine Act)*. The Regulations came into force on April 11, 2020, the day on which they were registered.

In response to the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic, which began to have serious impacts in Canada in March 2020, the Government of Canada has made numerous emergency orders under the Quarantine Act. These orders restrict entry into Canada or subject persons entering Canada to certain conditions, notably requiring any person returning from travelling abroad to self-isolate for 14 days. The Quarantine Act and the emergency orders made under that Act are designed to slow and prevent the spread of COVID-19. It is therefore vitally important that those measures be strictly followed.

The ticketing procedure established under the *Contraventions Act* offers another option other than prosecution of that person using the procedure set out in the *Criminal Code* for addressing those who contravene the *Quarantine Act*. The ticketing regime established by the *Contraventions Act*, known as the Contraventions Regime, provides another option for enforcing certain federal offences of a regulatory nature as the offender can choose to plead guilty and pay a fine without having to appear in court. Making use of this regime for these offences saves valuable time for the courts and for the enforcement agency, which can be dedicated to the prosecution of the most serious instances of these offences. Accordingly, in order to allow for the enforcement of certain offences contained in the *Quarantine Act* through the ticketing procedure established under the *Contraventions Act*, the offences are designated as contraventions and included in the *Contraventions Regulations*.

Furthermore, the amendment to the *Contraventions Regulations* enables enforcement officers to issue tickets under the *Contraventions Act* to persons twelve years of age or more, but under eighteen years of age, in amounts not exceeding \$100.

United States invokes Defense Production Act to limit exports of critical us medical supplies

On April 3, 2020, President Trump issued an order via Presidential Memorandum ("[Order](#)") invoking an obscure authority under Section 101 of the Defense Production Act, 50 U.S.C. § 4501 *et seq.* ("[DPA](#)"), to potentially restrict exports from the United States of personal protective equipment ("PPE") needed in the response to the COVID-19 crisis. This is in the wake of numerous countries around the world implementing export bans on PPE and other medical supplies (see our previous blog posts on these non-US developments [here](#)). The White House also issued a statement ("[WH Statement](#)") in connection with the Order that explains that it is intended to "prevent hoarding, price gouging, and profiteering by preventing the harmful export" of critically needed materials. The Order follows several days in which the Administration ordered specific US companies to accept and prioritize orders for ventilators and respirators and reportedly pressured at least one company not to export those materials.

Which Materials are Covered by the Order?

The Order covers certain of the 15 categories of materials previously identified as "scarce or threatened materials" by the US Department of Health and Human Services ("HHS") in a [notice](#) issued on March 25, 2020. The materials covered by the Order ("Targeted Materials") all fall into the category of PPE, specifically:

- N-95 Filtering Facepiece Respirators, including devices that are disposable half-face-piece non-powered air-purifying particulate respirators intended for use to cover the nose and mouth of the wearer to help reduce wearer exposure to pathogenic biological airborne particulates;
- Other Filtering Facepiece Respirators (*e.g.*, those designated as N99, N100, R95, R99, R100, or P95, P99, P100), including single-use, disposable half-mask respiratory protective devices that cover the user's airway (nose and mouth) and offer protection from particulate materials at an N95 filtration efficiency level per 42 CFR § 84.181;|
- Elastomeric, air-purifying respirators and appropriate particulate filters/cartridges;
- PPE surgical masks, including masks that cover the user's nose and mouth and provide a physical barrier to fluids and particulate materials; and
- PPE gloves or surgical gloves, including those defined at 21 CFR § 880.6250 (exam gloves) and § 878.4460 (surgical gloves)

The Order does not cover the other materials identified as "scarce or threatened materials" in the HHS notice, which includes, among other things, drug products with the active ingredient chloroquine or hydroxychloroquine HC1; ventilators and related materials; certain sterilization services; certain sanitizing and disinfecting products; and medical gowns or apparel. It is possible that these materials could be targeted in the future.

Who is Targeted by the Order?

The Order focuses on non-manufacturers and seeks “to prevent domestic brokers, distributors, and other intermediaries from diverting such material overseas.” The WH Statement issued in connection with the Order highlights “war-time profiteering” by these parties in secondary markets that “purchase domestic supplies of scarce and critical materials, hoard them while they engage in profiteering and speculation, and then export them.” The WH Statement explains that this may include “a large army of speculators and warehouse operators operating in the dark corners of our markets” and also “some well-established PPE distributors with the ability to unscrupulously divert PPE inventories from domestic customers, such as hospitals and State governments, to foreign purchasers willing to pay significant premiums.” The WH Statement provides the Order will not interfere with the ability of PPE manufacturers to export “when doing so is consistent with United States policy and in the national interest of the United States.”

Is the Export of these PPE Materials from the United States now Prohibited?

Based on its language, it appears that the Order will need to be implemented by the US Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”). Specifically, the Order directs DHS, through the Federal Emergency Management Agency and in consultation with HHS, to use its DPA Section 101 authority to “allocate to domestic use, as appropriate” the Targeted Materials. The Order uses the “allocation” authority in DPA Section 101 (which does not specifically mention exports) as the mechanism to implement the stated policy objective of preventing exports. The Order does not establish a broad-based prohibition on exports from the United States of the Targeted Materials, which could have been implemented through the [Export Administration Regulations](#), 15 C.F.R. Part 730 *et seq.*, which are administered by the US Department of Commerce’s Bureau of Industry and Security. In any event, this language indicates that further action by DHS is needed to implement the Order. We expect further clarity on in the coming days and will update this article with any noteworthy developments. [\[See below for subsequent implementation by FEMA.\]](#)

Considering that no President has used the allocation authority under the DPA since the Cold War according to this Congressional Research Service [report](#), it is not immediately clear how DHS will allocate these materials for domestic use and prevent their export from the United States. (DPA Section 101 provides a separate priority authority that allows the President to require US companies to accept and prioritize government contracts. That DPA priority authority has been used regularly by various US Administrations, including in recent days.)

In a [2015 interim final rule](#), HHS had already established a framework called the “Health Resources Priority and Allocations System” to allocate health and medical materials to promote the national defense pursuant to the authority under the DPA as delegated to HHS. If DHS follows this framework established by HHS, one possible way to implement the Order would be to issue an “allocation directive” to specific brokers, distributors, intermediaries, and possibly other parties (e.g., manufacturers) determined to be profiteering by exporting the covered PPE products at a premium. Such an allocation directive could order a party to allocate all of Targeted Materials to domestic use (i.e., not to export any of the products). The US Government may issue further guidance about these DPA developments in the coming days. Baker McKenzie is actively monitoring any further guidance or development on these issues.

USTR publishes procedures for the submission of petitions by North American producers of vehicles or light trucks to use the alternative staging regime for the USMCA

On April 21, 2020, the Office of the US Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a [request for petitions](#) from North American producers of passenger vehicles and light trucks who request an alternative to the standard staging regime for the rules of origin for automotive goods under the *United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement* (USMCA or the Agreement) using the procedures and guidance for submitting petitions in the notice. To be assured of consideration, a vehicle producer must submit a petition with a draft alternative staging plan no later than July 1, 2020. A vehicle producer must submit a petition with its final alternative staging plan no later than August 31, 2020.

The USMCA includes new rules of origin to claim preferential treatment for automotive goods, including higher Regional Value Content (RVC) thresholds, mandatory requirements to produce core parts in the region, mandatory steel and aluminum purchasing requirements, and a Labor Value Content (LVC) requirement. The Agreement allows vehicle producers to request an alternative staging regime for these requirements that would permit a longer period of transition to help ensure that future production is able to meet the new rules. The standard staging regime is specified under the Automotive Appendix to Chapter 4 of the USMCA (Automotive Appendix), with the exception of Article 8, which specifies provisions relating to the alternative staging regime. The alternative staging regime differs from the standard staging regime by providing additional time and a different phase-in of the new requirements. It provides an alternative to certain rules of origin requirements for passenger vehicles and light trucks, but does not replace any other rules of origin or any provisions of general applicability for these goods to claim preferential treatment under the USMCA.

For instance, under an alternative staging regime, importers of certain passenger vehicles and light trucks will have an additional two years – five years instead of three - to meet the requirements, and the vehicles will have different RVC and LVC thresholds.

USTR cancels hearing and extends comment period on US-Kenya Trade Agreement negotiating objectives

On April 13, 2020, the US trade Representative published in the *Federal Register* a notice [Docket No. USTR–2020–0011] of cancellation of the public hearing originally scheduled for April 28, 2020, and an extension of the deadline to submit comments on the negotiation objectives for the US-Kenya Trade Agreement. USTR is extending the deadline for written comments until April 28, 2020, and encourages interested persons to file comments and supporting documentation via www.regulations.gov, using docket number USTR–2020–0011.

USTR requests comments on extending exclusions from the \$34 Bn. Sec. 301 action against certain goods from China

On April 30, 2020, the Office of the US Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) [Docket Number USTR-2020-0017] requesting comments on whether to extend certain exclusions from the action against approximately \$34 Bn. of goods [tranche 1] from China that were subject to 25% additional duties imposed on July 6, 2018. USTR granted the sixth set of exclusions in July 2019, which are scheduled to expire on July 9, 2020. The USTR has decided to consider a possible extension for up to 12 months of particular exclusions granted in July 2019 and invites public comment on whether to extend particular exclusions, using the criteria set forth in the notice. Comments must be filed through the online portal <https://comments.USTR.gov> between May 1, 2020 and June 1, 2020 at 11:59pm ET.

USTR requests comments on extending exclusions from the \$16 Bn. Sec. 301 action against certain goods from China

On April 30, 2020, the Office of the US Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) [Docket Number USTR-2020-0018] requesting comments on whether to extend certain exclusions from the action against approximately \$16 Bn. of goods [tranche 2] from China that were subject to 25% additional duties imposed on August 23, 2018 [also referred to as tranche 2]. In a September 18, 2018 notice (September 18 notice; 83 FR 47236) USTR required submission of requests for exclusion from the \$16 billion action no later than December 18, 2018, and noted that the USTR periodically would announce decisions. The USTR granted multiple sets of exclusions. The first set of exclusions were granted in July 2019, which are scheduled to expire on July 31, 2020. See 84 FR 37381 (July 31, 2019) (the July 2019 notice).

USTR has decided to consider a possible extension for up to 12 months of particular exclusions granted in the July 2019 notice and invites public comments on whether to extend particular exclusions granted in the July 2019 notice, based on

the criteria set forth in the April 30 notice. For exclusions amended or corrected by a later issued notice of product exclusions, parties should provide their extension comments on the docket corresponding to the initial notice of product exclusions. Comments must be filed through the online portal <https://comments.ustr.gov> between May 1, 2020 and June 1, 2020 at 11:59pm ET.

USTR grants additional Sec. 301 (Tranche 3) product exclusions

On April 24, 2020, the Office of the US Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) that announces the USTR's determination to grant certain exclusion requests, as specified in the Annex to the notice, and corrects a technical error in a previously announced exclusion. The product exclusions will apply as of September 24, 2018, the effective date of the \$200 billion (Tranche 3) action, and extend to August 7, 2020. The amendments announced in the notice are retroactive to the date that the original exclusions were published.

As set forth in the Annex to the notice, the exclusions are reflected in one 10-digit HTSUS subheading, which covers 20 separate exclusion requests, and 107 specially prepared product descriptions, which cover 157 separate exclusion requests. As with previous exclusions, the exclusions are available for any product that meets the description in the Annex, regardless of whether the importer benefiting from the product exclusion filed an exclusion request. Further, the scope of each exclusion is governed by the scope of the product descriptions in the Annex, and not by the product descriptions found in any particular request for exclusion.

- Paragraph A, subparagraphs 1 and 2 create a new subheading 9903.88.45 for the exclusions and a new US note 20 (xx) to subchapter III of chapter 99, *Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States* (HTSUS).
- Paragraph A, subparagraphs 3 through 5 of the Annex contain conforming amendments to the HTSUS reflecting the modifications made by the Annex.
- Paragraph B of the Annex contains an amendment reflecting a technical correction to a certain note to the HTSUS, specifically US note 20(mm)(11), published at 84 FR 61674 (November 13, 2019).

USTR seeks withdrawal of exclusions of Bifacial Solar Panels from Sec. 201 safeguards

On April 17, 2020, the US Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) [Docket No. USTR-2020-0001] that states that USTR will request that the US Court of International Trade (CIT) lift the order preliminarily enjoining the withdrawal from entering into effect. On January 23, 2018, the President imposed a safeguard measure on imports of certain solar products pursuant to a Section 201 investigation. On February 14, 2018, the USTR established procedures for interested persons to request product-specific exclusions from application of the safeguard measure and to comment on the submitted requests. Based on the requests and comments received, the USTR granted certain requests on June 13, 2019, including a request to exclude from the safeguard measure bifacial solar panels that consist only of bifacial solar cells. On January 27, 2020, the USTR established procedures to consider whether to maintain, withdraw, or take some other action with respect to the exclusion of bifacial solar panels from the safeguard measure. Based on an evaluation of the comments received, and responses to those comments, and in consultation with the Secretaries of Commerce and Energy, the USTR has determined that the bifacial solar

panel exclusion is undermining the objectives of the safeguard measure. Accordingly, USTR published a notice withdrawing the exclusion of bifacial solar panels, effective as of October 28, 2019. See 84 FR 54244.

On October 21, 2019, Invenergy Renewables LLC (Invenergy) filed a complaint with the CIT alleging that USTR failed to provide notice and comment required under the *Administrative Procedure Act* (APA), 5 U.S.C. 551 et seq., before withdrawing the exclusion of bifacial solar panels. Invenergy filed a motion for a preliminary injunction to prevent the withdrawal from entering into effect. The CIT issued a preliminary injunction on December 5, 2019, enjoining the USTR from withdrawing the exclusion on bifacial solar panels from the safeguard measure.

USTR has determined that the bifacial exclusion is undermining the objective of the safeguard measure on solar products, does not meet the criteria for a legitimate exclusion, and should be withdrawn. The USTR has found further and additionally that the findings in the USITC March Report support the conclusion that the bifacial exclusion is undermining the objectives of the safeguard measure. Accordingly, USTR will request that the CIT lift the order preliminarily enjoining the withdrawal from entering into effect.

USTR extends certain product exclusions for Tranche 1 (\$34B) of Sec. 301 China tariffs

On April 10, 2020, the US Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) that extends for one year certain exclusions, which were granted in April 2019 from the approx. \$34B worth of Chinese products (represented by 818 8-digit subheadings) subject to 25% tariffs imposed on July 6, 2018. The product exclusion extensions announced in the notice will apply as of April 18, 2020, and extend for one year. US Customs and Border Protection will issue instructions on entry guidance and implementation.

Exclusions are available for any product that meets the description in the Annex, regardless of whether the importer filed an exclusion request. Further, the scope of each exclusion is governed by the scope of the 10-digit HTSUS headings and product descriptions in the Annex to this notice, and not by the product descriptions set out in any particular request for exclusion.

Effective with respect to good entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on July 6, 2018, and before April 18, 2021, the additional duties provided for in heading 9903.88.01 shall not apply to products which are provided for in heading 9903.88.07 and described by US notes 20(j)(2), 20(j)(4), 20(j)(6), 20(j)(7), 20(j)(11), 20(j)(12), 20(j)(14) and 20(j)(21) to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the HTSUS.

CBP GUIDANCE ON SEC. 232 AND 301 TARIFFS AND PRODUCT EXCLUSIONS

SEC. 232

CBP updates guidance on Chapter 98 claims for Sec. 232 entries

On April 13, 2020, CBP issued [CSMS #42355735 - Updated Guidance for Chapter 98 - Section 232 Imports of Steel and Aluminum](#), which is reproduced below:

The purpose of this CSMS message is to update CSMS #18-000424 to address the guidance for products entered under the provisions of Chapter 98, HTSUS

for goods that are subject to the additional duties for Section 232 Steel and Aluminum.

BACKGROUND

On March 8, 2018, the President issued Proclamations 9704 and 9705 on Adjusting Imports of Steel and Aluminum into the United States, under Section 232 of the Trade Expansion Act of 1962, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1862), providing for additional import duties for steel mill and aluminum articles, effective March 23, 2018. See the Federal Register, 83 FR 11619 and 83 FR 11625 (March 15, 2018).

U.S. Note 19 to Subchapter III of Chapter 99, HTSUS, was amended to read, in pertinent part, “[h]eading 9903.85.01 provides the ordinary customs duty treatment of aluminum products of all countries other than products of the United States and other than of countries expressly exempt therefrom”

U.S. Note 16 to Subchapter III of Chapter 99, HTSUS, was amended to read, in pertinent part, “[h]eading 9903.80.01 provides the ordinary customs duty treatment of iron or steel products of all countries other than products of the United States and other than of countries expressly exempt therefrom”

These duty requirements are effective with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on March 23, 2018.

GUIDANCE

PRODUCTS ENTERED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 98, HTSUS

The amended U.S. Notes 19 and 16 to Subchapter III of Chapter 99, HTSUS, clarify that “[g]oods for which entry is claimed under a provision of chapter 98 and which are subject to the additional duties prescribed herein shall be eligible for and subject to the terms of such provision and applicable U.S. Customs and Border Protection (‘CBP’) regulations, except that duties under subheading 9802.00.60 shall be assessed based upon the full value of the imported article.”

Accordingly, where a valid claim for Chapter 98 treatment is made for goods that are also subject to Section 232 duties (i.e., classifiable in one of the named provisions in Ch. 72, 73 or 76 and a product of a country other than the United States or an exempt country), ***Chapter 98 treatment will be applied. However, in addition, Section 232 duties, under Chapter 99, will be assessed independently from any Chapter 98 treatment and in accordance with the applicable chapter 99 note. Furthermore, where the Chapter 98 provision provides for the assessment of duties on a portion of the article, such as the value of the repair or other processing, Section 232 duties are to be assessed on that value.*** However, an exception occurs for subheading 9802.00.60, HTSUS. If covered goods are entered under this provision, Section 232 duties are to be assessed on the entire value of the articles.

CBP issues guidance on Sec. 301 exclusion extensions for Tranche 1

On April 13, 2020, CBP issued [CSMS #42355914 - GUIDANCE: Section 301 China – Extension of Certain Product Exclusions Covered under Tranche 1 - \\$34B –Action \(9903.88.07\)](#).

BACKGROUND

On April 10, 2020, the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) published Federal Register (FR) Notice [85 FR 20332](#) to extend for 12 months certain product exclusions covered by the April 18, 2019 notice (see [84 FR 16310](#)) for Section 301 duties on China (\$34B Action - Tranche 1).

These product exclusions relate to the imposed additional duties on Chinese goods with an annual trade value of approximately \$34 billion, apply retroactive to the July 6, 2018 effective date of the \$34 billion action, and will extend to April 18, 2021.

The scope of each exclusion is governed by the scope of the HTSUS 10-digit classification and product descriptions in the Annex per FR notice [85 FR 20332](#); not by the product descriptions set out in any particular request for exclusion. A link to the Federal Register Notice is embedded in this message.

The functionality for the acceptance of the extended product exclusions will be available in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) by 7am, Eastern Standard Time on April 14, 2020.

GUIDANCE

For reference, instructions for importers, brokers, and filers on submitting entries to CBP containing certain product exclusions that were extended are set out below:

In addition to reporting the regular Chapters 84 and 90 classifications of the HTSUS for the imported merchandise, importers shall report the HTSUS classification 9903.88.07 (Articles, the product of China, as provided for in U.S. note 20(j) to this subchapter, each covered by an exclusion granted by the USTR for imported merchandise subject to the exclusion).

- Importers shall not submit the corresponding Chapter 99 HTS number for the Section 301 duties when HTS 9903.88.07 is submitted.

Product Exclusions granted a 12-month extension under HTS 9903.88.07:

- 8420.10.9080, 8425.39.0100, 8431.20.0000, 8479.90.9496, 8481.90.9040 and 9030.33.3800

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Imports which have been granted a product exclusion from the Section 301 measures, and which are not subject to the Section 301 duties, are not covered by the Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) provisions of the Section 301 Federal Register notices, but instead are subject to the FTZ provisions in 19 CFR part 146.

Duty exclusions granted by the USTR are retroactive for imports on or after the initial July 6, 2018 effective date of the Tranche 1, \$34B Action, of the China Section 301 trade remedies. To request a refund of Section 301 duties paid on previous imports of products granted duty exclusions by the USTR, importers may file a Post Summary Correction (PSC) if within the PSC filing timeframe. If the entry is beyond the PSC filing timeframe, but within 180 days of the liquidation action, importers may protest the liquidation.

Reminder: When importers, brokers, and/or filers are submitting an entry summary in which a heading or subheading in Chapter 99 is claimed on imported merchandise, please reference CSMS [39587858](#) (Entry Summary Order of Reporting for Multiple HTSUS when 98 or 99 HTSUS are required).

For ease of reference, a summary of Section 301 duties and product exclusion notifications are provided as an attachment.

USITC will accept comments on petitions for duty suspensions and reductions in category VI

On April 24, 2020, the US International Trade Commission (USITC) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) that it will accept additional comments from the public, during the period June 12 to June 22, 2020, on petitions for duty suspensions and reductions that the Commission places in Category VI in the preliminary report that it sends to the House Committee on Ways and Means and the Senate Committee on Finance on June 9, 2020.

Under the *American Manufacturing Competitiveness Act of 2016* (the Act), the USITC must submit its preliminary report on the petitions for duty suspensions and reductions that have been filed with it to the House Committee on Ways and Means and the Senate Committee on Finance on June 9, 2020. In that report, the USITC must categorize each petition as either (a) a petition that meets the requirements of the Act with or without modification (Category I, II, III, or IV petitions), (b) a petition that does not contain the information required by the Act or that was not filed by a likely beneficiary (Category V petitions), or (c) a petition that the Commission does not recommend for inclusion in a miscellaneous tariff bill (Category VI petitions). The USITC has decided that it will accept additional comments from the public on any petitions that are listed as Category VI petitions for a ten-day period beginning on June 12, 2020, at 8:45 a.m. As provided in the notice, all such comments must be submitted electronically through the USITC's [website](#) between June 12, 2020 at 8:45 a.m.

USITC extends postponement of all 337 in-person hearings

On April 21, 2020, the US International Trade Commission (USITC) published in the *Federal Register* [a notice](#) that, in light of the ongoing Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, the USITC has determined to extend postponement of all section 337 in-person hearings until June 10, 2020. Administrative Law Judges (ALJ) are directed to notify all affected parties and to schedule new dates for the hearings as appropriate. ALJs may otherwise conduct their investigations in accordance with their established procedures.

Commerce proposes establishing an aluminum import monitoring and analysis system

On April 29, 2020, Enforcement and Compliance, International Trade Administration (ITA), Commerce, published in the *Federal Register* a [proposed rule](#) [Docket ITA-2020-200408-0103] to establish an Aluminum Import Monitoring and Analysis (AIM) system. Over the past decade, Commerce has operated the Steel Import Monitoring and Analysis (SIMA) system to monitor for import surges of specific steel products and to monitor for potential transshipment and circumvention of US trade measures relating to these products. AIM, as proposed, will be similar to the existing SIMA system. Specifically, Commerce proposes to require import license applicants to identify the country where the aluminum used in the manufacture of the imported aluminum product was smelted and poured; to release this data on an aggregate basis, as appropriate; and to apply the licensing requirement to cover all imports of basic aluminum products, which are listed in Annex II. To be assured of consideration, written comments must be received on or before 5 p.m. EST on May 29, 2020.

CBP continues temporary travel restrictions to land POEs and ferries between US and Canada

On April 22, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published two separate notifications of continuation of temporary travel restrictions, which an-

nounce the decision of the Secretary of Homeland Security (Secretary) to continue to temporarily limit the travel of individuals [from Canada](#) or [Mexico](#) into the United States at land ports of entry along the United States-Canada and United States- Mexico borders. Such travel will be limited to “essential travel,” as further defined in the document.

“Essential travel” includes, but is not limited to—

- U.S. citizens and lawful permanent residents returning to the United States;
- Individuals traveling for medical purposes (e.g., to receive medical treatment in the United States);
- Individuals traveling to attend educational institutions;
- Individuals traveling to work in the United States (e.g., individuals working in the farming or agriculture industry who must travel between the United States and Canada or Mexico in furtherance of such work);
- Individuals traveling for emergency response and public health purposes (e.g., government officials or emergency responders entering the United States to support federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial government efforts to respond to COVID-19 or other emergencies);
- Individuals engaged in lawful cross-border trade (e.g., truck drivers supporting the movement of cargo between the United States and Canada or Mexico);
- Individuals engaged in official government travel or diplomatic travel;
- Members of the U.S. Armed Forces, and the spouses and children of members of the U.S. Armed Forces, returning to the United States; and
- Individuals engaged in military-related travel or operations.

The following travel does not fall within the definition of “essential travel” for purposes of this Notification—

- Individuals traveling for tourism purposes (e.g., sightseeing, recreation, gambling, or attending cultural events).

The notification does not apply to air, freight rail, or sea travel between the United States and Canada or Mexico, but does apply to passenger rail and ferry travel between the United States and Canada or Mexico.

These restrictions go into effect at 12 a.m. EDT on April 21, 2020 and will remain in effect until 11:59 p.m. EDT on May 20, 2020.

CBP temporarily postpones the time to deposit certain estimated duties, taxes and fees during the Covid-19 national emergency

On April 22, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a [temporary final rule](#) [USCBP-2020-0017; CBP Dec. 20-05] implementing the Executive Order issued on April 18, 2020, entitled “National Emergency Authority to Temporarily Extend Deadlines for Certain Estimated Payments” authorizing the Secretary of the Treasury to exercise the authority under section 318(a) of the *Tariff Act of 1930*. The Secretary of the Treasury, in consultation with the designee of the Secretary of Homeland Security -- CBP, is amending the CBP regulations by adding a new 19 C.F.R. 24.1a, to temporarily postpone the deadline for importers of record with a significant financial hardship to deposit certain estimated duties, taxes, and fees that they would ordinarily be obligated to pay as of the date of entry, or withdrawal from warehouse, for consumption, for merchandise entered in March or April 2020, for a period of 90 days from the date that the deposit would otherwise have been due but for this

emergency action. This temporary postponement does not permit return of any deposits of estimated duties, taxes, and/or fees that have been paid. This temporary postponement also does not apply to entries, or withdrawals from warehouse, subject to certain specified trade remedies, and any entry summary that includes merchandise subject to those trade remedies is not eligible under this rule.

This emergency action is being taken in response to the extraordinary challenges facing U.S. individuals and businesses during the COVID-19 national emergency (which significantly affects the trade community), and is consistent with the Secretary of the Treasury's decision to postpone due dates for Federal income tax payments under section 7508A(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (available at <https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus>).

This temporary postponement does not permit return of any deposits of estimated duties, taxes, and/or fees that have been paid. This temporary postponement also does not apply to any entry, or withdrawal from warehouse, for consumption, or any deposit of estimated duties, taxes, or fees for the entry, or withdrawal from warehouse, for consumption, where the entry summary includes any merchandise subject to one or more of the following: antidumping duties (assessed pursuant to 19 U.S.C. 1673 et seq.), countervailing duties (assessed pursuant to 19 U.S.C. 1671 et seq.), duties assessed pursuant to Section 232 of the *Trade Expansion Act of 1962* (19 U.S.C. 1862), duties assessed pursuant to Section 201 of the *Trade Act of 1974* (19 U.S.C. 2251 et seq.), and duties assessed pursuant to Section 301 of the *Trade Act of 1974* (19 U.S.C. 2411 et seq.). Accordingly, CBP anticipates that importers will file separate entries when a shipment contains both merchandise that is eligible for temporary postponement and merchandise that is ineligible (because of the above-specified trade remedies).

To qualify for this temporary postponement, an importer must demonstrate a significant financial hardship. An eligible importer's operation must be fully or partially suspended during March or April 2020 due to orders from a competent governmental authority limiting commerce, travel, or group meetings because of COVID-19, and as a result of such suspension, the gross receipts of such importer for March 13-31, 2020 or April 2020 are less than 60 percent of the gross receipts for the comparable period in 2019. An eligible importer need not file additional documentation with CBP to be eligible for this relief but must maintain documentation as part of its books and records establishing that it meets the requirements for relief.

CBP notes that for some types of entries, the time of entry is contingent (in part) upon the deposit of estimated duties, taxes, and fees. See, e.g., 19 CFR 141.68(b). To ensure clarity in the application of the temporary postponement vis-à-vis the time of entry, this emergency action 7 includes a waiver of the regulatory requirement to deposit estimated duties, taxes, and fees for the purpose of establishing the time of entry in those instances where it would otherwise be required under 19 CFR 141.68. The time of entry can thus be established in the absence of the deposit of estimated duties, taxes, and fees postponed in accordance with this emergency action.

Effective date: April 20, 2020. Comments must be received by May 20, 2020.

CBP publishes quarterly interest rates

On April 3, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a [general notice](#) that advises the public that the quarterly Internal Revenue Service interest rates used to calculate interest on overdue accounts (underpayments) and refunds (overpayments) of customs duties will remain the same from the previous quarter. For the calendar quarter beginning April 1, 2020, the interest rates for overpayments will be 4 percent for corporations and 5 percent for non-corporations, and the interest rate for underpayments will be 5 percent for both corporations and non-corporations. This notice is published for the convenience of the importing public and CBP personnel. The rates announced in this notice are applicable as of April 1, 2020.

EXPORT CONTROLS AND SANCTIONS

Annual increase in civil monetary penalties for US Treasury, State, and Commerce Departments

The US Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control ("OFAC"), the US State Department ("State"), and the US Commerce Department ("Commerce") issued rules adjusting maximum civil monetary penalties ("CMPs") under the Federal Civil Penalties Inflation Adjustment Act Improvements Act of 2015 ("FCA").

OFAC CMP Adjustments

Under OFAC's [final rule](#) published on April 9, 2020, the adjusted penalties apply to CMPs that are assessed after April 9, 2020, as long as the violation occurred after November 2, 2015 (i.e., the date of the enactment of the 2015 Act). OFAC imposes CMPs pursuant to the penalty authority in five statutes: the Trading with the Enemy Act ("TWEA"), the International Emergency Economic Powers Act ("IEEPA"), the Foreign Narcotics Kingpin Designation Act ("FNKDA"), the Antiterrorism and Effective Death Penalty Act of 1996 ("AEDPA"), and the Clean Diamond Trade Act ("CDTA"). The specific OFAC penalty adjustments for each of

the statutes are as follows: [The [2016-2019 adjustments are available here](#) for reference]

In addition to updating these maximum CMP amounts, OFAC also updated the IEEPA one-half maximum CMP for non-egregious cases where a party files a voluntary self-disclosure from \$151,292 to \$ 153,961.

State CMP Adjustments

State published the CMP adjustments in a [final rule](#) on January 14, 2020, which included the CMP adjustments for the Arms Export Control Act (“AECA”), the statute under which the International Traffic in Arms Regulations are enforced. State will apply the increased CMPs to all penalties assessed on or after the effective date of the final rule, January 14, 2020, regardless of when the underlying violations occurred. The penalties assessed by State for violations of specific sections within the AECA are as follows: [The [2016-2019 adjustments are available here](#) for reference]

Commerce CMP Adjustments

Finally, Commerce also adjusted a number of CMPs in a [final rule](#) issued on January 3, 2020, which went into effect on January 15, 2020. CMPs for violations of the Export Control Reform Act of 2018, the statute under which the Export Administration Regulations are enforced, was adjusted from \$300,000 to \$305,292 per violation or twice the value of the transaction.

NRC suspends General License authority to export byproducts material to Pakistan

On April 21, 2020, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) published in the *Federal Register* an [Order](#) [Docket No. EA-20-044; NRC–2020–0095] suspending the general license authority under NRC regulations for exports of byproduct material to Pakistan. Exporters are no longer authorized to use the general license to export byproduct material to Pakistan and now must apply for a specific license in accordance with 10 C.F.R. 110.31. The Order takes effect immediately.

FEMA announces additional exemptions to restrictions on exports of personal protective equipment from the United States

On April 17, 2020, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) filed a [notification of exemptions](#) (the “FEMA Notification”) in the Public Inspection List that identifies 10 exemptions from the [temporary final rule](#) published on April 10, 2020 (the “FEMA Rule”), which restricts the export from the United States of certain personal protective equipment (“PPE Products”) used in the response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Although the FEMA Notification [Docket ID FEMA–2020–0018] was not published in the *Federal Register* until Tuesday, [April 21, 2020](#), it became effective on April 17.

By way of brief background, the FEMA Rule, which is described in our prior blog post [here](#), imposed export restrictions on PPE Products pursuant to a [Presidential Memorandum](#) dated April 3, 2020, which is described in our blog post [here](#). The FEMA Rule directed US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) to detain any shipments of the relevant PPE Products pending FEMA’s determination whether to return such shipments for domestic use, issue a rated order for the products, or allow the export of part of all of the shipment. On April 9, 2020, CBP issued internal guidance (available [here](#) as of April 18, 2020 and described in our blog post [here](#)) that listed a number of exclusions to the FEMA Rule. As clarified by CBP in recent days, the guidance was not meant to become public, and the criteria for exclusions were then still under discussion, with public guidance forthcoming from FEMA. The FEMA Notification is the public version of the guidance prepared by FEMA and CBP.

Which Shipments Are Exempt From the FEMA Rule?

As described in our [blog post](#), the FEMA Rule contained only one narrow exemption, which was for shipments by or on behalf of US manufacturers with continuous export agreements with foreign customers since at least January 1, 2020 and a track record of distributing at least 80% of their supply of the PPE Products, on a per item basis, in the United States during the preceding 12 months. That said, the FEMA Rule contemplated that FEMA may, in its discretion, establish additional exemptions. The exemptions set out in the FEMA Rule and the FEMA Notification (together, the “Exemptions”) differ in several respects from the exclusions set out in the internal CBP guidance. Exporters should rely on the Exemptions in the FEMA Notification rather than the exclusions in the CBP internal guidance.

The additional Exemptions under the FEMA Notification are as follows:

1. Shipments to US commonwealths and territories, including Guam, American Samoa, Puerto Rico, US Virgin Islands, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (including minor outlying islands)

2. Exports by non-profit or non-governmental organizations that are solely for donation to foreign charities or governments for free distribution (not sale) at their destination(s)
3. Intracompany transfers by US companies from domestic facilities to company-owned or affiliated foreign facilities
4. Exports of materials solely for assembly in medical kits and diagnostic testing kits destined for US sale and delivery
5. Sealed, sterile medical kits and diagnostic testing kits where only a portion of the kit is made up of one or more PPE Products that cannot be easily removed without damaging the kits
6. Declared diplomatic shipments from foreign embassies and consulates to their home countries, shipped from and consigned to foreign governments
7. Shipments to overseas US military addresses, foreign service posts (e.g., diplomatic post offices,) and embassies
8. In-transit merchandise such as shipments in transit through the United States with a foreign shipper and consignee and shipments temporarily entered into a warehouse or temporarily admitted to a foreign trade zone
9. Shipments for which the final destination is Canada or Mexico
10. Shipments by or on behalf of the US federal government, including its military

The FEMA Notification includes additional detail about which types of shipments are eligible for each Exemption.

Will Shipments that Qualify for an Exemption Be Detained by CBP?

The FEMA Notification does not specify how the Exemptions will be applied. In the absence of further guidance, we assume that CBP would still temporarily detain shipments of PPE Products at the US border pending FEMA's determination. FEMA will make a determination based on the applicable Exemptions and the "totality of circumstances" described in the FEMA Rule, including letters of attestation submitted by exporters to CBP for certain Exemptions.

Which Documentation Should Exporters Submit to Claim an Exemption?

The FEMA Notification provides that exporters should submit a letter of attestation to FEMA via CBP's document imaging system for exemptions 2, 3, 4, 8, and 9, certifying to FEMA the purpose of the shipment. The letter should be submitted to CBP with other documentation relating to each shipment and should contain:

- a description of which Exemption(s) the exporter is claiming;
- details regarding the shipment sufficient for CBP and FEMA officials to determine whether the shipment falls under the claimed Exemption(s); and
- a statement that the provided information is true and accurate to the best of the exporter's knowledge, and that the exporter is aware that false information is subject to prosecution under the Defense Production Act.

Exporters interested in a template letter of attestation to satisfy an Exemption should reach out to their usual contacts in Baker McKenzie's trade compliance group.

What Should Exporters Expect?

Although the FEMA Rule and the FEMA Notification set out a number of exemptions, exporters of PPE Products will likely continue to encounter delays at ports

across the country, pending determinations by FEMA. The FEMA Rule does not mandate a specific time for FEMA to decide whether a particular export will be permitted, and it is not clear whether, when, or how exporters will be notified of the status of their shipment. Exporters that believe their shipment may be covered by an Exemption should provide letters of attestation and related transactional documents containing all relevant information through CBP as requested by FEMA to facilitate the process.

FEMA Implements Export Restrictions on Certain PPE Products, with Immediate Effect

On Tuesday, April 7, 2020, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (“FEMA”) filed a [temporary final rule](#) (“Rule”) in the Public Inspection issue of the *Federal Register* [published April 10, in the [Federal Register](#)] to establish export restrictions on certain types of personal protective equipment products (“PPE Products”) used in the response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Rule implemented the order via Presidential Memorandum (“[Order](#)”) dated April 3, 2020, in which the President directed the US Department of Homeland Security, of which FEMA is a part, to take action under the Defense Production Act (“DPA”) to prevent diversion of the needed materials overseas (see our blog post on that development [here](#)).

Is the Rule Effective Now?

Yes. Although the rule was not published in the *Federal Register* until Friday, April 10, it became effectively immediately upon filing in the Public Inspection issue. The Rule will remain in effect for 120 days from its publication, i.e., until August 8, 2020.

Which PPE Products are Subject to the Rule?

The PPE Products covered by the Rule are the same as those addressed in the Order. They are 5 of the 15 categories of materials that had been identified as “scarce or threatened materials” by the US Department of Health and Human Services (“HHS”) in a [notice](#) issued on March 25, 2020. Specifically, the PPE Products are:

- N-95 Filtering Facepiece Respirators, including devices that are disposable half-face-piece non-powered air-purifying particulate respirators intended for use to cover the nose and mouth of the wearer to help reduce wearer exposure to pathogenic biological airborne particulates;
- Other Filtering Facepiece Respirators (e.g., those designated as N99, N100, R95, R99, R100, or P95, P99, P100), including single-use, disposable half-mask respiratory protective devices that cover the user’s airway (nose and mouth) and offer protection from particulate materials at an N95 filtration efficiency level per 42 CFR § 84.181;
- Elastomeric, air-purifying respirators and appropriate particulate filters/cartridges;
- PPE surgical masks, including masks that cover the user’s nose and mouth and provide a physical barrier to fluids and particulate materials; and
- PPE gloves or surgical gloves, including those defined at 21 CFR § 880.6250 (exam gloves) and § 878.4460 (surgical gloves).

As noted in our previous blog post, the Order (and thus the Rule) does not include the other materials that HHS has identified as “scarce or threatened materials,” which could be targeted in future actions. That includes, among other

things, drug products with the active ingredient chloroquine or hydroxychloroquine HC1; ventilators and related materials; certain sterilization services; certain sanitizing and disinfecting products; and medical gowns or apparel.

Is the Export of the PPE Products Now Prohibited?

Not necessarily, but all shipments of the PPE Products will be temporarily detained by US Customs and Border Protection so that FEMA can determine whether to: (1) return the shipment for domestic use (i.e., prohibit the export); (2) issue a rated order under the DPA (i.e., FEMA would place an order to purchase the products itself, and the seller would be required to prioritize FEMA's order); or (3) allow the export of part or all of the shipment.

In reaching a determination about a particular shipment, the Rule states that FEMA will consider the totality of the circumstances, including the following factors:

1. the need to ensure that scarce or threatened items are appropriately allocated for domestic use;
2. minimization of disruption to the supply chain, both domestically and abroad;
3. the circumstances surrounding the distribution of the materials and any potential hoarding or price-gouging concerns;
4. the quantity and quality of the materials;
5. humanitarian considerations; and
6. international relations and diplomatic considerations.

Who Must Comply With the Rule?

Anyone involved in an export of PPE Products from the United States must comply with the Rule. This includes manufacturers, brokers, distributors, exporters, and shippers.

Is There Grandfathering of Preexisting Contracts?

There is a narrow exemption for shipments by or on behalf of US manufacturers with continuous export agreements with customers in other countries since at least January 1, 2020. However, this exemption only applies to US manufacturers with a track record of distributing at least 80% of their supply of the PPE Products, on a per item basis, in the United States during the 12 months. The Rule notes that FEMA may develop additional guidance about this exemption, encouraging manufacturers to contact FEMA with specific information about their status under the exemption.

What are the Penalties for Violations?

Section 103 of the DPA provides for monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 and/or imprisonment for no more than one year. In addition, under 18 U.S.C. § 554, anyone who fraudulently or knowingly exports anything from the United States contrary to US law, or who facilitates such a transaction, can face fines and/or up to 10 years' imprisonment.

The US Government may issue further guidance about these DPA developments in the coming days. Baker McKenzie is actively monitoring any further guidance or development on these issues. [A [technical correction](#) to the filing date was published in the April 23 *Federal Register*.]

CBP issues additional guidance on implementation of restrictions on exports of personal protective equipment from the United States and related exemptions

On April 21, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) issued guidance via a bulletin in its Cargo Systems Messaging Service (available [here](#)) (“Bulletin”) on the new [temporary final rule](#) published by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) imposing export restrictions on certain personal protective equipment products (“PPE Products”) used in the response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Bulletin details CBP’s implementation of the PPE export restrictions and its process for determining whether an export may be covered by an exemption.

The FEMA Rule and Exemptions

By way of background, on April 10, 2020, FEMA published a temporary final rule (“FEMA rule”), which is described in our prior blog post [here](#), directing CBP to detain temporarily any shipments of PPE Products pending FEMA’s determination whether to return such shipments for domestic use, issue a rated order for the products, or allow the export of part or all of the shipment. The FEMA Rule contained only one exemption, which was for shipments by or on behalf of US manufacturers with continuous export agreements with non-US customers since at least January 1, 2020 and a track record of distributing at least 80% of their supply of PPE Products, on a per item basis, in the United States during the preceding 12 months (the “First FEMA Exemption”).

On April 21, 2020, FEMA published a [notification of exemptions](#) (the “FEMA Notification”) in the Federal Register that identified 10 additional numbered exemptions to the FEMA Rule, which are summarized in our blog post [here](#). The FEMA Notification provided that for several of these exemptions exporters should submit a letter of attestation to FEMA certifying the purpose of the shipment. Exporters interested in a template letter of attestation to satisfy an exemption should reach out to their usual contacts in Baker McKenzie’s trade compliance group.

Bulletin

The Bulletin clarifies how these exemptions will be applied and provides technical guidance on submitting documentation to claim an exemption. Highlights include:

- FEMA and CBP are working to establish a process to identify manufacturers that qualify for the First FEMA Exemption.
- Regarding exemption 9 (*i.e.*, Canada and Mexico shipments), the letter of attestation must state that the covered materials are for use in Canada/Mexico, and will not be transhipped through those countries.
- Regarding exemption 8 (*i.e.*, in-transit merchandise), CBP clarified that the exemption largely applies to goods temporarily entered into a bonded warehouse or Foreign Trade Zone with the intent to leave the United States.

In order to avoid detention of shipments, letters should be uploaded in CBP’s document imaging system (DIS) at the same time as the Electronic Export Infor-

mation is transmitted in the Automated Export System. The Bulletin also contains further technical information regarding submissions to the DIS and CBP contact information.

Treasury publishes list of countries requiring cooperation with an international boycott

On April 9, 2020, the Department of the Treasury published in the *Federal Register* a [current list](#) of countries which require or may require participation in, or cooperation with, an international boycott (within the meaning of section 999(b)(3) of the *Internal Revenue Code of 1986*).

On the basis of the best information currently available to Treasury, the following countries require or may require participation in, or cooperation with, an international boycott: Iraq, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, United Arab Emirates and Yemen.

OFAC re-issues and narrows PdVSA-related General License and authorizes wind-down transactions

On April 21, 2020, the US Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) amended General License ("GL") 8E and re-issued it as [General License No. 8F](#). GL 8F extends the validity period of certain maintenance activities involving Petróleos de Venezuela S.A. ("PdVSA") until December 1, 2020, but also narrows the scope of the prior license and provides a new authorization for "wind-down" transactions and activities. OFAC amends North Korea Sanctions Regulations

On April 10, 2020, the US Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) issued a [rule](#) amending the *North Korea Sanctions Regulations* ("NKSAR"). The NKSAR amendments implement certain provisions of the *North Korea Sanctions and Policy Enhancement Act of 2016* ("NKSPEA"), as amended by the *Countering America's Adversaries Through Sanctions Act* ("CAATSA"), and the *National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2020* ("2020 NDAA"). Our prior blog post on NKSPEA can be found [here](#) and our prior blog post on CAATSA can be found [here](#).

The amendments make the following key changes to the NKSAR:

- Implementation of US Secondary Sanctions Mandated by US Congress:** Adds in § 510.201 a long list of North-Korea-related activities for which parties may be subject to US secondary sanctions pursuant to NKSPEA, CAATSA and/or 2020 NDAA, including non-US parties that directly or indirectly maintain a correspondent account with any North Korean financial institution except as specifically approved by the UN Security Council, and non-US parties that directly or indirectly import, export, or reexport luxury goods to or into North Korea;
- Restrictions on Correspondent Account – Potential Sanction:** Authorizes in § 510.210 new bases for restrictions to be imposed on opening or maintaining US correspondent or payable-through accounts by non-US financial institutions that are determined to have provided significant financial services to persons designated under North Korea sanctions;

- **Prohibition for Non-US Subsidiaries of US Financial Institutions:** Prohibits in § 510.214 non-US entities that are owned or controlled by US financial institutions from knowingly engaging in any transaction, directly or indirectly, with the Government of North Korea or any person designated under North Korea sanctions, which directly applies US sanctions to such non-US subsidiaries that are not otherwise subject to US sanctions jurisdiction under the NKSr and is similar to Iran-related prohibitions for non-US subsidiaries of US banks imposed in February 2012 under [§ 561.202 of the Iranian Financial Sanctions Regulations](#);
- **Revised Definition of “Significant Transactions:”** Revises the interpretive provision at § 510.413 related to factors considered when determining whether a transaction is “significant” to, among other things, add “financial services” to targeted transactions, and specifically include the following example of impacts on US sanctions program objectives: “Whether and how the activity or activities, transaction(s), or financial service(s) contribute(s) to North Korea’s nuclear and ballistic missile programs, commission of serious human rights abuses, use of funds generated through international trade to support its nuclear and missile programs and weapons proliferation, money laundering and other illicit activities, procurement of luxury goods, human rights violations, and violations of United Nations Security Council Resolutions;” and
- **Revised Definition of “Luxury Goods:”** Revises the definition of “luxury goods” at § 510.317 to include items so designated by the UN Security Council (in addition to the definition of that term from the Export Administration Regulations, in [§ 746.4\(b\)\(1\)](#) and [Supplement No. 1 to Part 746](#)) and to clarify that items specifically approved by the UN Security Council for import, export, or reexport to or into North Korea are not included in this definition.

OFAC extends expiration date of general license related to Nynas AB as part of proposed restructuring

On April 3, 2020, the US Treasury Department’s Office of Foreign Assets Control (“OFAC”) re-issued and extended [General License No. 13E](#) (“GL 13E”) to continue the validity period for transactions concerning Nynas AB and its subsidiaries (“Nynas”) that otherwise would be prohibited under Executive Order 13850 or Executive Order 13884 given Nynas’s 50% indirect ownership by Petróleos de Venezuela S.A. (“PdVSA”). The authorization was extended through 12:01 am EST on May 14, 2020.

In a [note](#) accompanying GL 13E’s issuance OFAC explained it was in discussions with Nynas regarding a proposed corporate restructuring that could potentially result in “significant changes to Nynas AB’s ownership and control,” and that the one-month extension period was to allow for the completion of these discussions. As outlined in our previous blog post available [here](#), OFAC had previously re-issued the Nynas-related general license for six months, i.e., through April 14, 2020.

Commerce tightens restrictions on technology exports to countries of concern, in particular China, Russia, and Venezuela

On April 28, 2020, the Department of Commerce’s Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published two new final rules and a proposed rule in the Federal Register amending the Export Administration Regulations (“EAR”) to tighten restrictions on exports of technology to China, Russia, and Venezuela. According to Commerce Secretary Wilbur Ross, these actions are intended to combat efforts by entities in China, Russia, and Venezuela to use certain US technologies

obtained through civilian supply chains or under civilian-use pretenses to develop weapons, military aircraft, and surveillance technology contrary to US national security interests.

As a result of these rules, a universe of transactions involving widely commercially available US technologies that require BIS licenses could dramatically increase, particularly for China — with the licensing policy of the presumption of denial making such licenses difficult to obtain. These rules are part of a broader wave of recent regulatory measures aimed to strengthen the US Government's restrictions on, as well as visibility into, technology transfers to China and other countries of concern to protect US national security and foreign policy interests.

As described further below, the rules:

1. [amend](#) the EAR to expand license requirements on exports, reexports, and transfers (in-country) of items intended for military end-use or military end-users in China, Russia, or Venezuela;
2. [propose](#) to modify License Exception Additional Permissive Reexports (“APR”) to remove provisions authorizing certain reexports of national security-controlled items; and
3. [remove](#) License Exception Civil End Users (“CIV”) for national security-controlled items on the Commerce Control List (“CCL”) to countries of national security concern.

BIS and State publish notices of court order related to USML

On April 2, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security published in the *Federal Register* a [notification of a court order](#) to alert the public of the BIS's interim measures with respect to a court order issued on March 6, 2020. On March 6, 2020, the US District Court (WD Wash.) issued an order enjoining the US Department of State from implementing or enforcing the regulation entitled *International Traffic In Arms Regulations: U.S. Munitions List Categories I, II, and III*, 85 FR 3819 (Jan. 23, 2020) “insofar as it alters the status quo restrictions on technical data and software directly related to the production of firearms or firearm parts using a 3D-printer or similar equipment.” (Case No. 2:20-cv-00111– RAJ). The Commerce and State final rules were to be effective March 9, 2020.

As a result, any request for licenses of items that would otherwise fall under the US Department of Commerce regulation, 15 CFR 732.2(b) and 734.7(c) (added by the final rule, entitled, *Control of Firearms, Guns, Ammunition and Related Articles the President Determines No Longer Warrant Control Under the United States Munitions List* (USML); 85 FR 4136, Jan. 23, 2020), should instead be directed to the US Department of State.

On the same date, the Department of State published in the *Federal Register* a companion [notification of preliminary injunction](#) [Public Note: 11078], which indicated that State is complying with the terms of the order. All persons engaged in manufacturing, exporting, temporarily importing, brokering, or furnishing defense services related to “technical data and software directly related to the production of firearms or firearm parts using a 3D-printer or similar equipment” must continue to treat such technical data and software as subject to control on the USML. All other items addressed in the final rules were transferred from the jurisdiction of the State Department and the USML to the Department of Commerce and the

Commerce Control List (CCL) on March 9, 2020. Any further guidance and updates regarding the subject litigation will be posted on the DDTC website (<https://pmddtc.state.gov>) on an ongoing basis.

State Department issues measures to mitigate impact of Covid-19

On April 23, 2020, the US State Department's Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC) announced certain [measures](#) intended to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, and key measures are summarized in our [Sanctions Blog article](#) by [Bart M. McMillan](#) and [Eunkyung Kim Shin](#).

State Department issues proposed framework for a peaceful democratic transition in Venezuela

On March 31, 2020, the US Government issued a [proposed framework](#) for a peaceful democratic transition in Venezuela. The framework outlines 13 steps for a restructured Government of Venezuela ("GOV") that, if followed, would lead to the lifting of US sanctions on the GOV, Petróleos de Venezuela, S.A. ("PdVSA"), and other GOV officials and agencies.

The framework provides a total of 13 actions, including, among others:

- a full return of, and restoration of all powers to, the National Assembly;
- release of political prisoners;
- immediate departure of all foreign security forces unless authorized by a 3/4 vote of the National Assembly;
- the election of a new National Electoral Counsel ("CNE") and Supreme Court ("TSJ") (upon which, the US would lift sanctions imposed on former CNE and TSJ members);
- the approval by the National Assembly of a "Council of State" Law, which would create a Council of State that would act as the GOV's executive branch;
- a vesting of the powers of the President to the Council of State (upon which, both the US and EU would lift sanctions on those who claimed Presidential authorities); and
- once the Council of State is established and the foreign security forces have departed, the US would suspend sanctions on the GOV, PdVSA, and the Venezuelan oil sector.

A related [statement](#) by the US State Department explains that the framework calls for the establishment of a broadly acceptable transitional government to administer free and fair presidential elections and a transition from the Maduro regime to a GOV headed by Juan Guaido. The statement provides that the need for transition is more important than ever given the ongoing COVID-19 crisis and the GOV's failure to adequately respond, and reiterates that unless and until the Maduro regime accepts a genuine political transition, US sanctions will remain in effect, and increase. This statement is consistent with the US Government's recent hardline approach to sanctioning non-US entities that continue to do business with the GOV and, in particular, the Venezuelan oil sector. ANTIDUMPING AND SUBSIDIES

Temporary change to AD/CVD conference and hearing procedures

On April 16, 2020, the US International Trade Commission (USITC) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) that, to address concerns related to COVID-19, it is temporarily waiving and amending certain of the USITC's rules that permit participants to appear in-person to give oral presentations, written witness testimony, or statements at antidumping/countervailing duty (AD/CVD) preliminary phase conferences, and final phase investigation and five-year review hearings held under Title VII of the *Tariff Act of 1930*. The temporary procedures are effective immediately and will remain until further notice.

AUSTRALIA

Export of infection control items from Australia temporarily prohibited

Export from Australia of hand sanitiser, face masks and other infection control items are temporarily prohibited effective 30 March 2020.

The [Customs \(Prohibited Exports\) Amendment \(COVID-19 Human Biosecurity Emergency\) Regulations 2020](#) (Cth) (Regulation) amended the [Customs \(Prohibited Exports\) Regulations 1958](#) (Cth) to temporarily prohibit export of goods that are key to minimising the spread of the COVID-19 virus in Australia.

Under the Regulation, disposable face masks, disposable gloves, disposable gowns, goggles, glasses and eye visors, alcohol wipes and hand sanitiser all become prohibited exports from Australia.

There are exceptions that permit commercial and non-commercial exports of these goods including by:

- persons leaving Australia taking a reasonable quantity for personal use (other non-commercial exceptions apply to sending to a relative for their own use and export by a humanitarian body);
- manufacturers of the goods; and
- persons in the ordinary course of their business where they are registered under the *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999* (Cth) and have an Australian business number.

Parties looking to rely on an exception should check they satisfy all conditions. In particular, these parties should not be looking to export by post.

The prohibition under the Regulation will apply while the [Biosecurity \(Human Biosecurity Emergency\) \(Human Coronavirus with Pandemic Potential\) Declaration 2020](#) (Cth) (Declaration) is in force. For context, the Declaration was made by the Governor-General on 18 March 2020 under section 475 of the Biosecurity Act, and provides that a human biosecurity emergency exists in Australia.

The Declaration is in force for 3 months (unless it is extended).

Compulsory registration required for additional electronics and information technology product categories

On April 1, 2020, the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology published in the *Gazette of India* a [notification](#) adding 12 product categories to the *Electronics and Information Technology Goods (Requirements for Compulsory Registration) Order, 2012* ("the Order"). These are:

45. Standalone LED Modules for General Lighting
46. Lighting Chain (Rope Lights)
47. Keyboard
48. Induction Stove
49. Automatic Teller Cash dispensing machines
50. USB Type External Hard Disk Drive
51. Wireless Headphone and Earphone
52. USB Type External Solid State Storage Devices (above 256 GB capacity)
53. Electronic Musical System with input power below 200 Watts
54. Standalone Switch Mode Power Supplies (SMPS) with output voltage 48 V (max)
55. Television other than Plasma/ LCD/LED TVs
56. Rice Cooker

In addition, the notification clarified that multifunction devices (MFDs) are printers with additional capabilities and are covered under the category “printers/plotters” which was notified 3 October 2012..

The provisions of the Order shall apply to the added product categories on the expiry of six months from the date of publication of the notification in the official *Gazette*.

A transition period of up to three months, from the date of coming into effect of the Order for the particular product category, would be available to the representative of the foreign manufacturing unit having a liaison office or branch office located in India for affixing Standard Mark at the ports which are already having unique registration number from the Bureau for clearance of goods from customs.

For all the product categories mentioned in the Schedule to the Order, the latest standards as published and notified by Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) from time to time would apply on expiry of six months from the date of notification of such standards by BIS. For goods already registered until such time, the surveillance testing as and when carried would be as per the latest standards. Further, renewal of registration would be done to the latest standards as per the provisions of the Compulsory Registration Scheme on expiry of validity of registration cycle.

SINGAPORE

Singapore concludes negotiations with New Zealand for Declaration on Trade in Essential Goods for Combating the Covid-19 Pandemic

On 15 April 2020, the Minister of Trade and Industry (MTI) and the New Zealand Minister for Trade and Export Growth jointly [announced](#) the launch of a Declaration on Trade in Essential Goods for Combating the COVID-19 Pandemic. The Declaration is intended to keep trade lines open for essential supplies so that the countries can collectively respond effectively and efficiently to the COVID-19 situation. The announcement also said:

The Declaration builds on the Joint Ministerial Statement on Supply Chain Connectivity which was originally issued by New Zealand and Singapore last month. Seven other countries – Australia, Brunei Darussalam, Canada, Chile, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Uruguay have since pledged their commitment to the Joint Ministerial Statement to ensure supply chain connectivity amidst the COVID-19 situation.

Through this joint undertaking not to impose tariffs and other trade barriers including export restrictions, Singapore and New Zealand hope the Declaration will have a positive demonstrative effect and boost efforts to ensure that trade continues to flow unimpeded for a list of essential supplies. Both countries will also work closely together to expedite and facilitate the flow and transit of these products through our respective sea and air ports.

The announcement included the text of the actual Declaration and a list of over 120 products identified as being essential goods in combating the COVID-19 Pandemic. Pursuant to the Declaration, the parties agree to eliminate import duties, remove any export restrictions and expedite all clearance procedures for the listed products

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THAILAND

FDA implements fast-track procedure for import of essential medical device products to combat COVID-19

The Food and Drug Administration, Ministry of Public Health (FDA), has released a notification aimed at facilitating fast-track import of certain medical device products required to combat COVID-19 which are:

1. Surgical mask	8. Medical thermometer for measuring fevers
2. N95 masks, or higher	9. Medical safety goggles
3. Personal protective equipment: PPE	10. Medical face shield
4. Surgical gown	11. Medical hood cover
5. Isolation gown	12. Medical leg cover
6. Medical cap	13. Swab
7. Medical gloves - excluding surgical gloves	

For new importers, the timeline to obtain a medical device establishment license for import is reduced from approximately one month to one working day, provided that documents are complete according to the FDA's standard checklist.

The notification process for these medical devices has also been simplified. Instead of submitting a Certificate of Free Sale, EC Certificate or EC Declaration of Conformity obtained from manufacturer's government and legalized by the Thai Embassy in the manufacturing country, the FDA now accepts a letter issued and certified by the manufacturer, containing the manufacturer's details, medical device details, and the statement "freely sold in the manufacturing country". This process also takes one working day to complete.

European Union and EFTA

EU updates export controls on personal protective equipment in response to COVID-19

On 24 April 2020, the European Commission published [Implementing Regulation \(EU\) 2020/568](#) (the "Implementing Regulation"), which prohibits the export from the EU of certain personal protective equipment unless a licence is first obtained from an EU Member State authority. The Implementing Regulation came into force on 26 April 2020.

The Implementing Regulation replaces the temporary export controls imposed by the Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/402 published on 15 March 2020, as amended by Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/426 on 20 March 2020 (please see our previous posts on [Implementing Regulation \(EU\) 2020/402](#) and [Implementing Regulation \(EU\) 2020/426](#)).

The new Implementing Regulation expands the list of destinations for which no licence is required to include Albania, Andorra, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Faeroe Islands, Gibraltar, Iceland, Kosovo, Liechtenstein, Montenegro, Norway,

North Macedonia, San Marino, Serbia, Switzerland, the Vatican City State, Büsingen, Heligoland, Livigno, Ceuta, Melilla and other specified overseas countries and territories. The exemption also applies to exports to facilities located on the continental shelf or exclusive economic zone of a Member State.

The protective equipment covered by the Implementing Regulation includes protective spectacles and visors, mouth-nose-protection equipment and protective garments, as listed in the Annex. The updated list lifts the previous restrictions on face shields and gloves (provided that the item in question is not otherwise covered by a provision in the Annex).

The latest Implementing Regulation remains in force for a period of 30 days from 26 April 2020, and will remain subject to review by the Commission.

European Commission narrows down export authorisation requirements to protective masks only and extends geographical and humanitarian exemptions

On 14 April 2020, the European Commission [announced](#) the start of consultations with EU Member States on a draft regulation to adjust the export authorisation scheme set up on 15 March as an emergency measure that elapses on 25 April 2020.

In line with the EU's global commitments in tackling the coronavirus pandemic, the scheme in the draft regulation is temporary, targeted, proportionate and transparent.

The new regulation is set out to apply for a limited period of 30 days (as of 26 April 2020), and it covers one single product category, protective masks. The Commission services find that this is the only remaining category, where an export authorisation is necessary in order to secure an adequate supply to protect the health of Europeans.

The new scheme proposes some changes with respect to its geographical scope. In addition to previously existing exceptions, it exempts from the authorisation requirement exports to Western Balkans [Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia, Kosovo], which are engaged in a process of deep integration with the Union as well as Gibraltar and territories of Member States excluded from the EU customs union.

In the spirit of international solidarity, the new scheme now explicitly requires Member States to authorise exports of emergency supplies in the context of humanitarian aid and to process the relevant applications in an expedite manner.

The new scheme also asks the Member States to positively assess exports to State agencies in charge of distributing personal protective equipment or involved in combating the coronavirus outbreak, subject to a check on availability with the Commission.

In line with the Commission's efforts to match supply and demand in the EU, the regulation obliges Member States to consult the European Commission when assessing whether to issue an export authorisation. The Commission shall issue an opinion within 48 hours from the receipt of the request. In this context, the purpose of the newly set up Clearing House is to coordinate efforts to match supply and demand in the EU and ensure that available supplies of materials go where they are most needed.

The draft regulation also includes a review clause that will allow the Commission to adjust the product scope or the duration of the provisions in light of possible new developments.

In the spirit of transparency, the draft regulation requires Member States to report to the Commission on their authorisations granted and refused and commits the Commission to report publicly on these developments.

The Commission will adopt this implementing regulation according to the corresponding comitology procedure.

The export authorisation scheme is part of the measures taken by the EU to address the epidemiological crisis caused by the coronavirus disease.

European Commission introduces additional retaliatory tariffs on certain US-originating products

On 6 April 2020, the European Commission adopted [Implementing Regulation \(EU\) 2020/502](#) (the “Implementing Regulation”) introducing additional tariffs on certain products originating from the US. This was adopted in retaliation to the further safeguard measures in the form of tariff increases, adopted by the United States on 24 January 2020, in relation to imports of certain derivative aluminium and steel products which took effect with unlimited duration on 8 February 2020.

Effective May 2020, the following additional duties (in addition to those that already apply) will apply in respect of US-originating goods:

- of 20% on lighters (CN 9613 80 00); and
- 7% on plastic fittings for furniture and coachwork (CN 3926 30 00).

Furthermore, additional duties of 4.4% will apply on US-originating imports of playing cards (CN 9504 40 00) from the earlier of:

- 8 February 2023; or
- the date of adoption by, or notification to, the WTO Dispute Settlement Body of a ruling that the United States' safeguard measures are inconsistent with the relevant provisions of the WTO Agreement.

European Commission publishes Decision granting temporary customs duty and import VAT exemptions for equipment needed to combat COVID-19

On 3 April 2020, the European Commission issued its [Decision](#) granting relief from customs duty and import VAT exemptions for equipment necessary for combating the COVID-19 outbreak, following its announcement of its intention to do so on 20 March 2020 (please see our previous blog post [here](#)).

Goods will only be exempt from customs duty and import VAT if they:

1. are imported by or on behalf of State organisations, or by or on behalf of organisations approved by competent authorities in the Member States;
2. are intended to be distributed or made available, free of charge, to “*persons affected by or at risk from COVID-19 or involved in combating the COVID-19 outbreak*”; and
3. satisfy certain requirements set out in Regulation (EC) No 1186/2009 and Council Directive 2009/132/EC.

Goods subject to relief and the quantities thereof will be determined by the Member States, although the European Commission indicates this will include masks and protective equipment, as well as testing kits, ventilators and other medical equipment.

The measures apply retrospectively from 30 January 2020 and will remain in place until 31 July 2020. The European Commission will review the situation, in consultation with Member States, before 31 July 2020 and extend the period if necessary.

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Binding Tariff Information

The European Community has created the Binding Tariff Information (BTI) system as a tool to assist economic operators to obtain the correct tariff classification for goods they intend to import or export.

Since 1 October 2019 all BTI correspondence between the economic operator and the customs authority is happening through the [Trader Portal](#). This includes among others applications by economic operators for BTI decisions, requests by the customs authority for further information on the product being classified and the economic operators' replies to those questions. A list of customs authorities designated by Member States for the purposes of receiving applications, or taking decisions relating to binding tariff information may be found [here](#).

Depending on the Member State an economic operator has to access either the [EU Customs trader portal](#) or the [national trader portal](#). You can search and consult existing BTIs on the [EBTI-database](#).

THE NETHERLANDS

Dutch Supreme Court confirms that EU Blocking Regulation does not prevent extradition of Iranian national to the United States

In a judgment of 7 April 2020 ([ECLI:NL:HR:2020:623](#)), the Dutch Supreme Court confirmed that the EU Blocking Regulation (“EUBR”) does not prevent extradition of an Iranian national to the United States for their alleged involvement in US export controls and sanctions violations. With this judgement, the Supreme Court upheld the judgement of the District Court of Rotterdam of 5 July 2019 ([ECLI:NL:RBROT:2019:5338](#)). SWITZERLAND

FCA believes measures adopted by Federal Council will optimise the movement of goods at the border

On 29 April 2020, the Federal Council [announced](#) that the Federal Customs Administration (FCA) expects that the lockdown easing measures adopted by the Federal Council on 16 April will lead to a noticeable increase in the movement of goods. In dialogue with the business community, existing measures have been optimised and expanded, and the next steps outlined to ensure rapid processing of commercial goods traffic at the border. The Federal Council was informed of this at its meeting on 29 April 2020. With the gradual easing of protective measures, cross-border trade in goods will now increase again. An increase in

smuggling activities can also be expected, which is why the FCA will continue to carry out targeted risk-based checks. FCA measures include:

- Proven measures maintained and extended
- Accelerated border crossing for goods
- Simplified procedures
- Digitalisation (DaziT)

UNITED KINGDOM

UK to enable importers to defer customs duty and import VAT payment due to COVID-19

UK HM Revenue & Customs ("**HMRC**") has issued a communication stating that it is willing to consider extending payment deadlines on a case-by-case basis, for importers facing severe financial difficulties as a direct result of COVID-19.

Businesses holding a duty deferment account may request an extension of the payment deadline for deferred customs duty and import VAT, without needing to call on a guarantee, increasing their guarantee limit, or risking their deferment account being suspended. No interest will be charged on an agreed extension. Duty deferment accounts may be suspended if the business defaults on a payment due during the extended period, and interest will be due on any payments that miss the agreed date.

Registered importers not holding a duty deferment account may request an extension to the payment deadline on a case-by-case basis, at the time when payment is due (which in most cases will be the time when goods are imported into the UK). The importer will need to explain how the pandemic has impacted its business finances. HMRC has discretion to refuse a request, and may impose conditions (including specific time limits, and/or for the importer to obtain a guarantee for the duration of the extension).

The approaches set out above are at HMRC's discretion and will not be granted automatically. However, for businesses experiencing cashflow issues as a result of COVID-19, they may prove to be useful tools for ensuring that goods can continue to be imported into the UK in the immediate term.

Freeports consultation extended

The consultation laying out the government's vision for UK Freeports was published on 10 February, and was intended to close on 20 April. HM Treasury are grateful for the responses it has already received.

The government recognises that key sectors with an interest in this policy, including ports, businesses, and local government, are presently facing disruption as a result of Covid-19. Therefore, the Freeports consultation will be extended to close on 13 July. Responses can be submitted through the existing [gov.uk portal](#) until this date.

HM Treasury will consider a further extension if it feels stakeholders have not had adequate opportunity to fully engage with the consultation before 13 July.

The government is working to boost economic activity across the UK, ensuring that towns, cities and regions across the country can begin to benefit from the opportunities of leaving the EU. As part of this work, the government aims to create up to 10 freeports in locations across the UK. Freeports have different customs rules than the rest of the country. They are innovative hubs, boost global trade, attract inward investment and increase productivity. In doing so, the government wants freeports to generate employment opportunities to the benefit of some of our most deprived communities around the UK.

It was last updated 1 May 2020. The table lists the tariff codes, a description, rationale (GRIs) for the decision.

ALGERIA

COVID-19 measures as of 15 April 2020

Algeria implemented a series of measures to support businesses during the COVID-19 outbreak. However, these measures remain timid, due in particular to budgetary constraints linked to the fall of oil and gas prices. [Click here to read more in our Francophone Africa Legal Alert.](#)

Customs measures adopted because of COVID-19

The Bank of Algeria eased the requirements for the communication of bank and customs documents for import transactions due to disruption of courier services. As of 19 March 2020, documents may be transmitted electronically.

Algerian customs have introduced exceptional measures aimed at facilitating and accelerating the import of goods, and their removal upon arrival, subject to an undertaking to finalize the customs formalities later. These exceptional measures relate to: [health products, medical equipment](#) and all [products directly related to the national policy](#) against the spread of the virus, as well as basic and widely-consumed food products in order to meet the needs of the population. These goods will follow the so-called accelerated “green circuit”.

The [following products](#) may no longer be exported until the end of the Covid-19 epidemic in order to guarantee domestic supply: Semolina, flours, pulses and rice, pasta, oils, sugar, coffee, mineral water, tomato concentrate, food preparations, milk in all its forms including those intended for children, fresh vegetables and fruit with the exception of dates, red and white meat, medical and paramedical equipment, medicines and pharmaceutical products, personal hygiene products and household detergents.

Customs adopts a binding tariff information request procedure

As part of the continuation of the efforts made by the General Directorate of Customs (Direction Générale des Douanes) in terms of trade facilitation, through the support of economic operators in their import and export operations, a new procedure for requesting information on tariff classification of their goods before customs declaration was adopted. The procedure is called, “[Renseignement Tarifaire Contraignant](#)” (RTC) or Binding Tariff Information in English. The new procedure was effective on March 1, 2020.

In addition to obtaining a Binding Tariff Information in advance, a collection of classification decisions issued by the customs administration in 2019 ([recueil des décisions de classement tarifaire Année:2019](#)) is available for downloading.

New export controls regulations in South Africa in light of Covid-19

In light of the operation of a 21 day national lockdown and the President's declaration of a state of national disaster, the Department of Trade and Industry introduced new export control measures on Friday, 27 March 2020. These measures came into operation with effect from 27 March 2020 and shall remain in operation until further notice.

Export applications to the International Trade Administration Commission (ITAC)

Section 6 of the International Trade Administration Act, 71 of 2002, empowers the Minister of Trade and Industry to prescribe goods that may only be exported under the authority of and in accordance with the conditions stated in a permit by ITAC. In terms of the [COVID-19 Export Control Regulation](#) (COVID-19 Regulation), goods listed in Schedule 4 shall not be exported from the Republic of South Africa except by virtue of an export permit issued by ITAC.

In addition, ITAC may no longer determine applications for export permits without first receiving a recommendation from the Department of Trade Industry and Competition (DTIC), as well as any other department (the Line Department). If ITAC receives no recommendation from the DTIC and/ or the Line Department within a period of ten (10) working days or such an extended period as requested, it will be deemed that there is no objection to the issuing of an export permit.

Schedule 4 Goods

The following goods are subject to export control: alcohol-based hand sanitizers; face-masks; gas masks; other breathing appliances; hydroxychloroquine; antisera and other blood fractions; vaccines for human medicine; and medicaments.

The following goods are excluded from export control: protective masks having neither mechanical parts nor replaceable filters.

The export control measures apply irrespective of the quantity of goods intended for exportation. We will continue to monitor any additional restrictions and/ or requirements on medicines and medical supplies, and will provide further updates accordingly.
