## WORLD TRADE ORGANIZATION (WTO)

## Negotiations on an investment facilitation agreement show high level of engagement

On 9 October 2020, the WTO <u>announced</u> the second round of formal negotiations for a <u>multilateral agreement on investment facilitation for development</u>, held on 8-9 October 2020, showed a high level of engagement by participating members who found significant common ground to advance in line with the agreed agenda. Participating members — currently 105 — engaged in a constructive discussion with a view to achieving a concrete outcome by the 12th WTO Ministerial Conference (MC12) scheduled for next year.

## UK to join government procurement pact in its own right in the new year

The WTO <u>announced</u> that at a meeting of the Committee on Government Procurement on 7 October, parties to the Government Procurement Agreement (GPA) invited the United Kingdom to complete the remaining steps to join the Agreement in its own right following its departure from the European Union. They also applauded Brazil for submitting the first documentation required to start negotiations to join the Agreement.

At the meeting, GPA parties adopted a decision granting the UK the right to submit its GPA instrument of accession to the Committee in 2021. This is the final step required for the UK to join the GPA in its own right. As a former EU member, the UK still remains covered by the GPA under the transition period agreed between the UK and the EU. This transition period ends on 31 December 2020. The decision will allow the UK to accede to the GPA as soon as the UK's transition period with the EU expires.

## WTO arbitration in Boeing rules EU may request DSB authorization to assess countermeasures against US up to USD 3.99 Bn.

On 13 October 2020, a WTO <u>arbitrator issued its decision</u> on the level of countermeasures the European Union may request with respect to 16-year old dispute with the United States involving subsidies to Boeing in "*United States* — *Measures Affecting Trade in Large Civil Aircraft* — *Second Complaint*" (DS353). The United States had previously won a parallel case involving European subsidies to Airbus and assessed tariffs worth approximately USD 7.4 Bn. In the current case, the arbitrator decided that the European Union may request authorization from the DSB to take countermeasures with respect to the United States at a level not exceeding, in total, USD 3,993,212,564 annually. These countermeasures may take the forms enumerated below:

- suspension of tariff concessions and other related obligations under the GATT 1994 on a list of US products to be established in due course;
- suspension of concessions and other obligations under the SCM Agreement; and
- under the GATS, suspension of horizontal or sectoral commitments contained in the consolidated EU Schedule of Specific Commitments, as supplemented to incorporate the individual Schedules of Specific Commitments of its Member States, with regard to all principal sectors identified in the Services Sectoral Classification List.

The EU published an 11 page preliminary list of goods that would be subject to retaliatory tariffs last year, that included video game consoles, tractors, handbags, luggage, tobacco, wine, cheese. It is not clear when the final list will be issued. Both parties to the disputes have indicated a willingness to negotiate a resolution to both cases.

### **TBT** Notifications

Member countries of the WTO are required under the *Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade* (TBT Agreement) to report to the WTO all proposed technical regulations that could affect trade with other Member countries. ## WORLD CUSTOMS ORGANIZATION (WCO)

## CBP publishes dates and draft agenda of the 66<sup>th</sup> session of the WCO Harmonized System Committee

US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published the dates and draft agenda for the 66th session of the WCO Harmonized System Committee (HSC) in the <u>October 7, 2020, *Customs Bulletin and Decisions*</u>. The HSC's responsibilities include issuing classification decisions on the interpretation of the Harmonized System. Those decisions may take the form of published tariff classification opinions concerning the classification of an article under the Harmonized System or amendments to the Explanatory Notes to the Harmonized System. The HSC also considers amendments to the legal text of the Harmonized System. The HSC meets twice a year in Brussels, Belgium. The 66<sup>th</sup> session of the HSC commenced Monday, September 28, 2020.

In accordance with section 1210 of the *Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act* of 1988 (Pub. L. 100–418), the Department of Homeland Security, represented by CBP, the Department of Commerce, represented by the Census Bureau, and the US International Trade Commission (ITC), jointly represent the US The CBP representative serves as the head of the delegation at the sessions of the HSC. Set forth in the October 7 *Customs Bulletin and Decisions* is the draft agenda for the next session of the HSC. Copies of available agenda item documents may be obtained from either CBP or the ITC. Comments on agenda items may be directed to the above-listed individuals.

## WCO list of temporary import and export measures related to COVID-19

The WCO has created a special <u>Web Page</u> dedicated to Coronavirus import and export measures where it will share advice, tools and best practices not only to Customs but also to the public. In addition, it has developed lists of national legislation of countries that adopted temporary import support (lowering or waiving of direct and indirect duties and taxes) and export restrictions on certain categories of critical medical supplies in response to COVID-19. The lists are not exhaustive and are regularly updated by the WCO based on the official information provided by countries.

## MULTILATERAL TRADE AGREEMENTS

### Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP)

In 2012, the member states of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) together with Australia, China, India, Japan, South Korea, and New Zealand issued a joint declaration to begin the negotiation of the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) agreement. However, in November 2019, India pulled out of the negotiation. In the same month, the remaining parties concluded the negotiations for all 20 chapters of the RCEP. The remaining parties still encouraged India to rejoin but as the process of finalizing the text of the RCEP is underway, the members intend to sign the RCEP at the ASEAN summit in November 2020 with or without India.

### What is RCEP?

RCEP is an economic partnership agreement between 16 countries (or 15 countries without India) developed from the concept of ASEAN+3/ASEAN+6. The purpose of the RCEP is to establish new trade and investment opportunities, which will help promote development in economies of member countries, thus significantly boosting economic growth. It is expected that the RCEP will increase trade and investment volume, will eliminate trade barriers, and will result in more coordinated regulations relating to trade to help facilitate business and reduce operation costs.

### What is the scope of RCEP?

RCEP is a mutually beneficial agreement which consists of 20 chapters covering:

- 1. Initial provisions and general definition;
- 2. Trade in goods;
- 3. Rules of Origin;
- 4. Customs procedures and trade facilitation;
- 5. Sanitary and phytosanitary measures;
- 6. Standards, technical regulation and conformity assessment procedure;
- 7. Trade remedies;
- Trade in services;
- 9. Temporary movement of natural persons;
- 10. Investment;
- 11. Economic and technical cooperation;
- 12. Small and medium enterprise;
- 13. Intellectual property;
- 14. Electronic commerce;
- 15. Competition;
- 16. Government procurement;
- 17. Institutional provisions;
- 18. General provisions and exceptions;
- 19. Dispute settlement;

20. Final provisions.

#### What are some examples of the benefits business operators will receive?

RCEP (including India) is a large market comprising nearly 3.6 billion people or 48% of the world's population with GDP of USD 28.5 trillion or 32% of the world's GDP. Without India, these figures would still be significant at 2.2 billion people (30% of world's population) with GDP of USD 25.6 trillion (29% of the world's GDP). Although the draft text of the RCEP is not publicly available, the Department of Trade Negotiations (DTN) has provided a few examples of how the RCEP will help promote and strengthen the economy of the member countries including:

1. more trade opportunities because of duty exemption on more goods that were not exempted under the existing FTAs including fishery products, tapioca flour, pineapple, foods, electric parts, plastic and chemical products, automobile parts, motorcycle, etc.;

2. increase of supply chain as RCEP origin can be obtained from materials from 15/16 countries, as opposed to 10-11 countries in ASEAN or ASEAN +1;

3. reduction of rules and regulations which may obstruct investment and provision of services in member countries;

4. adjustment of customs procedures to help facilitate trade between member countries;

5. protection of investment by introducing an arbitration mechanism between investors and government;

6. liberalization of investment in the area of agriculture, fishery, forestry, mining, and manufacturing.

### MEXICO

### Mexico modifies Foreign Trade Acuerdo to remove prior exemptions to front-of-package labeling

The US Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) <u>reports</u> that on October 1, 2020 Mexico modified its *Acuerdo on the Foreign Trade Law* to comply with its new *Frontof-Package Labeling law*(FOPL) that also went into effect on October 1. Provisions that previously exempted certain imported goods have been eliminated.

The modifications change 14 Mexican Official Standards (NOM in Spanish) regarding Commercial Information. The purpose of the Acuerdo is to regulate import operations at the points of entry, and to establish compliance standards regarding commercial information so that product labels inform the Mexican consumer about possible health risks and general wellbeing associated with the product.

The Acuerdo entered into force on October 1, 2020, the same day that the first implementation phase of NOM-051—which modifies FOPL standards—began. NOM-051 applies to processed foods and non-alcoholic beverages that contain critical nutrients that can cause a risk of certain health conditions. require shipments of food products previously exempted from labeling to immediately comply with the new labeling law by removing exemptions for:

- Imported goods that would not be sold to the public in the form in which they were imported.
- Imported goods to be used directly by a company, and that will not be subject to commercialization.
- Products destined to remain in the border area or regions of Mexico.
- Products imported by a corporation or person who carries out marketing activities and provides restaurant, hotel, leisure, cultural, recreational, sports, educational services, research, medical and social assistance

All products within those categories—including foodservice products—must now comply with the new labeling standard.

### Compliance

The FAS recommends that exporters work closely with their importers, distributers, and customs agents to determine what products will be impacted by this change and how to comply with the most current regulations. In addition, FAS recommends referencing the <u>Servicio Nacional de Informacion Comercio Exterior</u> (<u>SNICE</u>) website, which provides information on the labeling regulation, to which products it applies, and how companies can comply.

The options for Mexican importers to comply are:

- A certificate called *constancia*—a document that is issued to producers, manufacturers, importers, traders or service providers as a result of the evaluation of conformity to a label—w hich is proof of compliance, noncompliance, or that the product is not subject to compliance with the requirements established in the standard NOM-051.
- NOM compliance at a Fiscal General Warehouse where a verification unit approved by the Ministry of Economy may determine the compliance of the labels of processed foods and non-alcoholic beverages subject to the FOP labeling.
- NOM compliance at the importer's warehouse where a verification unit approved by the Ministry of Economy may determine the compliance of the labels of processed foods and non-alcoholic beverages subject to the FOP labeling.

### President issues Proclamation to modify GSP benefits

On October 30, 2020, the President issued a <u>Proclamation to Modify Duty-Free</u> <u>Treatment Under the Generalized System of Preferences and for Other Purposes</u> (published in the *Federal Register on Nov. 5, 2020*). The Proclamation:

- suspends the duty-free treatment accorded under the GSP to certain eligible articles that are the product of Thailand, effective on December 30, 2020, and modifies general note 4(d) of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTS)to reflect that suspension;
- modifies the Rates of Duty 1-Special subcolumn for the corresponding HTS subheadings and general note 4(d) to the HTS in order to provide that one or more countries are no longer be treated as beneficiary developing countries with respect to one or more eligible articles for purposes of the GSP, as set forth in sections A, B, and C of Annex II to the proclamation;
- modifies the Rates of Duty 1-Special subcolumn for the corresponding HTS subheading In order to withdraw the application of duty-free treatment accorded to one eligible article as set forth in section D of Annex II to the proclamation;

- modifies the Rates of Duty 1-Special subcolumn for the corresponding HTS subheading in order to designate a certain article as an eligible article when imported from a beneficiary developing country for purposes of the GSP as set forth in section E of Annex II to the proclamation;
- disregards the competitive need limitation provided in section 503(c)(2)(A)(i)(II) of the Trade Act of 1974 with respect to the eligible articles in the HTS subheadings and to the beneficiary developing countries set forth in Annex III to the proclamation; and
- modifies additional US note 6 to Chapter 20 to reflect the change of name from "Macedonia" to "North Macedonia.

The modifications to the HTS set forth in Annex II and Annex III of the proclamation shall be effective with respect to articles entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on November 1, 2020. The Annexes were not attached to the Proclamation as made available by the White House, but will appear when the Proclamation is published in the *Federal Register*.

### President signs CBERA/CBTPA – retroactive benefits included

On October 10, 2020, the President signed into law H.R. 991 the "*Extension of the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act,*" which provides preferential duty treatment of some apparel items imported from certain Caribbean countries. The Act extends the CBERA for 10 years, and is retroactive to September 30, when the underlying legislation expired. In a press release background section, the US Trade Representative (USTR) said that CBERA was launched in 1983 to facilitate economic development and promote economic diversification in the Caribbean region by providing duty-free access to the US market for certain goods from Caribbean beneficiary countries.

In 2000, the *Caribbean Basin Trade Partnership Act* (CBTPA) expanded this access to additional goods not covered under CBERA including apparel, petroleum products, and some agricultural products. The legislation signed by President Trump extends the CBTPA provisions of CBERA through September 30, 2030. The USTR said "CBTPA is unique among U.S. trade preference programs in that it requires the use of US-manufactured yarns or fabrics in finished apparel goods eligible for trade benefits, supporting many jobs in the US textile sector. The eligibility criteria under CBERA and CBTPA require that beneficiary countries meet certain requirements including 1) providing equitable and reasonable access to the markets and basic commodity resources of the country, 2) protection of intellectual property rights, and 3) taking steps to afford internationally recognized worker rights to their workers. CBTPA beneficiary countries are Barbados, Belize, Curacao, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, St. Lucia, and Trinidad and Tobago."

### USTR sets effective date for US-Colombia TPA HTSUS changes

On October 29, 2020, the Office of the US Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> announcing the effective date of modifications to the *Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States* (HTSUS) concerning the *United States-Colombia Trade Promotion Agreement* (USCTPA) contained in Proclamation 10053 of June 29, 2020, will be January 1, 2021, with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after that date. The modifications are set out in Annex V of the USITC's Publication 5060, incorporated by reference in Proclamation 10053.

## USTR directs CBP to continue to block future timber imports from a Peruvian exporter

On October 19, 2020, the Office of the US Trade Representative (USTR) <u>an-nounced</u> that the USTR had directed US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) to continue to block future timber imports from Inversiones La Oroza SRL (Oroza), a Peruvian exporter, based on illegally harvested timber found in its supply chain. The current CBP denial of entry order against Oroza was set to expire this month. This marks the third time that the Trump Administration has taken such an enforcement action under the *United States-Peru Trade Promotion Agreement*'s (PTPA) <u>Annex on Forest Sector Governance</u> (Forest Annex).

### US, Brazil update agreement on trade and economic cooperation

On October 19, 2020, the Office of the US Trade Representative (USTR)<u>announced</u> that the United States and Brazil signed a <u>new Protocol</u> relating to Trade Rules and Transparency. This Protocol updates the 2011 Agreement on Trade and Economic Cooperation (ATEC) with three new annexes comprising state-of-the-art provisions on Customs Administration and Trade Facilitation, Good Regulatory Practices, and Anticorruption.

### USTR seeks applicants for Binational Panels Roster under USMCA

On October 19, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* an <u>invitation for applicants</u> [Docket Number USTR-2020-0039] for a roster of individuals to serve on binational panels convened to review final determinations in antidumping or countervailing duty (AD/CVD) proceedings and amendments to AD/CVD statutes of a USMCA Party. The United States annually renews its selections for the roster. The Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) invites applications from eligible individuals wishing to be included on the roster for the period April 1, 2021, through March 31, 2022. USTR must receive applications by November 16, 2020.

## Delaying submission of the Small Business Report under the Trade Facilitation and Trade Enforcement Act of 2015

On October 19, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> advising the public that, pursuant to delegated authority, the USTR is requiring the Chief Counsel for Advocacy of the Small Business Administration (SBA Advocacy) to delay submission of the report to Congress on the economic impacts on small businesses of the United States-Kenya trade agreement until negotiations conclude. The *Trade Facilitation and Trade Enforcement Act of 2015* (TFTEA) (Public Law 114–125) requires SBA Advocacy to submit to Congress a report on the economic impacts of a covered trade agreement on small businesses not more than 180 days after convening an Interagency Working Group for the relevant trade agreement. *See* 15 U.S.C. 634c(b)(3)(A). The TFTEA authorizes the President to require SBA Advocacy to delay the submission of this report until after the relevant negotiation concludes so that the negotiations are not disrupted.

The notice is applicable on October 13, 2020.

### USTR makes technical corrections to the HTSUS

On October 5, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>technical correction to the HTSUS</u> <u>modifications</u> that were made in the Annexes to Proclamation 10053 of June 29, 2020 (85 FR 39821), which implemented the *U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement* (USMCA or Agreement). These corrections are contained in an Annex to the document and are retroactive to July 1, 2020:

#### Annex

Effective with respect to goods of USMCA countries entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01am Eastern Daylight Time on July 1, 2020, subchapter XXIII of chapter 98 of the HTS is modified:

(1) by inserting "9823.52.04" in the "Heading/Subheading" column for the article description, "Cotton or man-made fiber fabrics and made up goods as provided in note 11(a)(ii)", and by redesignating subheading 9823.52.04, with the article description "Goods provided for in note 11(a)(ii)(A)", as 9823.52.05;

(2) by redesignating subheading 9823.52.05 as 9823.52.06;

(3) by redesignating subheading 9823.52.06 as 9823.52.07;

(4) by redesignating subheading 9823.52.07 as 9823.52.08; and

(5) by redesignating subheading 9823.52.03, with the article description "Cotton or manmade fiber fabrics and made-up goods as provided for in note 11(b)(ii)", as 9823.53.03.

## USTR seeks comments for 2020 Review of Notorious Markets for Counterfeiting and Piracy

On October 1, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>request for comments</u> [Docket No.USTR-2020-0035] that identify online and physical markets to be considered for inclusion in the *2020 Review of Notorious Markets for Counterfeiting and Piracy* (Notorious Markets List). The Notorious Markets List identifies examples of online and physical markets that reportedly engage in and facilitate substantial copyright piracy or trademark counterfeiting. The issue focus for the 2020 Notorious Markets List will examine the use of e-commerce platforms and other third-party intermediaries to facilitate the importation of counterfeit and pirated goods into the United States.

### President modifies Sec. 232 action on aluminum imports from Canada

On October 27, 2020 President Trump issued <u>Proclamation 10106 of October 27, 2020 Adjusting Imports of Aluminum Into the United States</u> (published in the *Federal Register* on October 30, 2020), which modifies the terms of Proclamations 9704, 9893 and 10060 with respect to imports of non-alloyed unwrought aluminum products from Canada. In the Proclamation the President states that,

as a result of talks with the Canadian government, imports of aluminum from Canada will no longer threaten to impair the national security, and thus I have decided to reinstate Canada's exclusion from the tariff on these articles proclaimed in Proclamation 9704, as amended. As specified in this proclamation, I may re-impose the tariff proclaimed in Proclamation 9704 on imports of non-alloyed unw rought aluminum from Canada in the event that the volume of imports of these articles from Canada in the remaining months of 2020 exceeds the quantities that the United States expects will be exported from Canada to the United States during this period. The United States and Canada expect to hold further consultations in December 2020 to discuss the state of aluminum trade betw een the tw o countries in light of trade patterns in the last 4 months of 2020 and expected market conditions in 2021

The Proclamation takes the following actions:

- modifies subchapter III of chapter 99 of the HTSUS in order to establish the removal of the additional duty rate on imports of non-alloyed unw rought aluminum from Canada;
- requires the Secretary of Commerce in consultation with the USTR to monitor imports;
- indicates that re-imposition of tariffs may be considered and possibly with retroactive application, if agreed upon quantities are exceeded;
- lifts the tariffs on non-alloyed unw rought aluminum with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 1, 2020, and shall continue in effect, unless such actions are expressly reduced, modified, or terminated;

- requires imports of non-alloyed unw rought aluminum articles from Canada provided for in subheading 7601.10, except any articles that are eligible for admission under "domestic status" as defined in 19 CFR 146.43, that are admitted into a United States foreign trade zone on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 1, 2020, to continue to be admitted only as "privileged foreign status" as defined in 19 CFR 146.41, and not be subject upon entry for consumption on or after such time and date to the duty treatment provided for in heading 9903.85.21, unless and until heading 9903.85.21 becomes applicable to these articles;
- requires imports of non-alloyed unw rought aluminum articles from Canada provided for in subheading 7601.10, admitted into a United States foreign trade zone <u>before</u> 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 1, 2020, under "privileged foreign status" as defined in 19 CFR 146.41, shall remain subject upon entry for consumption on or after such time and date to the additional 10 percent ad valorem rate of duty imposed by Proclamation 9704, as amended;
- prohibits draw back if tariffs are re-imposed.

## CIT issues TRO restoring exemption for bifacial solar panels; USITC adds the exemption to the HTS for

On October 24, 2020, the US Court of International Trade (CIT) issued a temporary restraining order (TRO), which prevents the US government from making "any modification to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States that includes or reflects Proclamation 10101 ... insofar as it relates to bifacial solar panels or bifacial panels." The TRO specifically says CBP is "temporarily restrained from enforcing or making effective Proclamation 10101 insofar as it relates to bifacial solar panels or bifacial panels or any modifications to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States reflecting or including Proclamation 10101 insofar as it relates to bifacial solar panels or bifacial panels." On October 26, CBP issued <u>CSMS #44553480 - GUIDANCE: Modification of Section 201 Action on Solar Cells and Panels: Adjustment of Duty Rate for Fourth Year of Safeguard Measure and Revocation of Bifacial Panel Exclusion, which stated that:</u>

The exclusion of bifacial solar panels from Section 201 safeguard tariff is revoked. The modifications are effective for imports, or warehouse withdrawals for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. October 25, 2020.

However, on October 28, CBP issued <u>CSMS #44583265 - UPDATED GUID-</u> <u>ANCE: Temporary Restraining Order Regarding the Modification of Section 201</u> <u>Action on Solar Cells and Panels: Adjustment of Duty Rate for Fourth Year of</u> <u>Safeguard Measure and Revocation of Bifacial Panel Exclusion</u>, which refers to the CIT TRO and states:

Per the TRO, and until further notice, CBP will not enforce the revocation of HTSUS Chapter 99, U.S. note 18 to subchapter III, subdivision (c)(iii)(15) "bifacial solar panels that absorb light and generate electricity on each side of the panel and that consist of only bifacial solar cells that absorb light and generate electricity on each side of the cells."

The US International Trade Commission (USITC) issued <u>Rev. 25 of the HTS</u> which was posted on October 26, 2020, The USITC restored the bifacial solar panel safeguard exemption based on the TRO issued by the CIT, as shown by the Change Record below:

The TRO will only remain in place expire on "the earlier of November 7, 2020, fourteen days from the date of this order, unless renewed, or the date upon which this court rules upon Plaintiffs' Motion to Modify Preliminary Injunction;" issued by the CIT in December 2019. ## President issues Proclamation increasing safeguard tariff on solar cells

On October 10, 2020, President Trump issued a <u>Proclamation</u> (published in the *Federal Register* on October 16, 2020) increasing the safeguard tariff on Crystalline Silicon Photovoltaic (CSPV) Cells. The Proclamation adjusts the duty rate of the safeguard tariff for the fourth year of the safeguard measure to 18 percent to account for the exclusion of bifacial panels from application of the safeguard tariffs, which the President said has impaired the effectiveness of the 4-year action. The proclamation eliminates the exemption for bifacial panels [currently subject to a Court injunction] and modifies the action applicable to imports of CSPV cells under HTS subheading 8541.40.6025 and other CSPV products such as modules under HTS.

The modifications to the HTS made by the proclamation are effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time 15 days after the date of the proclamation, and continue in effect as provided in the Annex to the proclamation, unless such actions are earlier expressly reduced, modified, or terminated. One year from the termination of the safeguard measure established in the proclamation, the US note and tariff provisions established in the Annex to the proclamation will be deleted from the HTS.

## BIS publishes procedures to grant relief from quotas applicable to certain steel from Brazil

On October 13, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS), Department of Commerce, published in the *Federal Register* a <u>temporary final rule</u> [Docket No. 201006-0266] that establishes procedures to grant relief from the quantitative limitation applicable to certain steel articles for Brazil for parties with preexisting contracts that meet specified criteria as authorized by the President as part of the action he took to adjust imports under Section 232 of the *Trade Expansion Act of 1962*, as amended ("section 232") The temporary final rule is effective October 13, through December 31, 2020. All certifications for relief from the quantitative limitation for Brazil for steel articles on this temporary final rule must be submitted through the email: <u>steel232-exp@bis.doc.gov</u>.

President Trump in Proclamation 10064 determined to direct the Secretary to provide relief from the modified quantitative limitations in certain limited circumstances specified in more detail in the temporary rule.

In Supplement No. 1 to Part 705: The temporary final rule adds new paragraph (j) to describe the requirements to request relief from the quantitative limitations applicable to steel article imports from Brazil under the new process created by clause 2 of Proclamation 10064. Paragraph (j) describes the requirements for a party to obtain this relief, how the Department reviews these requests for relief, the administration and use of granted requests of relief, and when revocation of grants of relief may occur. These procedures are all contained in paragraph (j), which unless extended on or before December 31, 2020, will be removed from the regulations on January 1, 2021. This process of requesting grants for relief

from the quantitative limitations for Brazil is a separate process from the 232 exclusions process described elsewhere in supplement no. 1 to part 705.

New paragraph (j) consists of five paragraphs:

- (j)(1) (Sworn statement required to grant relief);
- (j)(2) (Where to submit requests for grants of relief?);
- (j)(3) (Disposition of requests for grants of relief);
- (j)(4) (Administration and use of granted requests of relief); and
- (j)(5) (Revocation of grants of relief).

Details for each paragraph are provided in the temporary rule.

### USTR initiates Vietnam Section 301 investigation

On October 2, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) <u>announced</u> that at the direction of President Trump, it is initiating an investigation addressing two significant issues with respect to Vietnam. USTR will investigate Vietnam's acts, policies, and practices related to the import and use of timber that is illegally harvested or traded, and will investigate Vietnam's acts, policies, and practices that may contribute to the undervaluation of its currency and the resultant harm caused to US commerce. USTR will conduct the investigation under Section 301 of the *1974 Trade Act*.

USTR posted two advance copies of *Federal Register* notices to be published on October 8, 2020, which request comments via <u>www.Regulations.gov</u> by November 12, 2020. When submitting comments, use the docket number and insure that your comments go the correct notice.

#### Import and use of timber that is illegally harvested or traded

The <u>first notice</u> [Docket No. USTR-2020-0036] relates to the initiation of an investigation regarding Vietnam's acts, policies, and practices related to the import and use of timber that is illegally harvested or traded. The notice states:

Vietnam is one of the world's largest exporters of wood products, including to the United States. In 2019, Vietnam exported to the United States more than \$3.7 billion of wooden furniture. To supply the timber inputs needed for its wood products manufacturing sector, Vietnam relies on imports of timber harvested in other countries. Available evidence suggests that a significant portion of that imported timber was illegally harvested or traded (illegal timber). Some of that timber may be from species listed under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES).

Evidence indicates that much of the timber imported by Vietnam was harvested against the laws of the source country. Reports indicate that a significant amount of the timber exported from Cambodia to Vietnam was harvested on protected lands, such as wildlife sanctuaries, or outside of and therefore in violation of legal timber concessions. Cambodia nevertheless remains a significant source of Vietnam's timber imports. Similarly, timber sourced from other countries, such as Cameroon and the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), may have been harvested against those countries' laws.

In addition, Vietnamese timber imports may be traded illegally. For example, it appears that most timber exported from Cambodia to Vietnam crosses the border in violation of Cambodia's log export ban. In addition, aspects of the importation and processing of this timber also may violate Vietnam's domestic law and be inconsistent with CITES

### Currency valuation

The <u>second notice</u> [Docket No. USTR-2020-0037] relates to the initiation of an investigation regarding Vietnam's acts, policies, and practices related to the valuation of its currency. USTR will consult with the Department of the Treasury as to matters of currency valuation and Vietnam's exchange rate policy According to the notice:

The Government of Vietnam (GOV), through the State Bank of Vietnam (SBV), tightly manages the value of its currency – the dong. The SBV's management of Vietnam's currency is closely tied to the US dollar. Available analysis indicates that Vietnam's currency has been undervalued over the past three years. Specifically, analysis indicates that the dong was undervalued on a real effective basis by approximately 7 percent in 2017 and by approximately 8.4 percent in 2018. Furthermore, analysis indicates that the dong's real effective exchange rate was undervalued in 2019 as well.

Available evidence also indicates that the GOV, through the SBV, actively intervened in the exchange market, which contributed to the dong's undervaluation in 2019. Specifically, the evidence indicates that in 2019, the SBV undertook net purchases of foreign exchange totaling approximately \$22 billion, which had the effect of undervaluing the dong's exchange rate with the US dollar during that year. Analysis suggests that Vietnam's action on the exchange rate in 2019 caused the average nominal bilateral exchange rate against the dollar over the year, 23,224 dong per dollar, to be undervalued by approximately 1,090 dong per dollar relative to the level consistent the equilibrium real effective exchange rate.

The investigations will determine whether an act, policy, or practice of the GOV is actionable under section 301 of the Trade Act. Actionable matters under section 301 include acts, policies, and practices of a foreign country that are unreasonable or discriminatory and burden or restrict US commerce. An act, policy, or practice is unreasonable if, while not necessarily in violation of, or inconsistent with, the international legal rights of the United States, it is otherwise unfair and inequitable. In conducting its investigation, USTR will consult with the Department of the Treasury as to matters of currency valuation and Vietnam's exchange rate policy. See the individual notices for instructions on the submission of information containing confidential business information.

In light of the uncertainties arising from COVID-19 restrictions, USTR is not at this time scheduling public hearings in these investigation. USTR will provide further information in a subsequent notice if it will hold a hearing in either investigation.

# USTR publishes technical amendments to Sec. 301 exclusions and exclusion extensions for certain Chinese products in Tranches 3 and 4A

On October 7, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> that announces USTR's determination to make one technical amendment to a previously announced exclusion to a Tranche 3 (\$200 Bn.) product. Product exclusions for tranche 3 apply from September 24, 2018 to August 7, 2020. The amendment announced in this notice is retroactive to the date the original exclusion was published and does not further extend the period for the original exclusion.

The Annex makes one technical amendment to US note 20(w)(27) to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the HTSUS, as set out in the Annex of the notice published at 84 FR 49591 (September 20, 2019).

### ANNEX

Effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from w arehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 24, 2018, U.S. note 20(w)(27) to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS), is modified by deleting "heading 8471 not incorporating goods of headings 8541 or 8542" and inserting "heading 8471, whether or not incorporating fan hubs or LEDs but not incorporating other goods of headings 8541 or 8542" in lieu thereof.

On October 7, 2020, USTR also published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> that announces USTR's determination to make two technical amendments to previously extended exclusions in Tranche 3 (\$200 Bn.). The amendments announced in this notice apply as of August 7, 2020, and continue through December 31, 2020. This notice does not further extend the period for product exclusion extensions.

Paragraph A of the Annex makes technical amendments to US note 20(iii)(57) and US note (iii)(159) to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the HTSUS, as set out in the Annex of the notice published at 85 FR 48600 (August 11, 2020).

A. Effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on August 7, 2020, subchapter III of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) is modified:

US note 20(iii)(57) to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, is modified by deleting "Mixtures containing 2- (dimethylamino)ethanol (CAS No. 108-01-0)" and inserting "Mixtures containing N,Ndimethyldodecan-1-amine (CAS No. 112–18–5) and N,N-dimethyltetradecan1-amine (CAS No. 112–75–4)" in lieu thereof.

2. US note 20(iii)(159) to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, is modified by deleting "heading 8471 not incorporating goods of headings 8541 or 8542" and inserting "heading 8471, whether or not incorporating fan hubs or LEDs but not incorporating other goods of headings 8541 or 8542" in lieu thereof.

Additionally, on October 7, 2020, USTR published in the *Federal Register* a <u>no-tice</u> that announces USTR's determination to make one technical amendment to a previously granted exclusion to a Tranche 4A (\$300 Bn.) product The amendment announced in the notice applies as of September 1, 2019, the effective date of List 1 of the \$300 billion action (Tranch 4A). It is retroactive to the date the original exclusion was published and does not further extend the period for the original exclusion.

The Annex to the notice makes one technical amendment to U.S. note 20(ddd)(21) to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the HTSUS, as set out in the Annex of the notice published at 85 FR 41658 (July 10, 2020).

#### ANNEX

Effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 1, 2019, note 20(ddd)(21) to Subchapter III of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS), is modified by deleting "Bright C1060 galvanized round wire, containing by weight 0.6 percent or more of carbon, measuring at least 0.034 mm but not more than 0.044 mm in diameter" and inserting "Bright C1060 round wire, plated or coated with zinc, containing by weight 0.6 percent or more of carbon, with a diameter measuring 0.034 mm or more but less than 1 mm" in lieu thereof. Finally, on October 7, 2020, USTR also published in the *Federal Register* a <u>no-tice</u> that announces USTR's determination to make one technical amendment to a previously extended exclusions in Tranche 4A. The amendment announced in this notice applies as of September 1, 2019, and continues through December 31, 2020. This notice does not further extend the period for product exclusion extensions.

The Annex makes one technical amendment to US note 20(jjj)(53) to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the HTSUS, as set out in the Annex of the notice published at 85 FR 54616 (September 2, 2020).

#### ANNEX

Effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 1, 2019, note 20(jjj)(53) to Subchapter III of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS), is modified by deleting "Bright C1060 galvanized round wire, containing by weight 0.6 percent or more of carbon, measuring at least 0.034 mm but not more than 0.044 mm in diameter" and inserting "Bright C1060 round wire, plated or coated with zinc, containing by weight 0.6 percent or more of carbon, with a diameter measuring 0.034 mm or more but less than 1 mm" in lieu thereof.

USTR stated that US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will issue instructions on entry guidance and implementation for all four of the above notices.

## USTR publishes product exclusion extensions for Tranches 1 and 2 of the China Sec. 301 actions

On October 5, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> that announces the USTR's determination to extend certain exclusions from October 2, 2020, through December 31, 2020 for products from China on Tranche/List 1 (\$34 Bn.).

- Annex A to the notice establishes a new HTSUS heading/subheading 9903.88.60 and new US note 20 (mmm) to cover the nine product extensions and makes conforming amendments,
- Annex B contains a list of the original product exclusions that are being extended, showing the former US note 20(x) number and 9903.88.19 HTSUS heading/subheading and the new US note 20 (mmm) and 9903.88.60 HTSUS heading/subheading.

Also on October 5, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> that announces the USTR's determination to extend certain exclusions from October 2, 2020, through December 31, 2020 for products from China on Tranche/List 2 (\$16 Bn.).

- Annex A to the notice establishes a new HTSUS heading/subheading 9903.88.61 and new US note 20 (nnn) to cover the 28 product extensions and makes conforming amendments,
- Annex B contains a list of the original product exclusions that are being extended, showing the former US note 20(y) number and 9903.88.20 HTSUS heading/subheading and the new US note 20 (nnn) and 9903.88.61 HTSUS heading/subheading.

The exclusions for both lists are available for any product that meets the description in the Annexes, regardless of whether the importer filed an exclusion request. Further, the scope of each exclusion is governed by the scope of the tendigit HTSUS headings and product descriptions in the Annexes to this notice, and not by the product descriptions set out in any particular request for exclusion. USTR states that CBP will issue instructions.

### CBP GUIDANCE ON SECS. 201, 232 AND 301 ACTIONS

### CBP issues update on Sec. 232 imports of Canadian aluminum

On October 29, 2020, CBP issued <u>CSMS #44591106 - UPDATE: Section 232 on</u> <u>Imports of Aluminum Articles from Canada</u>, reproduced below:

#### BACKGROUND

On October 27, 2020 the President issued a Presidential Proclamation on Adjusting Imports of Aluminum into the United States, reinstating Canada's exclusion from additional 10 percent duties under Section 232 on certain non-alloyed unw rought aluminum articles. This Proclamation amends Presidential Proclamation 10060 of August 6, 2020.

As a result, effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from w arehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 1, 2020, HTS number 9903.85.21 is no longer required for imports of non-alloyed unw rought aluminum articles that are the product of Canada provided for in HTS subheading 7601.10. Goods entered prior to September 1, 2020, are still subject to additional duties under 9903.85.21. ACE has been updated to reflect these modifications starting October 28, 2020.

#### FOREIGN TRADE ZONE

Any imports of non-alloyed unw rought aluminum articles that are the product of Canada provided for in HTS Subheading 7601.10, except any articles that are eligible for admission under "domestic status" as defined in 19 CFR 146.43, that are admitted into a United States foreign trade zone on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 1, 2020, shall continue to be admitted only as "privileged foreign status" as defined in 19 CFR 146.41, and shall not be subject upon entry for consumption on or after such time and date to the duty treatment provided for in heading 9903.85.21, unless and until heading 9903.85.21 becomes applicable to these articles. Imports of non-alloyed unw rought aluminum articles that are the product of Canada provided for in HTS Subheading 7601.10, admitted into a United States foreign trade zone before 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 1, 2020, under "privileged foreign status" as defined in 19 CFR 146.41, shall remain subject upon entry for consumption on or after such time and date to the additional 10 percent ad valorem rate of duty imposed by Proclamation 9704, as amended.

## CBP issues updated guidance on modification of Sec. 201 Action on solar cells and panels

On October 28, CBP issued <u>CSMS #44583265 - UPDATED GUIDANCE: Temporary Restraining Order Regarding the Modification of Section 201 Action on Solar Cells and Panels: Adjustment of Duty Rate for Fourth Year of Safeguard Measure and Revocation of Bifacial Panel Exclusion, which states:</u>

The purpose of this message is to update guidance provided by U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) on October 23, 2020, regarding the modification of the Section 201 Action on Solar Cells and Panels. The U.S. Court of International Trade (CIT) has granted a temporary restraining order (TRO), restraining CBP from enforcing or making effective Presidential Proclamation 10101 insofar as it relates to bifacial solar panels or bifacial panels. In accordance with the TRO, and until further notice, CBP will not enforce the revocation of the exclusion of bifacial solar panels from the Section 201 safeguard measure.

#### BACKGROUND

On January 23, 2018, the President issued Proclamation 9693 to Facilitate Positive Adjustment to Competition from Imports of Certain Crystalline Silicon Photovoltaic Cells (Whether or Not Partially or Fully Assembled Into Other Products) and for Other Purposes, effective February 7, 2018. See <u>83 FR 3541</u>, dated January 25, 2018. Proclamation 9693 imposed a safeguard measure under Section 201 of the Trade Act of 1974 (Trade Act) for a period of four years.

On October 10, 2020, the President issued Proclamation 10101 to Further Facilitate Positive Adjustment to Competition from Imports of Certain Crystalline Silicon Photovoltaic Cells (Whether or Not Partially or Fully Assembled Into Other Products).

#### GUIDANCE

## CBP issues guidance on modification of Sec. 201 Action on solar cells and panels

Prior to issuing <u>CSMS #44583265</u> (see above), on October 26, 2020, CBP issued <u>CSMS #44553480 - GUIDANCE: Modification of Section 201 Action on Solar Cells and Panels: Adjustment of Duty Rate for Fourth Year of Safeguard</u> Measure and Revocation of Bifacial Panel Exclusion, which is reproduced below:

The purpose of this message is to provide guidance on the adjustment of the duty rate of the Section 201 safeguard tariff on solar cells and panels for the fourth year of the safeguard measure from 15 percent to 18 percent, and the revocation of the exclusion of bifacial panels from the safeguard tariff. The duty tariff rate adjustment will become effective for imports, or w arehouse withdraw als, for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. February 7, 2021. The exclusion revocation is effective for imports, or w arehouse withdraw als, for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. October 25, 2020.

#### BACKGROUND

On January 23, 2018, the President issued Proclamation 9693 to Facilitate Positive Adjustment to Competition from Imports of Certain Crystalline Silicon Photovoltaic Cells (Whether or Not Partially or Fully Assembled Into Other Products) and for Other Purposes, effective February 7, 2018. See <u>83 FR 3541</u>. Proclamation 9693 imposed a safeguard measure under Section 201 of the Trade Act of 1974 (Trade Act) for a period of four years.

On October 10, 2020, the President issued Proclamation 10101 to Further Facilitate Positive Adjustment to Competition from Imports of Certain Crystalline Silicon Photovoltaic Cells (Whether or Not Partially or Fully Assembled Into Other Products). See <u>85 FR 65639</u>. The President has determined to make two modifications to the

Section 201 Action with regards to solar cells and panels: (1) The duty rate of the safeguard tariff for solar cells (over quota only) and modules for the fourth year of the safeguard measure is adjusted from 15 percent to 18 percent; and (2) The exclusion of bifacial solar panels from Section 201 safeguard tariff is revoked. The modifications are effective for imports, or w arehouse withdraw als for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. October 25, 2020.

The functionality for the acceptance of the safeguard duty will be available in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) as of 7 am eastern standard time, October 25, 2020.

### GUIDANCE

Per the Annex to <u>85 FR 65639</u>, HTSUS Chapter 99, U.S. note 18 to subchapter III, subdivisions (f) and (h) are modified by adjusting the duty rate for the period February 7, 2021 to February 6, 2022 from 15 percent to 18 percent. Accordingly, as of February 7, 2021, the follow ing duty rates will be:

- HTS 9903.45.22 (solar cells over quota) 18 percent
- HTS 9903.42.25 (solar modules) 18 percent

Additionally, HTSUS Chapter 99, U.S. note 18 to subchapter III is modified by deleting the following from subdivision (c)(iii) "(15) bifacial solar panels that absorb light and generate electricity on each side of the panel and that consist of only bifacial solar cells that absorb light and generate electricity on each side of the cells;" and by redesignating current subdivisions (c)(iii)(16) and (c)(iii)(17) as subdivisions (c)(iii)(15) and (c)(iii)(16), respectively. Bifacial panels entered on or after 12:01 a.m. October 25, 2020 must also be reported under HTS 9903.45.25 for safeguard duty treatment.

## CBP issues guidance on Sec. 301 Tranches 1 and 2 (\$16 Bn.) exclusion extensions for Chinese products

On October 16, 2020, CBP issued <u>CSMS #44451479 - GUIDANCE: Section 301</u> <u>Tranche 1 - \$34B Action Extension of Product Exclusions from China</u>, which is reproduced in pertinent part below:

#### BACKGROUND

On October 5, 2020, the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) published Federal Register (FR) Notice <u>85 FR 62782</u> to extend through December 31, 2020 certain product exclusions previously covered by the October 2, 2019 notice (see <u>84 FR 52567</u>) for Section 301 duties on China (Tranche 1 - \$34B Action).

This product exclusion extension relates to the imposed additional duties on Chinese goods with an annual trade value of approximately \$34 billion. Duty exclusions granted by the USTR for the extension are effective with respect to entries on or after October 2, 2020 and extend through December 31, 2020.

The exclusions listed are available for any product that meets the description as set out in the Annex to <u>85 FR 62782</u>, regardless of whether the importer filed an exclusion request. Further, the scope of each exclusion is governed by the scope of the 10-digit HTSUS headings and product descriptions provided in the Annex to <u>85 FR 62782</u>, not by the product descriptions set out in any particular request for exclusion.

The functionality for the acceptance of the extended product exclusions will be available in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) as of 7 am eastern standard time, October 8, 2020.

#### GUIDANCE

Instructions for importers, brokers, and filers on submitting entries to CBP containing granted exclusions by the USTR from the Section 301 measures are set out below:

- Per <u>85 FR 62782</u>, in addition to reporting the regular Chapters 84, 85, and 90 classifications of the HTSUS for the imported merchandise, importers shall report the HTSUS classification 9903.88.60 (Articles, the product of China, as provided for in U.S. note 20(mmm) to this subchapter, each covered by an exclusion granted by the USTR for imported merchandise subject to the exclusion).
- Importers shall not submit the corresponding Chapter 99 HTS number for the Section 301 duties when HTS 9903.88.60 is submitted.

Also on October 16, 2020, CBP issued <u>CSMS #44450418 - GUIDANCE: Section</u> <u>301 Tranche 2 - \$16B Action Extension of Product Exclusions from China</u>, which provides in pertinent part:

#### BACKGROUND

On October 5, 2020, the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) published Federal Register (FR) Notice <u>85 FR 62786</u> to extend through December 31, 2020 certain product exclusions previously covered by the October 2, 2019 notice (see <u>84 FR 52553</u>) for Section 301 duties on China (Tranche 2 - \$16B Action).

This product exclusion extension relates to the imposed additional duties on Chinese goods with an annual trade value of approximately \$16 billion. Duty exclusions granted by the USTR for the extension are effective with respect to entries on or after October 2, 2020 and extend through December 31, 2020.

The exclusions listed are available for any product that meets the description as set out in the Annex to <u>85 FR 62786</u>, regardless of whether the importer filed an exclusion request. Further, the scope of each exclusion is governed by the scope of the 10-digit HTSUS headings and product descriptions provided in the Annex to <u>85 FR 62786</u>, not by the product descriptions set out in any particular request for exclusion.

The functionality for the acceptance of the extended product exclusions will be available in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) as of 7 am eastern standard time, October 8, 2020.

#### GUIDANCE

Instructions for importers, brokers, and filers on submitting entries to CBP containing granted exclusions by the USTR from the Section 301 measures are set out below:

- Per <u>85 FR 62786</u>, in addition to reporting the regular Chapters 39, 84, 85, 86, and 90 classifications of the HTSUS for the imported merchandise, importers shall report the HTSUS classification 9903.88.61 (Articles, the product of China, as provided for in U.S. note 20(nnn) to this subchapter, each covered by an exclusion granted by the USTR for imported merchandise subject to the exclusion).
- Importers shall not submit the corresponding Chapter 99 HTS number for the Section 301 duties when HTS 9903.88.61 is submitted.

Both CSMS messages have the same "ADDITIONAL INFORMATION" sections and .pdf chart attached:

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Imports which have been granted a product exclusion from the Section 301 measures, and which are not subject to the Section 301 duties, are not covered by the Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) provisions of the Section 301 Federal Register notices, but instead are subject to the FTZ provisions in 19 CFR part 146.

To request a refund of Section 301 duties paid on previous imports of products granted duty exclusions by the USTR, importers may file a Post Summary Correction

(PSC) if within the PSC filing timeframe. If the entry is beyond the PSC filing timeframe, importers may protest the liquidation if within the protest filing timeframe. The latest guidance on the process for submitting retroactive claims for product exclusions to CBP is found in CSMS 42566154.

In situations where an importer has requested a product exclusion and the request is pending with the USTR, importers or their licensed representative may submit a request to extend the liquidation of impacted unliquidated entry summaries to CBP.

Reminder: importers, brokers, and/or filers should refer to CSMS <u>39587858</u> (Entry Summary Order of Reporting for Multiple HTS when 98 or 99 HTS are required) for guidance when filing an entry summary in which a heading or subheading in Chapter 99 is claimed on imported merchandise.

For ease of reference, a summary of Section 301 duties and product exclusion notifications is attached.

### CUSTOMS, IMPORTS AND FOREIGN TRADE ZONES

## DHS/CBP extend land and ferry travel restrictions to/from Mexico and Canada

On October 22, 2020, Office of the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a notification of continuation of temporary travel restrictions at land ports of entry from October 22 until November 21, 2020. For purposes of the temporary alteration in certain designated ports of entry operations authorized under 19 U.S.C. 1318(b)(1)(C) and (b)(2), travel through the land ports of entry and ferry terminals along the United States-Mexico border shall be limited to "essential travel." At this time, this Notification does not apply to air, freight rail, or sea travel between the United States and Mexico, but does apply to passenger rail, passenger ferry travel, and pleasure boat travel between the United States and Mexico.

On the same date, a similar <u>notification</u> was published by DHS/CBP in the *Federal Register* that continues to temporarily limit the travel of individuals from Canada into the United States at land ports of entry and ferries along the United States-Canada border through November 21, 2020.

Given the definition of "essential travel" in each notification, the temporary alteration in land ports of entry operations should not interrupt legitimate trade between the two nations or disrupt critical supply chains that ensure food, fuel, medicine, and other critical materials reach individuals on both sides of the two borders. [See our <u>October Update</u> for the definitions of "essential travel" and other details for both notifications.]

## CBP publishes broker user fee for 2021

On October 28, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>general notice</u> advising customs brokers that the annual user fee that is assessed for each permit held by a broker, whether it may be an individual, partnership, association, or corporation, is due by January 29, 2021. Pursuant to fee adjustments required by the *Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act* (FAST ACT) and CBP regulations (19 CFR 111.96(c)), the annual user fee payable for calendar year 2021 will be \$150.33 for each customs broker district and national permit held by an individual, partnership, association, or corporation. Payment of the 2021 Customs Broker Permit User Fee is due by January 29, 2021.

## CBP publishes ANPR on continuing education for licensed customs brokers

On October 28, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* an <u>advance notice of proposed rulemaking</u> [Docket No. USCBP-2020-0042] that CBP is considering the amendment of its regulations to mandate continuing education for licensed customs brokers in order to maintain a high standard of professionalism in the customs broker industry. CBP's goal

with the publication of the ANPRM is to gather information and data from the broker industry in order to analyze and identify information that would help CBP in considering whether, and if so what type of, mandatory requirements would be beneficial for the trade community and CBP. CBP believes that requiring customs brokers to take continuing education courses would enhance the credibility and value of a customs broker's license and improve a broker's skills, performance, and productivity. CBP also believes that this would increase client service and compliance with the customs laws, which would protect the revenue of the United States and the trade community. . CBP is seeking comments on a potential framework of continuing education requirements for licensed customs brokers in order to assess the current situation among members of the customs broker industry and analyze the potential impact of such a framework on customs brokers. However, mandating continuing education is just one approach to maintaining integrity and professionalism in the broker industry; CBP is open to considering other approaches provided by the public. Comments must be received on or before December 28, 2020.

### CBP issues guidance on claiming retroactive CBTPA benefits

On October 15, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection issued <u>CSMS</u> #44437979 - <u>GUIDANCE: Caribbean Basin Trade Partnership Act (CBPTA) Re-</u> newal with Procedures for Retroactive Duty Refunds, which is reproduced below:

The purpose of this guidance is to inform the Trade of the renew al of the Caribbean Basin Trade Partnership Act (CBTPA) and to provide information on the procedures for requesting a refund of duties paid during the lapse.

### **CBTPA Renewed**

On Saturday, October 10, 2020, the President signed bill H.R. 991, the "Extension of the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act," extending CBTPA for goods entered or withdraw n from w arehouse for consumption from October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2030.

#### **Requesting Duty Refund**

Additionally, this bill allows for the refund of duties paid by the importer on CBTPAeligible goods entered during the lapse period, October 1, 2020 through October 14, 2020.

Importers may file a Post Summary Correction (PSC) requesting a refund of duties paid on goods that were eligible for CBTPA during the lapsed period. The PSC must be filed in a timely manner. If an entry has already liquidated, the refund request may be submitted as a protest. (19 USC 1514, 19 CFR 174).

#### Filing CBTPA Claims

On and after October 15, 2020, the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) will accept CBTPA (special program indicator "R") claims, as well as the following provisional HTS numbers for textile and apparel goods:

#### Post-Importation CBTPA Claims on Importations Prior to Expiration

Importations made on or before September 30, 2020, remain unaffected by the aforementioned instructions. Importers may continue to make post-importation CBTPA claims in accordance with applicable PSC and protest procedures (19 USC 1514, 19 CFR 174). ### CBP publishes quarterly interest rates

On October 9, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* <u>a general notice</u> that advises the public that the quarterly Internal Revenue Service interest rates used to calculate interest on overdue accounts (underpayments) and refunds (overpayments) of customs duties will remain the same from the previous quarter. For the calendar quarter beginning October 1, 2020, the interest rates for overpayments will be 2 percent for corporations and 3 percent for non-corporations, and the interest rate for underpayments will be 3 percent for both corporations and non-corporations.

## CBP imposes import restrictions on certain Chilean archaeological material

On October 9, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection published in the *Federal Register* a <u>final rule</u> [CBP Dec. 20-16] amends the CBP regulations to reflect the imposition of import restrictions on certain archaeological material from the Republic of Chile (Chile). These restrictions are being imposed pursuant to an agreement between the United States and Chile that has been entered into under the authority of the Convention on Cultural Property Implementation Act. The final rule amends the CBP regulations by adding Chile to the list of countries which have a bilateral agreement with the United States that imposes cultural property import restrictions. The final rule also contains the Designated List that describes the types of archaeological material representing Chile's cultural heritage from the Paleoindian CBP Dec. 20-16 period (c. 31,000 B.C.) to the Huri Moai phase in Chile (A.D. 1680- 1868).to which the restrictions apply.

## CBP issues finding that certain Stevia extracts from China are made with convict, forced or indentured labor

On October 20, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>general notice</u> [CBP Dec. 20-17] that the Executive Assistant Commissioner, Office of Trade, of CBP with the approval of the Acting Secretary of Homeland Security, has determined, pursuant to 19 U.S.C. 1307 and 19 CFR 12.42(f) that stevia leaf (*Stevia rebaudiana*) extracts, or glycosides classified under subheading 2938.90.0000, Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS), that are mined, produced or manufactured wholly or in part by the in the People's Republic of China by the Inner Mongolia Hengzheng Group Baoanzhao Agriculture, Industry, and Trade Co., Ltd. (also referred to herein as "Baoanzhao") with the use of convict, forced or indentured labor, are being, or are likely to be, imported into the United States. ### EXPORT CONTROLS AND SANCTIONS

FinCEN proposes threshold for the requirement to collect, retain, and transmit information on funds transfers that begin or end outside the United States

On October 27, 2020, the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System (Board) and the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN) at Treasury, published in the *Federal Register* a joint notice of proposed rulemaking [Docket No. FINCEN-2020-0002] to modify the threshold in the rule implementing the *Bank Secrecy Act* (BSA) requiring financial institutions to collect and retain information on certain funds transfers and transmittals of funds. The proposed modification would reduce this threshold from \$3,000 to \$250 for funds transfers and transmittals of funds transfers and transmittals of not states. FinCEN is likewise proposing to reduce from \$3,000 to \$250 the threshold in the rule requiring financial institutions to transmit to other financial institutions in the payment chain information on funds transfers and transmittals of funds that begin or end outside the United States.

The Agencies are also proposing to clarify the meaning of "money" as used in these same rules to ensure that the rules apply to domestic and cross-border transactions involving convertible virtual currency (CVC), which is a medium of exchange (such as cryptocurrency) that either has an equivalent value as currency, or acts as a substitute for currency, but lacks legal tender status. The Agencies further propose to clarify that these rules apply to domestic and cross-border transactions involving digital assets that have legal tender status. Written comments on this proposed rule may be submitted on or before November 27, 2020.

## Treasury updates list of countries cooperating with an international boycott

On October 13, 2020, the Treasury Department published in the *Federal Register* a <u>current list of countries which require or may require participation in, or cooper-</u><u>ation with, an international boycott</u> (within the meaning of section 999(b)(3) of the *Internal Revenue Code of 1986*).

On the basis of the best information currently available to the Department of the Treasury, the following countries require or may require participation in, or cooperation with, an international boycott: Iraq, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, United Arab Emirates and Yemen.

## BIS amends National Security License Review Policy under the EAR

On October 29, 2020 the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>final rule</u> [Docket No. 201022–0277] that amends the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) to revise the license review policy for items controlled for national security reasons destined to the People's Republic of China (PRC), Venezuela, or the Russian Federation (Russia). ## BIS to provide exporters six-month extensions of licenses as part of pandemic response

On October 16, the Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) announced that exporters can request six-month extensions of export licenses that are set to expire on or before December 31, 2020. According to BIS, this is being done to "cut[] red tape and mak[e] it easier for exporters to drive our Nation's economic recovery in the wake of the pandemic."

Exporters can request the extension by emailing <u>LicenseExtensionRe-</u> <u>quest@bis.doc.gov</u>. The original license will be reviewed and an extension will be granted in most cases. BIS estimates a turn-around period of 2-3 business days for a majority of license extension requests. BIS issued this <u>press re-</u> <u>lease</u> announcing this licensing policy.

## BIS extends comment period for Foundational Technologies until November 9

On October 9, the Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) <u>extended</u> the comment period for the advance notice of proposed rulemaking (ANPRM) on criteria of "foundational technologies." Comments may now be submitted through November 9, 2020; two weeks after the original deadline of October 26. BIS also clarified it will accept confidential business information from commenters. Filers submitting confidential information should clearly identify the confidential portion at the time of the submission and must file a statement "justifying nondisclosure and referring to the specific legal authority claimed." Filers must also submit a public, non-confidential version of their submission. For electronic submissions, pages should be clearly marked as "BUSINESS CONFIDEN-TIAL" on the top of any page containing business confidential information. The corresponding non-confidential version of those comments must be clearly marked "PUBLIC." The file name of the non-confidential version should begin with the character "P."

Comments can be submitted by mail or via the Federal eRulemaking Portal. Our previous blog post on the solicitation of these public comments can be found <u>here</u>.

#### BIS requires export license for water cannon systems

On October 6, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the *Federal Register* a final rule [Docket No. 200921-0252] that amends the *Export Administration Regulations* to impose a license requirement on exports and reexports of water cannon systems for riot or crowd control and parts and components specially designed therefor. This action furthers US foreign policy interests for crime control (CC) reasons and is intended to address the spread of violations of human rights globally by enabling the government to review covered exports and reexports worldwide, except to NATO member countries and certain other military allies. This change will also enable the Government to more effectively control exports of water cannons to the Hong Kong Police Force, consistent with a 2019 Congressional mandate to prohibit the licensing of such transactions. This rule also makes conforming amendments.

## BIS amends licensing policy for items controlled for crime control reasons

On October 6, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the *Federal Register* a final rule [Docket No. 200624-0168] amending the *Export Administration Regulations* (EAR) by revising, in part, the licensing policy for items controlled for crime control (CC) reasons, which is designed to promote respect for human rights throughout the world. BIS also is amending the EAR to provide that, except for items controlled for short supply reasons, it will consider human rights concerns when reviewing license applications for items controlled for reasons other than CC. This revision is necessary to clarify to the exporting community that licensing decisions are based in part upon US Government assessments of whether items may be used to engage in, or enable violations or abuses of, human rights including those involving censorship, surveillance, detention, or excessive use of force.

## BIS issues rule setting forth procedures for classified information to be submitted in court proceedings

On October 6, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the *Federal Register* a final rule [Docket No. 200929-0260] sets forth the procedure for classified national security information to be submitted ex parte and *in camera* to a court reviewing any agency action under the *Export Administration Regulations* (EAR). BIS is taking this action to safeguard national security information by ensuring that access to such information is controlled. BIS is adding to part 756 of the EAR new § 756.3, which is entitled "Judicial Review of Agency Action." Section 4.1(e) of Executive Order (E.O.) 13526 provides that "Persons authorized to disseminate classified information outside the executive branch shall ensure the protection of the information in a manner equivalent to that provided within the executive branch." By providing such information *ex parte* and *in camera* to a reviewing court, BIS can limit access to the information and prevent public disclosure of the information during the course of litigation.

## BIS implements certain new controls on Emerging Technologies agreed at Wassenaar Arrangement 2019 Plenary

On October 5, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>final rule</u> [Docket No. 200807-0209] that revises the Com-

merce Control List (CCL), as well as corresponding parts of the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), to implement certain changes made to the Wassenaar Arrangement List of Dual-Use Goods and Technologies (WA List) maintained and agreed to by governments participating in the Wassenaar Arrangement on Export Controls for Conventional Arms and Dual-Use Goods and Technologies (Wassenaar Arrangement, or WA) at the December 2019 WA Plenary meeting. The Wassenaar Arrangement advocates implementation of effective export controls on strategic items with the objective of improving regional and international security and stability. This final rule implements multilateral controls on six recently developed or developing technologies, which were identified by the WA December 2019 WA Plenary Meeting in a manner contemplated by the Export Control Reform Act of 2018 (ECRA) to identify emerging technologies that are essential to U.S. national security. The rule harmonizes the CCL with the WA December 2019 Plenary Meeting agreements that pertain to these six technologies. The inclusion of the six technologies in this final rule is consistent with the requirements of ECRA and the decision of the WA to add such technologies to its control lists, thereby making exports of such technologies subject to multilateral control. As these six technologies are recently developed or developing technologies that are essential to the national security of the United States, early implementation of the applicable WA December 2019 Plenary agreements is warranted. The remaining WA 2019 Plenary agreements will be implemented in a separate rule.

## OFAC amends Yemen Sanctions Regulations

On October 29, 2020, the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>final rule</u> amending the Yemen Sanctions Regulations (31 CFR Part 552) and reissuing them in their entirety to further implement Executive Order 13611 of May 16, 2012, "Blocking Property of Persons Threatening the Peace, Security, or Stability of Yemen." This final rule replaces the regulations that were published in abbreviated form on November 9, 2012, with a more comprehensive set of regulations that includes additional interpretive and definitional guidance, general licenses, statements of licensing policy, and other regulatory provisions that will provide further guidance to the public. Due to the number of regulatory sections being updated or added, OFAC is reissuing the Yemen Sanctions Regulations in their entirety

## OFAC amends Cuban Assets Control Regulations

On October 27, 2020, the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>final rule</u> that amends the *Cuban Assets Control Regulations* to further implement portions of the President's foreign policy toward Cuba to deny the Cuban government access to funds in connection with remittances to Cuba [Details to be posted on our <u>Sanctions blog</u> shortly].

#### US Government imposes sanctions on the Iranian financial sector under Executive Order 13902 and designates 18 Iranian banks

On October 8, 2020, the US Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) <u>identified</u> the Iranian financial sector as subject to <u>Executive Or-</u> <u>der (EO) 13902</u> and, based on such identification, designated 18 Iranian banks. Our previous blog post on EO 13902 is available <u>here</u>. OFAC also issued a general license and Iran-related Frequently Asked Questions, as further described below.

The action represents a significant escalation of the sanctions targeting Iran's financial sector, yet many humanitarian transactions and activities will continue to be authorized. The primary concern will be for those non-US parties operating wholly outside US jurisdiction where (i) newly sanctioned Iranian financial institutions or the Iranian financial sector are involved, and (ii) the transaction would not be authorized under the *Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations* (ITSR) if engaged in by a US Person.

#### Identification of Iran's Financial Sector and SDN Designations

EO 13902 authorizes the imposition of secondary sanctions against persons operating in Iran's construction, mining, manufacturing, or textiles sectors, or any other sector of the Iranian economy identified by the Secretary of the Treasury, in consultation with the Secretary of State. Following the identification of Iran's financial sector under EO 13902, sanctions may now be imposed on (i) persons operating in Iran's financial sector; (ii) persons who have knowingly engaged in a "significant transaction" for the sale, supply, or transfer to or from Iran of significant goods or services used in connection with Iran's financial sector; and (iii) persons who materially assist, sponsor, or provide financial, material, or technological support for, or goods or services to or in support of, any person designated under EO 13902 for operating in Iran's financial sector. Correspondent account or payable-through account restrictions may also be imposed on foreign financial institutions that have knowingly conducted or facilitated "significant financial transactions" in connection with the Iranian financial sector or persons designated under EO 13902.

Concurrent with the announcement, OFAC designated as Specially Designated Nationals (SDNs) 17 Iranian banks pursuant to EO 13902, for operating in Iran's financial sector or for being owned or controlled by Iranian banks, and one bank under EO 13382, a counter-proliferation authority. A list of the newly designated banks is available <u>here</u>. Following the 45-day wind down period described below, "significant transactions" with these SDNs may result in the imposition of secondary sanctions against non-US persons engaging in the targeted activities.

GLL and FAQs

 <u>General License L</u> "Authorizing Certain Transactions Involving Iranian Financial Institutions Blocked Pursuant to Executive Order 13902" ("GL L") authorizes US Persons to engage in transactions involving Iranian financial institutions designated pursuant to EO 13902 in connection with transactions that are authorized, exempt, or otherwise not prohibited under the ITSR. FAQs <u>842</u>, <u>843</u>, <u>844</u>, <u>845</u>, <u>846</u>, and <u>847</u> (the "Financial Sector FAQs") w ere issued by OFAC to clarify the scope and extent of sanctions and the applicability of GL L.

- US Persons operating under existing ITSR general licenses, specific licenses or exemptions may continue to do so despite the involvement of the new ly designated financial institutions. Humanitarian-related activities, including sales of agricultural commodities, medicine and medical devices, are examples of transactions that may proceed in accordance with the terms of their ITSR authorizations, even if they involve financial institutions designated under EO 13902. In addition, FAQ 843 clarifies that US Persons relying on humanitarian-related ITSR general or specific licenses do not need to seek additional authorization to continue engaging in the same activities.
- For non-US persons, the Financial Sector FAQs also clarify that OFAC will not generally view their transactions or activities to be sanctionable if they could be permissibly undertaken by US Persons, e.g., humanitarian activities, including sales of agricultural commodities, medicine or medical devices consistent with the terms of ITSR general licenses.
- Importantly, FAQ 845 provides a 45-day wind dow n period for non-US persons to conclude previously non-sanctionable activities involving the Iranian financial sector or the new ly designated Iranian banks, ending on November 22, 2020. OFAC anticipates releasing additional guidance regarding "non-significant" activities involving the Iranian financial sector and designated Iranian financial institutions that will not be sanctionable after the end of the wind-dow n period

## US Government further tightens Cuban sanctions targeting Cuban travel, hotels, cigars and rum

On September 24, 2020, the US Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) published a <u>Final Rule</u> in the *Federal Resister* that amended the *Cuban Assets Control Regulations* (CACR) to further implement the President's foreign policy to deny the Cuban regime sources of revenue.

#### Major elements of the changes include:

- <u>Professional (Including Business) Meetings and Conferences:</u> The Final Rule amends a CACR general license to eliminate the authorization for CACR parties to attend or organize professional (including business) meetings or conferences in Cuba, unless it is authorized on a case-by-case basis by OFAC. This change will make it more onerous for CACR parties to travel to engage in preliminary business discussions or negotiations with potential counterparties in Cuba. This amendment, how ever, keeps in place the authorization for travel to Cuba to conduct professional (including business) research pursuant to a general license.
- <u>Public Performances, Clinics, Workshops, Competitions, and Exhibitions</u>: The Final Rule removes a general license that authorizes CACR parties to participate in or organize certain public performances, clinics, workshops, other athletic or non-athletic competitions, and exhibitions, and replaces it with a specific licensing policy (*i.e.*, permitting the authorization of specific activities on a case-by-case basis by OFAC). The authorization for travel by amateur and semi-professional athletic teams for athletic competitions in Cuba, how ever, remains in place.
- Cuba Prohibited Accommodations List: The Final Rule adds a new prohibition for CACR parties regarding lodging and related transactions (e.g., making reservations or paying for lodging) at certain properties in Cuba identified on the US State Department's new ly created "Cuba Prohibited Accommodations List" (the "CPA List"). This prohibition applies to all categories of Cuba authorized travel except for travel for official government purposes. The CPA List includes 433 properties ow ned or controlled by the Cuban government, prohibited government officials, members of the Communist Party of Cuba, and close relatives of the foregoing categories of persons. The Trump Administration previously prohibited lodging in hotels identified with links to the Cuban military, intelligence, and secu-

rity services through the CACR and the "<u>Cuba Restricted List</u>." In addition, the restrictions related to the Cuba Restricted List do not apply to all categories of Cuba authorized travel.

 <u>Cuban-Origin Alcohol and Tobacco</u>: The Final Rule amends four CACR general licenses to restrict the importation of Cuban-origin alcohol and tobacco products into the United States. Previously, OFAC had authorized importation of Cubanorigin alcohol and tobacco products for personal, non-commercial use. OFAC has also eliminated the exception that allow ed CACR parties to buy Cuban-origin goods in third countries and bring them back to the United States, although such Cuban-origin goods may be purchased and consumed by CACR parties in third countries.

The Final Rule also makes several technical and conforming changes in the CACR. On September 23, OFAC published a number of new and updated <u>Fre-</u><u>quently Asked Questions</u> regarding these changes.

## OFAC issues International Criminal Court-Related Sanctions Regulations

On October 1, 2020, the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC), Treasury, published in the *Federal Register* a <u>final rule</u> adding regulations [31 CFR Part 520] to implement Executive Order 13928 of June 11, 2020 ("Blocking Property of Certain Persons Associated With the International Criminal Court"). The Regulations are being published in abbreviated form at this time for the purpose of providing immediate guidance to the public. OFAC intends to supplement these regulations with a more comprehensive set of regulations, which may include additional interpretive and definitional guidance, general licenses, and statements of licensing policy.

#### OFAC amends WMD Proliferators Sanctions Regulations and Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations

On October 1, 2020, the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC), Treasury, published in the *Federal Register* a <u>final rule</u> amending the *Weapons of Mass Destruction Proliferators Sanctions Regulations* (WMD Regulations; 31 CFR part 544) to update a note to describe how persons designated pursuant to the WMD Regulations for North Korea-related activities are identified on OFAC's Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons List (SDN List). Specifically, OFAC is amending the note to explain that SDN List entries for these designated persons will include additional information regarding certain risks associated with dealings with such persons. Separately, OFAC is amending the *Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations* (31 CFR part 560) to refine the list of organizations whose activities are authorized under the general license for the official business of certain international organizations, and to make a technical correction. OFAC is also making technical edits to the authority citations in both sets of regulations to conform to *Federal Register* guidance.

## CDC issues Orders suspending right to introduce certain persons from countries where quarantinable communicable disease exists

On October 16, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> that announces the issuance of an Order suspending the right to introduce certain persons into the United States from countries where a quarantinable communicable disease exists. This Order is based on the CDC Director's determination that introduction of aliens, regardless of their country of origin, migrating through Canada and Mexico into the United States creates a serious danger of the introduction of COVID–19 into the United States, and the danger is so increased by the introduction of such aliens that a temporary suspension is necessary to protect the public health. DATES: This action took effect October 13, 2020.

The Order does not apply to US citizens and lawful permanent residents; members of the armed forces of the United States, and associated personnel, and their spouses and children; persons from foreign countries who hold valid travel documents and arrive at a POE; or persons from foreign countries in the visa waiver program who are not otherwise subject to travel restrictions and arrive at a POE. Additionally, this Order does not apply to any alien who must test negative for COVID–19 before they are expelled to their home country. Further, this Order does not apply to persons whom customs officers determine, with approval from a supervisor, should be excepted based on the totality of the circumstances, including consideration of significant law enforcement, officer and public safety, humanitarian, and public health interests. DHS shall consult with CDC concerning how these types of case-by-case, individualized exceptions shall be made to help ensure consistency with current CDC guidance and public health assessments.

### CDC modifies No Sail Order and takes other measures

On October 5, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> that announces a third modification and extension of the No Sail Order and Other Measures Related to Operations that was issued on July 16, 2020. The Order applies to cruise ships defined as commercial, non-cargo, passenger-carrying vessels with the capacity to carry 250 or more individuals (passengers and crew) and with an itinerary anticipating an overnight stay onboard or a 24- hour stay onboard for either passengers or crew, that are operating in international, interstate, or intrastate waterways, subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. This Order shall additionally apply to cruise ships operating outside of U.S. waters if the cruise ship operator intends for the ship to return to operating in international, interstate, or intrastate waterways, subject to the jurisdiction of the United States during the period that this Order is in effect. This action was effective September 30, 2020.

This Order shall remain in effect until the earliest of (1) the expiration of the Secretary of Health and Human Services' declaration that COVID–19 constitutes a public health emergency; (2) the CDC Director rescinds or modifies the order based on specific public health or other considerations; or (3) October 31, 2020. #### DEA finalizes implementing regulations for the Combat Methamphetamine Epidemic Act of 2005

On October 29, 2020, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. DEA-485] implementing the Combat Methamphetamine Epidemic Act of 2005 (CMEA), which the President signed In March 2006. DEA promulgated an Interim Final Rule (IFR) on September 26, 2006 (with a technical correction on October 13, 2006), under Docket Number DEA-291I, to implement the retail sales provisions of the CMEA. Additionally, on April 9, 2007, DEA promulgated an IFR, under Docket Number DEA-292I, to implement section 716 of the CMEA, which required additional reporting for import, export, and international transactions involving all list I and list II chemicals. DEA is finalizing these rulemakings in one action. This final rule adopts, with one technical change, the corrected September 2006 IFR, and adopts, without change, the April 2007 IFR. The technical amendment to the September 2006 IFR involves the definition of the term "retail distributor." The definition of "retail distributor" in 21 CFR 1300.02(b) is being amended to include ephedrine so that it will mirror the definition of "retail distributor" found in the Controlled Substances Act at 21 U.S.C. 802(49)(A). The September 2006 IFR inadvertently omitted ephedrine from the definition of "retail distributor."

The final rule is effective December 28, 2020. The effective date of December 28, 2020, for the interim final rules published September 26, 2006 (71 FR 56009) and April 9, 2007 (72 FR 17401), is confirmed.

## CHINA (INCLUDING HONG KONG SAR)

#### Mongolia joins the Asia-Pacific Trade Agreement, China and Mongolia will mutually implement tariff concessions

The Chinese Ministry of Commerce announced that on October 23, the secretariat of the *Asia-Pacific Trade Agreement* (the "Agreement") notified all member parties that Mongolia had deposited a letter of acceptance, and completed the Agreement accession procedures, and plans to be in January 2021. On the 1st, mutual tariff reduction arrangements were implemented with relevant members. According to the tariff reduction arrangement, Mongolia will reduce tariffs on 366 tax items, mainly related to aquatic products, vegetables and fruits, animal and vegetable oils, mineral products, chemicals, wood, cotton yarn, chemical fibers, machinery products, transportation equipment, etc., with an average tax reduction The amplitude is 24.2%. At the same time, Mongolia can enjoy the existing tariff reduction arrangements of China and other members. The announcement said:

The Agreement is the first regional preferential trade arrangement that [the] country has participated in. Its members cover Northeast Asia, Southeast Asia and South Asia. Mongolia's accession to the Agreement will further promote the regional integration of developing economies in the Asia-Pacific region and promote the construction of the "Belt and Road". At the same time, it will further deepen China-Mongolia bilateral economic and trade cooperation and enhance the level of trade liberalization and facilitation betw een the two countries.

The Agreement, formerly known as the "Bangkok Agreement" signed in 1975, is a preferential trade arrangement reached betw een developing countries under the auspices of the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific to promote South-South cooperation. China formally joined the Agreement in 2001. Currently, the members of the Agreement include Bangladesh, China, India, Laos, South Korea, Mongolia and Sri Lanka. In January 2017, the members of the Agreement signed the Second Amendment to the *Asia-Pacific Trade Agreement*, the outcome document of the fourth round of tariff reduction negotiations, and it was formally implemented on July 1, 2018.

## PRC enacts new Export Control Law, which will come into effect on 1 December 2020

From 13 to 17 October 2020, the 22nd Session of the Standing Committee of the 13th National People's Congress ("NPC") deliberated on the third review draft (草

案三次审议稿) of China's Export Control Law ("ECL") before its final passage into

law on 17 October 2020. President Xi Jinping issued <u>Presidential Order 58</u> on October 17 which provides that the new ECL will come into force on 1 December 1, 2020.

This is the first comprehensive and consolidated export control law in China. Prior to the law's enactment, export controls were imposed via a series of separate administrative regulations controlling dual-use, military items, nuclear, missile, chemical and biological items, and related technologies, etc. To implement the ECL, existing administrative regulations on export controls may need to be further revised.

The ECL contains 5 chapters and 49 articles, which include rules on export control policies, control lists, control measures, and legal liabilities for non-compliance. The ECL is similar to the second review draft (see our previous post <u>here</u>), though it does depart in a few aspects. Some additions include:

- Rules specifying that a controlled item would also include the item's corresponding data, such as technical information.
- Under special circumstances, export operators may apply to authorities so that they may transact with blacklisted importers and end users on the ECL's control list. Importers and end-users listed on the control list may also apply to authorities for removal should the circumstances that led to their listing no longer apply.
- Export control authorities will issue industry-specific guidelines to guide export
  operators in the establishment and improvement of their internal export control
  compliance systems and operational effectiveness.
- Criminal liability (rather than solely administrative liability) may apply to scenarios whereby prohibited or unlicensed items were exported. These actions will be investigated in accordance with criminal laws should they constitute a crime.
- The new ECL also stipulates that should any country or region abuse export control measures to endanger the national security and interests of the PRC, then the PRC may, based on actual conditions, take reciprocal measures against that country or region.

## China-Cambodia Free Trade Agreement signed

The Ministry of Commerce (MOFCOM) <u>announced</u> that on October 12, Minister of Commerce Zhong Shan and Minister of Commerce of Cambodia Pan Sousa represented the Chinese and Cambodian governments in Beijing and Phnom Penh respectively, and formally signed the *Free Trade Agreement between the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Royal Government of Cambodia* (hereinafter referred to as Chinese Cambodia Free Trade Agreement). Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen and visiting State Councilor and Foreign Minister Wang Yi witnessed the signing of the agreement in Phnom Penh.

According to the announcement:

The negotiation and signing of the China-Cambodia Free Trade Agreement is an important consensus reached by the leaders of the two countries. The two parties started the negotiation in January 2020. After 7 months and 3 rounds of formal negotiations, they announced the completion of the negotiation on July 20, 2020. The signing of the agreement signifies that the two sides have entered a new era of comprehensive strategic partnership, the joint construction of a China-Cambodia community with a shared future, and the "Belt and Road" cooperation. It is a new milestone in the development of bilateral economic and trade relations and will surely promote bilateral economic and trade relations to a new level. Continuously improve the well-being of the enterprises and people of the two countries.

In the next step, China and Cambodia will perform their respective domestic legal approval procedures to promote the early implementation of the agreement.

With the aim to ease Customs clearance process, the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs ("the Board") vide <u>Circular No. 28/2020-Customs</u> dated June 5, 2020 rolled out first pilot programme of Faceless Assessment and second pilot programme vide <u>Circular No. 34/2020-Customs</u> dated July 30, 2020 at specified ports. ## European Union and EFTA

### EU releases 2021 tariff and nomenclature

On 28 October 2020 the Official Journal published Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/1577 of 21 September 2020 amending Annex I to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2658/87 on the tariff and statistical nomenclature and on the Common Customs Tariff, which is effective on 1 January 2021. The Regulation amends the Common Nomenclature (CN) in order to implement the gradual reduction of duty rates for products covered by the agreement in the form of the Declaration on the Expansion of Trade in Information Technology Products (ITA), as required by Council Decision (EU) 2016/971, and takes account of changes in requirements relating to statistics and to commercial policy and technological and commercial developments, by introducing new subheadings to facilitate monitoring of specific goods, for example 'red coral' in Chapter 5, 'red phosphorus' in Chapter 28, 'eucalyptus wood' in Chapter 44 and 'steel laminations' in Chapter 85 of the CN. It is also necessary to amend the classification of some substances in the list of non-proprietary names of pharmaceutical substances in Annex 3 of Part Three (Tariff Annexes) of Annex I to Regulation (EEC) No 2658/87 and in the list of pharmaceutical intermediates in Annex 6 of Part Three (Tariff Annexes) of Annex I to that Regulation.

### Consultation on the Trade Policy Review to end 15 November

In June, the European Commission <u>launched</u> a major review of the European Union's trade policy, including a <u>public consultation</u> seeking input from the European Parliament, Member States, stakeholders and civil society. The consultation will close on 15 November 2020. The Commission's objective is to build a consensus around a fresh medium-term direction for EU trade policy, responding to a variety of new global challenges and taking into account the lessons learned from the coronavirus crisis.

The consultation covers all relevant topics to the EU trade policy. The results of this consultation will feed into a communication to be published towards the end of the year.

# EU designates new Russian individuals and entities under the Chemical Weapons and Libya sanctions regimes

On 15 October, the EU imposed Designated Party controls on six individuals and one entity in Russia under the EU's Chemical Weapons sanctions regime for their alleged involvement in the poisoning of Alexei Navalny with a nerve agent in August 2020. The EU separately designated one Russian individual under the Libya sanctions regime, for alleged breaches of the UN arms embargo against Libya. These individuals and entities are now subject to a travel ban and asset freeze, including prohibitions on dealings by EU persons. The individuals designated under the Chemical Weapons regime are senior government and security officials in Russia, who the EU considers to be responsible for Mr Navalny's poisoning. They have been designated together with Russia's State Scientific Research Institute for Organic Chemistry and Technology, which the EU names as the facility that developed the novichok nerve agent that was used in the poisoning. The Chemical Weapons regime was previously used to impose sanctions on Russian individuals and entities following the poisoning of Sergei and Yulia Skripal in the UK in March 2018, and on various Syrian nationals alleged to be involved in Syria's chemical weapons programme.

In addition, the EU has designated Russian businessman Yevgeniy Prigozhin under the Libya sanctions regime, for allegedly providing support for breaches of the UN arms embargo on Libya by Wagner Group, a private military company. Wagner Group itself has not been designated. All of the designations are directly applicable in all EU Member States and in the UK. The EU's press releases announcing the designations are available <u>here</u> (in respect of the Chemical Weapons regime) and <u>here</u> (in respect of the Libya regime).

### Further updates to EU and UK sanctions against Belarus

The European Council has designated 40 individuals under its Belarus sanctions regime, <u>amending Council Regulation (EC) 765/2006</u>.

In the UK, the Office of Financial Sanctions Implementation (OFSI) has accordingly updated the consolidated list. 5 of these individuals were already sanctioned under the UK's <u>Global Human Rights regime</u> and are now subject to an asset freeze under both the UK and EU regimes.

OFSI has also updated information for a further 4 individuals under the UK regime, bringing the information in line with EU rules.

As reported in our <u>previous blog post</u>, when the UK first imposed such sanctions at the end of September, they targeted Alexander Lukashenko, his son and senior figures in the Belarusian government.

## Binding Tariff Information

The European Community has created the Binding Tariff Information (BTI) system as a tool to assist economic operators to obtain the correct tariff classification for goods they intend to import or export.

Since 1 October 2019 all BTI correspondence between the economic operator and the customs authority is happening through the <u>Trader Portal</u>. This includes among others applications by economic operators for BTI decisions, requests by the customs authority for further information on the product being classified and the economic operators' replies to those questions. A list of customs authorities designated by Member States for the purposes of receiving applications, or taking decisions relating to binding tariff information may be found <u>here</u>.

Depending on the Member State an economic operator has to access either the <u>EU Customs trader portal</u> or the <u>national trader portal</u>. You can search and consult existing BTIs on the <u>EBTI-database</u>.

## The Swedish Anti-Corruption Institute (IMM) issues a revised Code to Prevent Corruption in Business

Since 2012, the Swedish Anti-Corruption Institute's ("IMM") guidelines have been an important cornerstone in promoting self-regulation as a measure to combat corruption in the Swedish business industry. In keeping up to date with current societal trends, the code, previously called the "Code on Gifts, Rewards and other Benefits in Business", has been revised in order to adapt to the evolving business environment, and introduces new guidelines on preventive measures and intermediaries. To mark its revision, IMM's guidelines have been renamed the "Code to Prevent Corruption in Business" ("the Code").

The updated version of the Code, which came into effect on 14 August this year, serves to clarify the legal framework on bribery, in addition to promoting higher ethical standards for the business industry. Following an extensive review of the business climate, the updated Code emphasizes a more active stance on corruption, and provides guidance on proactive measures, benefits and intermediaries.

## CEPA between EFTA and Ecuador to enter into force on 1 November 2020

On 30 October 2020, the Swiss Federal Council <u>announced</u> that the *Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement* (CEPA) concluded between the states of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) and Ecuador enters into force on 1 November. To that end, on 18 September, the Federal Council adopted the necessary amendments to the ordinances implementing the customs duty concessions set out in the agreement. This modern agreement will help to boost trade relations between the EFTA states and Ecuador.

The Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) concluded betw een the EFTA member states (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norw ay and Sw itzerland) and Ecuador enables Sw itzerland to strengthen its economic and trade relations with this partner. It improves market access and legal certainty for the Sw iss export industry on a broad basis, and corresponds largely to the agreements recently concluded by the EFTA member states with third countries. The agreement also counters discriminations on the Ecuadorian market unfavourable to Sw itzerland that could result, inter alia, from the trade agreement betw een the European Union and Ecuador.

#### Agreement with far-reaching scope

The CEPA concluded between the EFTA states and Ecuador is wide ranging. It covers trade in industrial, fishing and other sea products, processed and basic agricultural products, technical barriers to trade including sanitary and phytosanitary measures, rules of origin, trade facilitation, trade in services, investment, intellectual

property protection, competition, government procurement, settlement of disputes, as well as trade and sustainable development.

#### Eliminating customs duties in bilateral trade

Under the CEPA customs duties on most bilateral trade with Ecuador will be completely or partially eliminated and trade will be promoted. Customs duties on 60 per cent of industrial products exported to Ecuador will be eliminated immediately when the agreement enters into force. For the remainder of these products, transitional periods are provided for and customs duties will be abolished for more than 99 per cent of Sw iss industrial products exported to Ecuador after ten years at the latest. Sw itzerland will also benefit from tariff concessions on specific processed and unprocessed agricultural products of interest. In particular, Sw itzerland will benefit from an annual duty-free tariff quota for cheese as soon as the agreement enters into force.

The agreement was signed by the partner states on 25 June 2018 and approved by Parliament in June 2019.

### UK and Japan sign free trade agreement

On 22 October 2020, the Department for International Trade (DIT) <u>announced</u> that the United Kingdom and Japan will sign the *UK-Japan Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement* (CEPA) in Tokyo on 23 October. The DIT said:

The British-shaped deal is the first agreement that the UK has secured that goes beyond the existing EU deal, with enhancements in areas such as digital and data, financial services, food and drink, and creative industries.

It brings together twoof the world's most technologically advanced nations, placing the UK at the forefront of shaping new global standards on digital trade.

Benefits include:

- Cutting-edge digital & data provisions that go far beyond the EU-Japan deal, including enabling free flow of data, a commitment to uphold the principles of net neutrality and a ban on unjustified data localisation that will prevent British businesses from having the extra cost of setting up servers in Japan.
- Supporting UK car and rail manufacturing jobs at major investors in the UK like Nissan and Hitachi through reduced tariffs on parts coming from Japan, streamlined regulatory procedures and greater legal certainty for their operations.
- Strong tariff reductions on key agricultural products like pork, beef and salmon will benefit farmers and food exporters.
- A boost for UK brands with protections for more iconic UK agricultural products, from just seven under the terms of the EU-Japan deal to potentially over 70, including English sparkling wine, Scotch beef and Welsh lamb.
- British consumers to benefit from cheaper, high-quality Japanese goods from udon noodles to Bluefin tuna and Kobe beef.

This deal could boost trade betw een the UK and Japan by over £15 billion and drive economic grow thin the long run, benefiting all parts of the country and Scotland, London and the East Midlands in particular. The signing of this FTA, and its subsequent ratification, will not only strengthen the UK economy but also help us to build back better from Covid-19.

Today's signing of the agreement also signals Japan's strong commitment to supporting the UK's accession to the *Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership* (CPTPP), one of the world's biggest free trade areas, covering 13% of the global economy in 2018 and more than £110bn of trade in 2019.

After the CEPA is signed, the final text will be laid in Parliament for 21 sitting days for scrutiny under the *Constitutional Reform and Governance (CRaG) Act*. The UK government will also publish a full report on the agreement, providing an explanation of the CEPA, including any significant differences or enhancements between the UK-Japan CEPA and the EU-Japan Agreement.

# UK Government publishes Notice reminding relevant exporters to sign up for the EU dual-use OGEL

On 16 October 2020, the Export Control Joint Unit (ECJU) published <u>Notice to</u> <u>Exporters 2020/14</u> to remind relevant exporters to sign up for the <u>EU dual-use</u> <u>open general export licence (OGEL)</u> before the end of the Brexit Transition Period.

This OGEL will be required to export dual-use items from the UK to any EU Member State and the Channel Islands from 1 January 2021. It is not required to export dual-use items to the EU during the Transition Period itself.

This reminder notice follows the publication of <u>Notice to exporters 2020/03</u> on 29 January 2020, which contains information about how exporters can register for the OGEL. Exporters should check if they need to sign up for the OGEL and then register on <u>SPIRE</u>. Note that there are terms and conditions to use and exporters will be audited on its use. From 1 January 2021, controlled goods exported from the UK to the EU without this licence may be intercepted by HM Revenue & Customs and may amount to an offence.

# OFSI publishes Annual Review 2019-2020 and issues reminder to report frozen assets

On 9 October 2020, the Office of Financial Sanctions Implementation ("**OFSI**") published its Annual Review, providing an overview of OFSI's activities in the financial year April 2019 to March 2020. A copy of the Annual Review is available <u>here</u>. In addition, OFSI has reminded UK businesses that they must report any frozen assets they hold by 16 October 2020.

Statistics

In 2019-2020, OFSI received 140 reports of potential financial sanctions breaches, an increase from 99 previously. The total value of breaches reported during the year was £982.34 million, a substantial increase from the £262.33 million reported previously.

OFSI has also near-doubled the number of jurisdictions it has engaged with over the past financial year from 42 previously to 83 in 2019 to 2020. Overall, domestic and international engagement increased by 20%.

Licenses

OFSI issued 40 new licences and made 69 licence amendments across 10 financial sanctions regimes. It also issued two authorisations. The new Ukraine (Sovereignty) regime licences dropped from five in the 2018 to 2019 period to one during this period. These reductions are attributable to delistings of designated persons that have occurred under these regimes.

### Reporting

OFSI has issued a reminder to businesses in the UK that hold or control funds or economic resources belonging to, owned, held, or controlled by a designated person that they need to report these holdings to OFSI.

Businesses are required to report the value of all assets as they stand as of close of business on Wednesday 30 September 2020. All returns need to be made, in the form of a completed template from the <u>GOV.UK website</u>, to <u>ofsi@hmtreas-ury.gov.uk</u>. For further information and to access the full notice please use the link <u>here</u>. The deadline to submit a .report to the OFSI is Friday 16 October 2020.
