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World Trade Organization (WTO)

UK and Switzerland confirm participation in revised government procurement pact

On 2 December 2020, the WTO <u>announced</u> that Switzerland and the United Kingdom have completed the final step for making their respective participation in the revised Government Procurement Agreement (GPA) effective. As of 1 January 2021, the revised GPA will be in force for Switzerland, and the UK will be a party to the accord in its own right. The announcement said:

Switzerland submitted the so-called "instrument of acceptance" to the WTO on 2 December. This means that, as of 1 January 2021, the revised GPA will be in force for all GPA parties. The Government Procurement Agreement opens government procurement markets among its parties. The revised GPA, in force since 2014, expands the number of governmental entities, such as ministries and agencies, that are covered by the Agreement, and adds new services. The text of the revised agreement can be found here.

The same day, the UK submitted the so-called "instrument of accession" to the WTO. This means that the UK will take part in the GPA in its own right from 1 January 2021. The UK continues to be covered by the agreement during the European Union-UK transition period, which ends on 31 December 2020. It is treated as a member state of the European Union during the transition period.

President proclaims modifications to HTS for AGOA, IFTA, CBERA, EU

On December 29, 2020, the *Federal Register* published Presidential <u>Proclamation 10128 of December 22, 2020 - To Take Certain Actions Under the African Growth and Opportunity Act and for Other Purposes</u>, which takes the following actions:

- Designates the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) as a beneficiary sub-Saharan African country for purposes of the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA) and modifies general note 16(a) to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTS) to add the DRC;
- Designates the DRC as a lesser developed beneficiary sub-Saharan African country and modifies note 2(d) to subchapter XIX of chapter 98 of the HTS by inserting "Democratic Republic of Congo" in alphabetical sequence in the list of lesser developed beneficiary sub-Saharan African countries;
 - The above designations and modifications shall be effective with respect to articles that are entered for consumption, or withdrawnfromwarehouse for consumption, on or after January 1, 2021.
- Modifies the HTS as provided for in Annex I to the proclamation in order to implement United States tariff commitments under the 2004 US-Israel Agreement in the trade in agricultural products through December 31, 2021, with effect for eligible agricultural products of Israel that are entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after January 1, 2021 and continue in effect through December 31, 2021.
- Modifies general note 17(f)(i), HTS, by deleting "September 30, 2020" and inserting, in lieu thereof, "September 30, 2030". in order to reflect the extension of the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act (CBERA),
- Modifies the HTS as set forth in Annex II to the proclamation in order to modify duties on certain goods to carry out the agreement regarding tariff barriers with the European Union. Modifications for subheadings listed in paragraphs 1(a)-(f) of Annex II shall be effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after August 1, 2020, for which entry is unliquidated or otherwise not final as of that date, and with respect to subheadings listed in paragraphs 2(a)-(e) of Annex II with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after August 1, 2021, and remain in effect until the date on which the European Union ceases to carry out the agreement, as determined by the United States Trade Representative (USTR) in a notice published in the Federal Register. The HTS shall be modified to revert to the duty rate in effect on July 31, 2020, for each subheading identified in Annex II, effective on that date as determined by the USTR. The USTR shall publish notice of such a determination in the Federal Register.

USTR requests consultations under USMCA with Canada re: dairy TRQ

On December 9, 2020, the US Trade Representative (USTR) <u>announced</u> that it had filed the first dispute under the *US-Mexico-Canada Agreement* (USMCA) by requesting <u>consultations</u> with the Government of Canada (pursuant to Articles 31.2 and 31.4 of the USMCA) in connection with Canada's administration of its dairy tariff rate quotas.

USTR's request for consultations states:

Canada's dairy TRQ allocation measures appear to be inconsistent with several provisions of the USMCA. First, the measures appear to be inconsistent with Article 3.A.2.11(b) because Canada is setting aside and reserving a portion of the quota to processors. Second, the measures appear to be inconsistent with Articles 3.A.2.4(b) and 3.A.2.11(e) because Canada is not providing "fair" and "equitable" procedures

and methods for administering its TRQs. Third, the measures appear to be inconsistent with Article 3.A.2.11(c) because Canada fails to ensure that, "to the maximum extent possible", the allocation is made "in the quantities that the TRQ applicant requests" as a result of reserving access of large shares of the quota to processors and so-called "further processors". Finally, the measures appear to be inconsistent with Article 3.A.2.6(a) because they "introduce a new or additional condition, limit, or eligibility requirement on the utilization of a TRQ" that are "beyond those set out in [Canada's] Schedule to Annex 2- B."

If the US and the Canadian governments are not able to resolve the dispute through consultations, the US could ask to convene a panel that will adjudicate Canada's TRQ administration.

Treasury labels Vietnam and Switzerland as currency manipulators

On December 16, 2020, US Department of the Treasury delivered to Congress the semiannual Report on Macroeconomic and Foreign Exchange Policies of Major Trading Partners of the United States. Treasury determined that both Vietnam and Switzerland are currency manipulators. For each country, Treasury assessed, based on a range of evidence and circumstances, that at least part of its exchange rate management over the four quarters through June 2020, and particularly foreign exchange intervention, was for purposes of preventing effective balance of payments adjustments and, in the case of Vietnam, for gaining unfair competitive advantage in international trade as well.

Based on these determinations, Treasury stated that it "will press for the adoption of policies that will permit effective balance of payments adjustments and eliminate the unfair advantages in trade that result from their actions."

[Note: Two statutes are involved: the *Trade Facilitation and Trade Enforcement Act of 2015* (the "2015 Act") and the *Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act of 1988* (the "1988 Act"). Because the standards and criteria in the 1988 Act and the 2015 Act are distinct, an economy could be found to meet the standards identified in one of the Acts without being found to have met the standards identified in the other.]

In addition, 10 economies — China, Japan, Korea, Germany, Italy, Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Taiwan, and India — are on Treasury's Monitoring List, with the last three as recent additions.

Commerce implements Aluminum Import Monitoring and Analysis System

On December 23, 2020 the International Trade Administration (ITA), Commerce, published in the Federal Register a final rule [Docket No. 201014-0270] that adopts the Aluminum Import Monitoring and Analysis (AIM) system by promulgating new regulations (19 C.F.R. Part 361) that establish a website for the AIM system that consists of an online aluminum import license application platform and public AIM monitor; require importers, customs brokers or their agents to apply for and obtain an import license for each entry of certain aluminum products into the United States through the AIM system website; require license applicants to identify, among other requirements, the country or countries where the largest and the second largest volume of primary aluminum used in the manufacture of the imported aluminum product was smelted (subject to certain exceptions) and the country where the aluminum product was most recently cast; allow for the public release of certain import license data on an aggregate basis, as appropriate, on the public AIM monitor; and apply the license requirement to all imports of basic aluminum products. Further, Commerce is adopting the aluminum import license application form in accordance with the Paperwork Reduction Act (PRA). Lastly, Commerce is notifying parties that, after the AIM system is in place, Commerce will seek additional comment from parties on potential improvements or changes to the system in a subsequent notice. The final rule is effective January 25, 2021.

Commerce issues limits for duty-free imports of apparel articles assembled in Haiti under CBERA

On December 21, 2020, the International Trade Administration, Department of Commerce published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notification of annual quantitative limit on imports of certain apparel from Haiti</u>. The *Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act* (CBERA), as amended by the *Haitian Hemispheric Opportunity through Partnership Encouragement Act* (HOPE), provides duty-free treatment for certain apparel articles imported directly from Haiti. One of the preferences is known as the "value-added" provision, which requires that apparel meet a minimum threshold percentage of value added in Haiti, the United States, and/or certain beneficiary countries. The provision is subject to a quantitative limitation, which is calculated as a percentage of total apparel imports into the United States for each 12-month period. For the period from December 20, 2020 through December 19, 2021, the quantity of imports eligible for preferential treatment under the value-added provision is 337,967,087 square meters equivalent. The new limitations become effective December 20, 2020.

SECTIONS 201, 232 AND 301 TARIFF INFORMATION AND PRODUCT EXCLUSIONS

USTR revises Sec. 301 action re: EU Civil Aircraft

On December 30, 2020, the US Trade Representative (USTR) <u>posted on its website</u> an advance copy of a *Federal Register* notice [Docket No. USTR-2020-0042] that USTR has determined to revise the action being taken in the Section 301 investigation, "Enforcement of US WTO Rights in Large Civil Aircraft Dispute," to mirror the approach taken by the European Union (EU) in exercising its World Trade Organization (WTO) authorization in the Boeing dispute. In implementing this approach, the USTR has determined to revise the action by adding certain

products of certain EU member States to the list of products subject to additional duties.

Although the EU has represented that its retaliatory action mirrors the action taken by the United States in this investigation, that is not accurate. Specifically, the EU's action does not mirror the US action because the methodology used by the EU to exercise its \$4 billion authorization relies on a benchmark reference period affected by the economic downturn caused by the COVID pandemic. Under this methodology, the EU was able to cover a greater volume of imports than if, like the United States, it had used data from a period when trade was not affected by the pandemic. In addition, up to and until the exit of the United Kingdom from EU customs territory is finalized, goods of the United States are subject to additional EU duties when entering the United Kingdom. However, the EU's trade action valuation does not account for US exports to the United Kingdom. Therefore, the value of US exports subject to tariffs is greater than the trade value the EU ascribes to the various covered tariff lines. The United States has expressed its concerns to the EU and has given the EU an opportunity to address these issues. The EU has declined to do so.

The USTR has determined to mirror the EU approach to exercising its WTO authorization by adjusting the reference period used for the US trade action to mirror the August 2019 to July 2020 reference period used by the EU. In adopting this approach, the United States has made appropriate adjustments to ensure that the trade data from the revised reference period does not reflect reductions in trade resulting from the October 2019 trade action in the investigation. Using the estimated trade values from this reference period, the value of the US trade action as last revised on August 12, 2020, is well below the \$7.5 billion level authorized by the WTO.

USTR has determined to add additional goods of France and Germany to the list of products currently subject to additional duties, while otherwise maintaining the trade action as last revised on August 12, 2020. France and Germany have provided the greatest level of WTO-inconsistent large civil aircraft subsidies. The articles subject to the duties are aircraft manufacturing parts from France and Germany, certain non-sparkling wine from France and Germany, and certain cognac and other grape brandies from France and Germany.

The revisions in Annex I to the notice are applicable with respect to products that are entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern standard time on January 12, 2021.

Annex I to the notice identifies the products affected by the revised action, the rate of duty to be assessed, and the current or former EU member States affected. Annex II, section 1, contains the unofficial descriptive list of the revisions made by this Notice. Annex II, section 2, contains an unofficial, consolidated description of the action, reflecting the changes in annex I. In order to implement this determination, effective January 12, 2021, subchapter III of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) is modified by annex I to the notice. The additional duties provided for in the HTSUS subheadings established by annex I apply in addition to all other applicable duties, fees, exactions and charges.

Annex I modifies US note 21 to subchapter III of chapter 99 of the HTSUS (effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern standard time January 12, 2021) as follows:

- 1. US note 21(a) to such subchapter is modified by deleting "9903.89.55" each place that it appears and inserting "9903.89.63" in lieu thereof;
- 2. U.S. note 21 to such subchapter is modified by inserting in alphabetical order: "(s) Subheading 9903.89.57 and superior text thereto shall apply to all of the following products of France and Germany:
 - (1) Spirits obtained by distilling grape wine or grape marc (grape brandy), other than Pisco and Singani, in containers each holding not over 4 liters, valued over \$38 per proof liter (provided for in subheading 2208.20.40); and
 - (2) Products classified in the following 8-digit subheadings: 2204.21.20 2204.21.30 2204.21.60 2204.21.80 2204.22.20 2204.22.40 2204.22.60 2204.22.80 2204.29.61 2204.29.81 2204.30.00

Goods covered by US note 21(s) are subject to an additional 25% duty. Goods covered by 9903.89.61 (certain airplane parts from France or Germany) are subject to an additional 15% duty

Any product listed in annex I to this notice, except any product that is eligible for admission under 'domestic status' as defined in 19 CFR 146.43, which is subject to the additional duty imposed by this determination, and is admitted into a U.S. foreign trade zone on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern standard time on January 12, 2021, only may be admitted as 'privileged foreign status' as defined in 19 CFR 146.41. Such products will be subject upon entry for consumption to any ad valorem rates of duty or quantitative limitations related to the classification under the applicable HTSUS subheading.

USTR will extend China Sec. 301 exclusions related to Covid-19

On December 29, 2020, the US Trade Representative (USTR) published in the Federal Register a notice of product exclusion extensions and additional modifications (an advance copy of which was posted on USTR's website on December 23). In prior notices, the USTR modified the action in the Section 301 investigation of China's acts, policies, and practices related to technology transfer, intellectual property, and innovation by excluding from additional duties certain medical-care products needed to address the COVID-19 outbreak. On March 25, 2020, the USTR sought public comment on additional modifications in this investigation in order to address COVID-19. This notice announces the USTR's determination to extend certain product exclusions and to make further modifications to remove Section 301 duties from additional medical-care products to address COVID-19. DATES: The product exclusion extensions announced in this notice will extend the exclusions through March 31, 2021. The modifications to exclude additional products will apply as of January 1, 2021 until March 31, 2021. U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will issue instructions on entry guidance and implementation.

Throughout the exclusion process, USTR assessed medical necessity in granting exclusions, consistent with its published criteria. In addition, the USTR, in consultation with the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), prioritized the review and exclusion of requests addressing medical-care products related to the US response to COVID-19. See 85 FR 13970 (March 10, 2020), 85 FR 15015 (March 16, 2020), and 85 FR 15244 (March 17, 2020). These exclusions covered personal protective equipment products and other medical-care related products.

In light of the rising spread and ongoing efforts to combat COVID-19, the USTR has determined that maintaining or re-imposing additional duties on certain products subject to the action no longer is appropriate and that the application of additional duties to these products could impact US preparedness to address COVID-19. The USTR has determined to extend certain product exclusions on

medical-care products and to remove the duties from additional medical-care products. The medical-care products covered by this determination are set out in the annexes to this notice. In light of the evolving nature of the battle against COVID-19, the USTR has determined to extend the exclusions in the annexes until March 31, 2021, and the modifications will be effective from January 1, 2021, to March 31, 2021. The USTR may consider further extensions and/or additional modifications as appropriate. The USTR's determination also takes into account advice from advisory committees and any public comment.

The exclusions and modifications are available for any product that meets the description in the Annexes. Further, the scope of each exclusion and modification is governed by the scope of the ten-digit Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) subheadings and product descriptions in the annexes to this notice.

BIS terminates sec. 232 investigation of Mobile Crane imports

On December 18, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice</u> [Docket No. 201214-0339] announcing that on November 23, 2020, the Secretary of Commerce terminated an investigation under section 232 of the *Trade Expansion Act of 1962*, as amended, which was initiated on May 19, 2020, to determine whether imports of mobile cranes threatened to impair the national security. Notice of the investigation and a request for public comments was published in the *Federal Register* on May 26, 2020. The investigation was originally requested in an application submitted by the Manitowoc Company, Inc. ("Manitowoc") on December 19, 2019.

On September 8, 2020, the BIS received a formal request from Manitowoc to withdraw its application and terminate the investigation. Manitowoc stated that the current economic environment is very different from when Manitowoc submitted the application in December 2019, given the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Secretary of Commerce has evaluated the request to withdraw and has determined that it is appropriate to terminate the investigation.

BIS revises sec. 232 steel and aluminum tariffs exclusion process

On December 14, 2020, the Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the *Federal Register* an <u>interim final rule</u> [Docket No. 201203-0323] ("IFR") that revises aspects of the process for requesting exclusions from the duties and quantitative limitations on imports of aluminum and steel discussed in three previous

interim final rules implementing the exclusion process authorized by the President under Section 232 of the *Trade Expansion Act of 196*2, as amended ("232"). These changes are also informed by a notice of inquiry with request for comments on the 232 exclusions process that was published on May 26, 2020. Based on public comments on the current process for submissions to Commerce, Commerce is publishing this interim final rule to make additional revisions to the 232 exclusion process, including to the 232 Exclusions Portal.: The interim final rule is effective December 14, 2020, except for amendatory instructions 3 and 5 that are effective December 29, 2020. Comments on this interim final rule must be received by BIS no later than February 12, 2021, 2020.

There are three key changes to the exclusion process:

- 1. The IFR addresses the need to create a more efficient method for approving exclusions where objections have not been received in the past for certain steel or aluminum articles. Commerce has determined creating general approved exclusions that may be used by any importing entity is warranted. This has been noted by commenters who submit exclusion requests, and by trade associations that represent those companies, as one of the most important changes that could be made to improve the efficiency of the 232 exclusion process. As described in much greater detail in the IFR, Commerce addresses this issue with the adoption of General Approved Exclusions (GAEs). This change will result in an estimated immediate decrease of 5,000 exclusion requests annually, resulting in a significant improvement in efficiency, with the possibility of more in the future. Unlike exclusion requests, GAEs do not include quantity limits.
- 2. The IFR addresses a trend identified by commenters and validated in data review ed by Commerce -- that certain exclusion requesters may have requested more volume than they may have needed for their own business purposes compared to past usage. Submitting large numbers of unneeded exclusion requests decreases the efficiency of the 232 exclusions process for potential objectors and Commerce. It also creates issues for potential objectors. As described in greater detail in the IFR, this issue is addressed by adding a new certification requirement for volumes requested.

Along the same lines, the IFR also adds a note to remind all parties submitting 232 submissions of the prohibition against making false statements to the US Government and the consequences that may occur for such false statements.

3. The IFR addresses an objector concern they were being held to a higher standard than foreign suppliers because of the interpretation that "immediately" meant the objector needed to be able to provide the steel or aluminum articles within 8 weeks, even though a foreign supplier may not be able to provide the same steel or aluminum article until much longer than 8 weeks. With this IFR the term "immediately," is retained but language has been modified to apply the same time standard to US objectors and foreign suppliers for when the steel or aluminum articles need to be provided to the exclusion requester.

Commerce said that some comments to earlier proposals are not addressed in the IFR but will be addressed in future rules.

USTR seeks comments for 2021 Special 301 review

On December 15, 2020, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a request for comments and notice of public hearing [Docket Number USTR-2020-0041] for its 2021 review to identify countries that deny adequate and effective protection of intellectual property (IP) rights or deny fair and equitable market access to US persons who rely on IP protection. Based on this review, the USTR determines which, if any, of these countries to identify as Priority Foreign Countries. USTR requests written comments that identify acts, policies, or practices that may form the basis of a country's identification as a Priority Foreign Country or placement on the Priority Watch List or Watch List.

Section 182 of the *Trade Act of 1974* (Trade Act) (19 U.S.C. 2242), commonly known as the Special 301 provisions, requires the USTR to identify countries that deny adequate and effective IP protections or fair and equitable market access to U.S. persons who rely on IP protection. The Trade Act requires the U.S. Trade Representative to determine which, if any, of these countries to identify as Priority Foreign Countries. Acts, policies or practices that are the basis of a country's identification as a Priority Foreign Country can be subject to the procedures set out in sections 301–305 of the Trade Act (19 U.S.C. 2411–2415).

The schedule is:

- January 28, 2021 at 11:59 pm EST: Deadline for submission of written comments from the public.
- February 11, 2021 at 11:59 pm EST: Deadline for submission of written comments from foreign governments.
- February 22, 2021: Deadline for the Special 301 Subcommittee of the Trade Policy Staff Committee (Subcommittee) to pose questions on written comments.
- March 5, 2021 at 11:59pm EST: Deadline for submission of commenters' responses to questions from the Subcommittee.
- On or about April 30, 2021: USTR will publish the 2021 Special 301 Report within 30 days of the publication of the National Trade Estimate Report

CBP GUIDANCE ON SECS. 201, 232 AND 301 ACTIONS

CBP issues guidance for Sec. 301 Covid-19 exclusion extensions

On December 30, 2020, CBP issued <u>CSMS #45318223 - GUIDANCE: Section</u> 301 Modifications and Product Exclusion Extensions from China Duties

(9903.88.62, 9903.88.63, 9903.88.64, 9903.88.65), which provides guidance for the USTR exclusions granted in a *Federal Register* notice published on December 29, 2020. It follows:

The purpose of this message is to provide guidance regarding the modification of the Section 301-China action and the extension of product exclusions from additional duties on certain medical-care products to address COVID-19.

BACKGROUND

On December 29, 2021, the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) published Federal Register (FR) Notice <u>85 FR 85831</u>, modifying the Section 301-China action, and extending product exclusions previously covered by multiple tranches and FR Notices. In light of the rising spread and ongoing efforts to combat COVID-19, the USTR has determined that maintaining or re-imposing additional duties on certain medical-care products subject to the Section 301 action is no longer appropriate, and that the application of additional duties to these products could impact U.S. preparedness to address COVID-19.

The modifications to exclude additional products announced in <u>85 FR 85831</u> will apply as of January 1, 2021 until March 31, 2021. Certain product exclusion which were initially set to expire on December 31, 2020 will be extended through March 31, 2021. Also, one exclusion under HTS 9027.90.5650 and 9903.88.06, which was originally set to expire on March 25, 2021, was deleted and replaced with an exclusion which will expire on March 31, 2021.

The exclusions listed are available for any product that meets the description as set out in the Annexes to <u>85 FR 85831</u>, regardless of whether the importer filed an exclusion request. Further, the scope of each exclusion is governed by the scope of the 10-digit HTS headings and product descriptions provided in the Annexes to <u>85 FR 85831</u>, not by the product descriptions set out in any particular request for exclusion.

The functionality for the acceptance of the modifications and extended product exclusions will be available in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) as of 7 am eastern standard time, January 7, 2021.

GUIDANCE

Instructions for importers, brokers, and filers on submitting entries to CBP containing granted exclusions by the USTR from the Section 301 measures are set out below:

- Per <u>85 FR 85831</u> Annex A, in addition to reporting the regular Chapters 84, 85, and 90 classifications of the HTS for the imported merchandise, importers shall report the HTS classification 9903.88.62 (Articles, the product of China related to Tranche 1 \$34B Action, as provided for in U.S. note 20(000) to this subchapter, each covered by an exclusion granted by the USTR for imported merchandise subject to the exclusion).
- Per <u>85 FR 85831</u> Annex A, paragraph B, USTR removed HTS 9027.90.5650 from U.S. note 20(i), covered under the 9903.88.06 product exclusion round of China (Tranche 1 \$34B Action). Importers can no longer report this statistical reporting number in conjunction with the 9903.88.06 product exclusion round. Effective January 1, 2021, HTS 9027.90.5650 will be covered under the 9903.88.62 product exclusion extension round, and will expire on March 31, 2021.
- Per <u>85 FR 85831</u> Annex B, in addition to reporting the regular Chapters 39, 84, and 90 classifications of the HTS for the imported merchandise, importers shall report the HTS classification 9903.88.63 (Articles, the product of China related to Tranche 2 \$16B Action, as provided for in U.S. note 20(ppp) to this subchapter, each covered by an exclusion granted by the USTR for imported merchandise subject to the exclusion).
- Per <u>85 FR 85831</u> Annex C, in addition to reporting the regular Chapters 28, 34, 38, 39, 40, 48, 56, 65, 84, 85, and 90 classifications of the HTS for the imported merchandise, importers shall report the HTS classification 9903.88.64 (Articles, the product of China related to Tranche 3 \$200B Action, as provided for in U.S. note 20(qqq)

to this subchapter, each covered by an exclusion granted by the USTR for imported merchandise subject to the exclusion).

- Per <u>85 FR 85831</u> Annex D, in addition to reporting the regular Chapters 34, 39, 40, 48, 52, 55, 61, 62, 63, and 90 classifications of the HTS for the imported merchandise, importers shall report the HTS classification 9903.88.65 (Articles, the product of China related to Tranche 4A \$300B Action, as provided for in U.S. note 20(rrr) to this subchapter, each covered by an exclusion granted by the USTR for imported merchandise subject to the exclusion).
- · Importers shall not submit the corresponding Chapter 99 HTS number for the Section 301 duties when HTS 9903.88.62, 9903.88.63, 9903.88.64, or 9903.88.65 are submitted.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Imports which have been granted a product exclusion from the Section 301 measures, and which are not subject to the Section 301 duties, are not covered by the Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) provisions of the Section 301 Federal Register notices, but instead are subject to the FTZ provisions in 19 CFR part 146.

To request a refund of Section 301 duties paid on previous imports of products granted duty exclusions by the USTR, importers may file a Post Summary Correction (PSC) if within the PSC filing timeframe. If the entry is beyond the PSC filing timeframe, importers may protest the liquidation if within the protest filing timeframe. The latest guidance on the process for submitting retroactive claims for product exclusions to CBP is found in CSMS 42566154.

In situations where an importer has requested a product exclusion and the request is pending with the USTR, importers or their licensed representative may submit a request to extend the liquidation of impacted unliquidated entry summaries to CBP.

Reminder: importers, brokers, and/or filers should refer to CSMS 39587858 (Entry Summary Order of Reporting for Multiple HTS when 98 or 99 HTS are required) for guidance when filing an entry summary in which a heading or subheading in Chapter 99 is claimed on imported merchandise.

For ease of reference, a summary of Section 301 duties and product exclusion notifications is attached.

CBP issues guidance for additional Sec. 232 Steel and Aluminum Product Exclusions and Revisions to Exclusion Process

On December 23, 2020, CBP issued <u>CSMS #45271041 - GUIDANCE: Additional Section 232 Steel and Aluminum Product Exclusions and Revisions to Exclusion Process</u>, which provides guidance on the Department of Commerce's December 14, 2020 interim final rule issuing new Section 232 exclusions. It is reproduced below:

BACKGROUND

On December 14, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) of the U.S. Department of Commerce published Federal Register (FR) Notice <u>85 FR 81060</u>, revising aspects of Commerce's process for requesting product exclusions from Section 232 measures on steel and aluminum imports, and issuing 123 new Section 232 exclusions. These new exclusions are called General Approved Exclusions (GAEs), and exclude 123 entire Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS) classifications from the Section 232 measures. The exclusions are effective for article entered for consumption, or withdraw n from w arehouse for consumption, on or after December 29, 2020.

The functionality for the acceptance of the GAEs will be available in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) as of 7 am eastern standard time, December 29, 2020.

GUIDANCE

BIS has granted 108 GAEs for steel products and 15 GAEs for aluminum products. GAEs may be used by any importer and have no quantitative limit. Exclusions are effective starting December 29, 2020, and no retroactive relief will be granted. Please review the list of excluded HTS classifications in the attached chart.

When an importer reports an excluded 10 digit HTS classification on an entry summary line, ACE will not require the Section 232 duties for that line. We note that the FR Notice states that, in order to use a GAE for an exclusion for Section 232 duties, the importer must reference the GAE identifier in the ACE system that corresponds to the steel or aluminum articles being imported. In ACE, the GAE identifiers are the excluded 10 digit HTS classifications. Importers should not report any other Section 232 exclusion number or Chapter 99 Section 232 HTS classification on an entry summary line when importing goods under a GAE.

This guidance only applies to Section 232 duty exclusions under a GAE. Separate guidance will be issued for entry summary reporting requirements for Section 232 quota exclusions under a GAE.

CUSTOMS, IMPORTS AND FOREIGN TRADE ZONES

CBP sets 2021 dates for customs broker's license exams

On December 31, 2020, On December 30, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>general notice</u> announces that CBP has changed the dates on which the semi-annual examination for an individual broker's license will be held in April and October 2021. The customs broker's license examination scheduled for April 2021 will be held on Wednesday, April 21, 2021, and the customs broker's license examination scheduled for October 2021 will be held on Thursday, October 21, 2021.

CBP publishes quarterly IRS interest rates

On December 30, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>general notice</u> that advises the public that the quarterly Internal Revenue Service interest rates used to calculate interest on overdue accounts (underpayments) and refunds (overpayments) of customs duties will remain the same from the previous quarter. For the calendar quarter beginning January 1, 2021, the interest rates for overpayments will be 2 percent for corpo-

rations and 3 percent for non-corporations, and the interest rate for underpayments will be 3 percent for both corporations and non-corporations. This notice is published for the convenience of the importing public and CBP personnel.

CBP issues country of origin marking rules for products of the West Bank and Gaza

On December 23, 2020, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the Federal Register a general notice (CBP Dec. 2019) that notifies the public that, for country of origin marking purposes, imported goods produced in the West Bank, specifically in Area C under the Israeli-Palestinian Interim Agreement (the Oslo Accords), signed on September 28, 1995, and the area known as "H2" under the Israeli-Palestinian Protocol Concerning Redeployment in Hebron and Related Documents (the Hebron Protocol), signed January 17, 1997, must be marked to indicate their origin as "Israel," "Product of Israel," or "Made in Israel." Goods produced in the West Bank, specifically in Areas A and B under the Oslo Accords and the area known as "H1" under the 1997 Hebron Protocol, must be marked to indicate their origin as "West Bank," "Product of West Bank," or "Made in West Bank." Goods produced in Gaza must be marked to indicate their origin as "Gaza," "Product of Gaza," "Made in Gaza," "Gaza Strip," "Product of Gaza Strip," or "Made in Gaza Strip." Imported goods from any of these territorial areas must not include "West Bank/Gaza," "West Bank/Gaza Strip," "West Bank and Gaza," or words of similar meaning.

The position set forth in this document is applicable as of December 23, 2020. A transition period will be granted for importers to implement marking consistent with this notice. Products from the West Bank or Gaza, when entered or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption into the United States after March 23, 2021, must be marked in accordance with the position set forth in this notice, for purposes of 19 U.S.C. 1304.

CBP issues guidance for GSP expiration on December 31, 2020

On December 21, 2020, CBP issued, <u>CSMS #45244051 - GUIDANCE: Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) Expires effective, December 31, 2020</u>, to inform the Trade that the Generalized System of Preferences (GSP), special program indicator (SPI) "A," "A+," and "A*", will expire on December 31, 2020 if no Congressional legislation is passed to renew the program. The CSMS states:

Until further notice, GSP eligible goods entered or withdrawnfromwarehouse need to pay "General" (column 1) duty rates effective, January 1, 2021, 12:00 am.

U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) encourages importers to continue to flag GSP eligible importations with SPI "A" during the lapse, starting January 1, 2021.

Importers may not file SPI "A" without paying duties. CBP has programming in place that, in the event that GSP is renewed with a retroactive refund clause, will allow CBP to automate the duty refund process.

CBP will continue to allow post-importation GSP claims made via post summary correction (PSC) and protest (19 USC 1514, 19 CFR 174) subsequent to the expiration of GSP, for importations made while GSP was still in effect. CBP will not allow post-importation GSP claims made via PSC or protest subsequent to the expiration of GSP, for importations made subsequent to expiration.

DHS/CBP extend land and ferry travel restrictions to/from Mexico and Canada

On December 22, 2020, Office of the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the Federal Register a notification of continuation of temporary travel restrictions at land ports of entry and ferries between the United States and Mexico from December 22, 2020 until January 21, 2021 [incorrectly stated as 2020 in the Federal Register]. For purposes of the temporary alteration in certain designated ports of entry operations authorized under 19 U.S.C. 1318(b)(1)(C) and (b)(2), travel through the land ports of entry and ferry terminals along the United States-Mexico border shall be limited to "essential travel." At this time, this Notification does not apply to air, freight rail, or sea travel between the United States and Mexico, but does apply to passenger rail, passenger ferry travel, and pleasure boat travel between the United States and Mexico.

On the same date, a <u>similar notification</u> was published by DHS/CBP in the *Federal Register* that continues to temporarily limit the travel of individuals from Canada into the United States at land ports of entry and ferries along the United States-Canada border through January 21, 2021 [incorrectly stated as 2020 in the *Federal Register*].

Given the definition of "essential travel" in each notification, the temporary alteration in land ports of entry operations should not interrupt legitimate trade between the two nations or disrupt critical supply chains that ensure food, fuel, medicine, and other critical materials reach individuals on both sides of the two borders. CBP issues WRO on cotton products made by Xinjiang Production and Construction Corps using prison labor

On December 2, 2020, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) announced that US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Office of Trade directed the issuance of a Withhold Release Order (WRO) against cotton products originating from the Xinjiang Production and Construction Corps (XPCC). in China based on information that reasonably indicates the use of forced labor, including convict labor. The WRO applies to all cotton and cotton products produced by the XPCC and its subordinate and affiliated entities as well as any products that are made in whole or in part with or derived from that cotton, such as apparel, garments, and textiles.

The WRO on XPCC cotton products is the sixth <u>enforcement action</u> that CBP has announced in the past three months against goods made by forced labor from China's Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region. In July 2020, the U.S. Government issued an <u>advisory</u> to caution businesses about the risks of forced labor in Xinjiang, where the Chinese government continues to execute a campaign of repression targeting the Uyghur people and other ethnic and religious minority groups.

Sec. 307 of the *Tariff Act of 1930*, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1307) prohibits the importation of merchandise mined, manufactured, or produced, wholly or in part, by forced labor, including convict labor, forced child labor, and indentured labor. This WRO will require detention at all U.S. ports of entry of all cotton products produced by the XPCC and any similar products that the XPCC produces. Importers of detained shipments are provided an opportunity to export their shipments or demonstrate that the merchandise was not produced with forced labor.

Detention Orders (Withhold Release Orders)

When information reasonably but not conclusively indicates that merchandise within the purview of 19 U.S.C. §1307 (forced or convict labor) is being imported, the Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) may issue with-

hold release orders pursuant to 19 C.F.R. § 12.42(e). The following withhold release orders were issued by the Commissioner during the period of coverage of this Update.

EXPORT CONTROLS AND SANCTIONS

NRC updates and clarifies rules for exports of nuclear material

On December 31, 2020, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) published in the Federal Register a final rule [NRC–2018–0294] amending its export and import regulations to maintain the regulatory status quo for nuclear exports to the United Kingdom (UK), upon the entry into force of a new civil nuclear cooperation agreement between the United States (US) and the UK (the US - UK 123 Agreement). The amendment will add the UK to the list of countries eligible to receive certain small quantities of special nuclear material under a general license, and to the list of countries whose export license applications do not require Executive Branch or Commission level reviews for certain exports of source material or low-enriched uranium. This amendment is necessary to bring the NRC's regulations into conformity with US Government foreign policy and preserve existing provisions for nuclear exports to the UK

FinCEN proposes recordkeeping and reporting requirements for certain transactions involving convertible virtual currency or digital assets

On December 23, 2020, the Treasury's Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN) published in the *Federal Register* a <u>notice of proposed rulemaking</u> to seek public comments on a proposal to require banks and money service businesses (MSBs) to submit reports, keep records, and verify the identity of customers in relation to transactions involving convertible virtual currency (CVC) or digital assets with legal tender status ("legal tender digital assets" or LTDA) held in unhosted wallets (as defined in the notice), or held in wallets hosted in a jurisdiction identified by FinCEN. FinCEN is proposing to adopt these requirements pursuant to the *Bank Secrecy Act* (BSA). To effectuate certain of these proposed requirements, FinCEN proposes to prescribe by regulation that CVC and LTDA are "monetary instruments" for purposes of the BSA. However, FinCEN is not proposing to modify the regulatory definition of "monetary instruments" or otherwise alter existing BSA regulatory requirements applicable to "monetary instruments" in FinCEN's regulations, including the existing currency transaction reporting

(CTR) requirement and the existing transportation of currency or monetary instruments reporting requirement. Written comments on this proposed rule may be submitted on or before January 4, 2021.

Commerce removes Hong Kong as a separate designation under the EAR

On December 23, 2020, the Commerce Department's Bureau of Industry and Security ("BIS") <u>amended</u> the Export Administration Regulations ("EAR"), in further implementation of <u>Executive Order 13936</u> ("EO 13936"), to remove provisions that provide differential and preferential treatment for exports, reexports, and transfers of items to Hong Kong as compared to China. As a result of these changes, Hong Kong will be removed as a separate destination on the Commerce Country Chart and in other places in the EAR, which will affect license exception availability and certain licensing policies and requirements for Hong Kong.

The amendments are the latest step taken by the Trump Administration to eliminate Hong Kong's differential and preferential treatment vis-à-vis mainland China and formalize or introduce conforming changes to the EAR implementing previously-issued guidance with respect to Hong Kong. Our blog posts on prior steps taken to eliminate Hong Kong's differential and preferential treatment under the EAR and EO 13936 are available here, here, and here, and here.

The amendments to the EAR include the following significant changes or clarifications:

- Alignment of Hong Kong's Commerce Country Chart and Country Group Entries with those of China: Hong Kong's Commerce Country Chart entry has been removed and Hong Kong's EAR license requirements are now covered by China's Commerce Country Chart entry. Hong Kong is now considered part of China, which is currently included in Country Groups D:1, D:3, D:4, and D:5, and is subject to all EAR limitations or authorizations applicable these Country Groups. Hong Kong was previously in Country Groups A:6 and B on the EAR's Country Group Chart, though license exceptions providing for differential and preferential treatment for Hong Kong were previously suspended, as described in further detail below.
- Removal of Hong Kong License Exception Suspension Provision (EAR § 740.2(a)(23)): Various license exceptions previously available for Hong Kong were suspended under EAR § 740.2(a)(23) following the implementation of BIS' July 31, 2020 final rule. Because Hong Kong's Commerce Country Chart and Country Group Entries have been aligned with those of China, this provision is no longer necessary to align Hong Kong's license exception availability with China, though the license exceptions suspended for Hong Kong under the July 31, 2020 rule remain unavailable. Our blog post on the July 31, 2020 final rule can be found here.
- Consolidation of Entity and Unverified List Entries: The Entity and Unverified List entries for Hong Kong are now merged into the applicable entries for China.
- Inapplicability of China End-User Statement Requirement: Part 748 of the EAR
 has been amended to clarify that PRC-issued end-user statements are not required for license applications for exports or reexports to Hong Kong, even
 though Hong Kong is now considered part of China in the EAR. Such end-user
 statements or other supporting documents for license applications involving Hong
 Kong may be requested on a case-by-case basis.
- Electronic Export Information ("EEI") Filing Requirements: Part 758 of the EAR has been amended to clarify that the EEI filing requirements for China apply to exports to Hong Kong, even if Automated Export System requirements state that the destination is to be listed as Hong Kong.

- China-Specific Licensing Policies: Certain licensing policies specific to China are now also extended to Hong Kong (e.g., nuclear nonproliferation (EAR § 742.3(b)), national security (EAR § 742.4(b)), and regional stability (EAR § 742.6(b))).
- Military End-Use and End-User Restrictions: Because Hong Kong is now treated as part of China (and Country Group D:1), exports to Hong Kong are subject to the military end-use and end-user provisions of EAR § 744.21. See our most recent blog post on the military end-use and end-user rules here. In addition, the restrictions on exports, reexports, and transfers of certain microprocessors to military end-uses and end-users in EAR § 744.17 now apply to Hong Kong.
- Expansion of Foreign Direct Product Licensing Requirements: Because it is now treated as a Country Group D:1 destination, Hong Kong is subject to the EAR's General Prohibition Three; i.e., the prohibition on exports of certain foreign-produced direct products of certain US-origin technology and software controlled for national security reasons.
- Addition to List of US Arms Embargoed Countries: The alignment of Hong Kong's Country Group entries with those of China are consistent with guidance previously issued by the State Department's Directorate of Defense Trade Controls that Hong Kong is now considered to be included in the entry for China under International Traffic in Arms Regulations § 126.1(d)(1). Destinations in Country Group D:5 are subject to the US arms embargo.
- Validated End-User Eligibility: End-users located in Hong Kong are now eligible to be added as validated end-users in Supplement No. 7 to Part 748 of the EAR.

The amendments result in Hong Kong being subject to the same license requirements, licensing exceptions, and provisions applicable to China under the EAR. Although some separate references to Hong Kong will remain in certain provisions of the EAR in recognition of Hong Kong's separate customs and export control systems, the amendments formalize the elimination of differential and preferential treatment for Hong Kong under the EAR.

BIS adds a "Military End User List" to the EAR consisting of 102 Chinese and Russian entities

On December 23, 2020, the US Commerce Department's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) issued a final rule amending the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) by adding a new "Military End User List" (MEU List) as supplement no. 7 to part 744 of the EAR. The final rule adds 102 entities to the MEU List, which will consist of Chinese, Russian, and Venezuelan entities that the US Government has determined are "military end users" for purposes of the MEU rule in EAR § 744.21. The final rule does not change the scope of the MEU rules but rather is intended as an effective way for BIS to inform potential exporters, reexporters, and transferors that all exports, reexports, or transfers (in-country) of specified items to the listed entities represent an unacceptable risk of use in or diversion to a "military end use" or a "military end user" and therefore require a license. For the April 28, 2020 amendment to the EAR that tightened the MEU rule, please see our prior blog post here.

The MEU rule imposes a license requirement on the export, reexport, or transfer (in-country) of items specified in supplement no. 2 to part 744 of the EAR to China, Russia, and Venezuela, when the exporter, reexporter, or transferor has knowledge that the item is destined for a "military end use" (as defined in EAR § 744.21(g)). Additionally, BIS may inform persons that a license is required for the export, reexport, or transfer

(in-country) of any item because there is an unacceptable risk of use in or diversion to such an end use or end user. With the creation of the MEU List, BIS is exercising its authority to inform exporters, reexporters, and transferors that a license will be required when an entity on the MEU List is a party (*i.e.*, purchaser, intermediate consignee, ultimate consignee, or end-user) to a transaction (*i.e.*, export, reexport, or in-country transfer) of any item listed in supplement no. 2 to part 744.

Prior to the final rule, exporters, reexporters, or transferors were responsible for identifying the listed entities as "military end users" themselves, assuming they were not otherwise individually informed by BIS pursuant to the "is informed" process. This task could be demanding even with the help of BIS's FAQs relating to the MEU rule. For a detailed analysis of these BIS FAQs, please see our prior blog post here. By creating the MEU List, BIS eases the public's compliance burden. That said, compliance remains the obligation of the exporters, reexporters, or transferors, who must still conduct due diligence for parties *not* on the MEU List, which is not an exhaustive listing of "military end users." In other words, entities not on the MEU List may still be determined to be "military end users" subject to the licensing requirement under the MEU rule, as long as the criteria outlined in EAR § 744.21(g) is met. For example, parties not on the MEU List but on the US Department of Defense's "List of Communist Chinese Military Companies" (the "DoD List") would raise a Red Flag under the EAR and would require additional due diligence by the exporter, reexporter, or transferor to determine whether a license is required under the MEU rule. It is worth noting that the MEU List and the DoD List are two separate lists compiled under different statutory standards. There are companies on the DoD List that are not on the MEU List, and the fact that a Chinese entity is included on the DoD List does not per se make that entity a "military end-user" under the MEU rule.

The entities identified in the final rule is only the first tranche of entities to the MEU List. Additional parties may be added to or deleted from the MEU List pursuant to a determination by the End-User Review Committee.

BIS adds Chinese multinationals to the Entity List and publishes FAQs about the Huawei FPDP rule

On December 22, 2020, the US Commerce Department's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published a <u>final rule</u> (Final Rule) in the *Federal Register* adding 77 entities and individuals to the Entity List, including several prominent Chinese multinationals (together, the "Designees"). The Final Rule took effect on December 18, 2020. On the same day, BIS also published <u>FAQs</u> related to its recent expansion of the foreign-produced direct product rule (the "Huawei FPDP Rule").

Entity List Designations

In press statements (here not here released with the Entity List designations, the US Commerce Department explained that the bases for the designations included activities by Designees in the Chinese military industrial complex; land reclamation and the coercion of coastal states in the South China Sea; human rights abuses; the acquisition of US-origin items in support of People's Liberation Army programs; and the theft of US trade secrets. As a result of these Entity List designations, no supplier – US or non-US, wherever located – may export, reexport, or transfer (in country) any commodity, software, or technology ("items") subject to the Export Administration Regulations ("EAR") to a Designee or where

a Designee is a purchaser, intermediate consignee, ultimate consignee or enduser, unless licensed by BIS.

For most of the Designees, BIS will review license applications with a presumption of denial, with narrow exceptions (e.g. for certain entities, case-by-case review for items related to the detection and treatment of infectious disease). BIS will review license applications related to certain Designees for items "uniquely" required for production of semiconductors at advanced technology nodes (10 nanometers and below, including extreme ultraviolet technology) with a presumption of denial, and license applications for all other items on a case-by-case basis

In addition, no EAR license exceptions may be used for exports/reexports/transfers of items subject to the EAR to the Designees or where a Designee is a purchaser, intermediate consignee, ultimate consignee or end-user. Our prior blog posts on other recent additions of Chinese entities to the Entity List are available here, here, and here.

New FAOs about the Huawei FPDP Rule

Separately, BIS published on its website new FAQs to provide guidance about the recent expansion of the EAR's Huawei FPDP Rule, which primarily targets Huawei's acquisition of semiconductors that are the direct product of US technology or software. Our prior blog posts on the initial and revised versions of the expanded Huawei FPDP Rule are available here and here. Among the points made in the FAQs, the following were noteworthy:

- FAQ 9 clarifies that the expanded Huaw ei FPDP Rule does not impose a licensing requirement for the servicing or repair of an item lawfully exported prior to the implementation of the Huaw ei FPDP Rule. That said, other licensing requirements set out in the EAR may still apply, including in connection with providing replacement parts for Huaw ei equipment.
- FAQ 13 provides that if Company A sells items subject to the Huaw ei FPDP Rule to Company B, which will incorporate a percentage of Company A's items into products that are not subject to the Huaw ei FPDP Rule or otherwise subject to the EAR, and Company A knows that that some of Company B products are destined to Huaw ei, an export license will be required for Company A's initial export, reexport, or transfer (in-country) of those items to Company B. In addition, FAQ 13 stipulates that when Company A knows that some percentage of the items subject to the Huaw ei FPDP Rule it sells to Company B are destined for Huaw ei but does not know which items, or what percentage of the items will be incorporated into Company B products, Company A should ask for that information from Company B. If no information is provided by Company B, the guidance provides that an export license would be required for all of Company A's items that will be exported, reexported, or transferred (in-country) to Company B.
- FAQ 24 provides that the direct product of US softw are used in the product engineering stage of the production of a cellphone would be "w hatever the U.S. software produces," and that "[i]n most cases [that] would be the product design," which may be subject to the Huaw ei FPDP Rule. It also provides that the cellphone itself may separately be subject to the EAR under the de minimis rule or another provision of the FPDP Rule. This guidance may be relevant to analyses of the role US software plays in the early stages of production processes under the Huaw ei FPDP Rule.

OFAC introduces the non-SDN menu based sanctions list and sanctions Turkey's Primary Defense Procurement Entity for procuring the S-400 missile system from Russia

The Non-SDN Menu-Based Sanctions List

On December 14, 2020, the US Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) published a new Non-SDN Menu-Based Sanctions List ("NS-MBS List"). The NS-MBS List is not the result of new sanctions but rather is designed as a reference tool to identify persons subject to certain non-blocking menu-based sanctions, including certain sanctions described in Section 235 of the Countering America's Adversaries Through Sanctions Act (CAATSA), as implemented by Executive Order 13849, and the Ukraine Freedom Support Act of 2014, as amended by CAATSA.

The NS-MBS List is distinct from OFAC's <u>List of Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons ("SDN List")</u> or OFAC's <u>List of Foreign Financial Institutions Subject to Correspondent Account or Payable-Through Account Sanctions ("CAPTA List")</u>. When asset blocking is chosen as a menu-based sanction and imposed on a person, that person is identified solely on the SDN List with any other non-blocking menu-based sanctions imposed on that person also identified on the SDN List entry. When only non-blocking menu-based sanctions are imposed on a person, that person will be placed on the NS-MBS List. In addition to the sanctioned person's name and other relevant identifiers, the NS-MBS List will also specify the sanctions measures imposed and the legal authority for the sanctions.

The information available in the NS-MBS List is included in the data associated with <u>OFAC's Consolidated Sanctions List</u>, and a search of that list will therefore include a search of the NS-MBS List.

The State Department and OFAC Sanction Turkey's Presidency of Defense Industries for Weapon Procurement from Russia

On December 14, 2020, OFAC also imposed non-blocking menu-based sanctions on the Republic of Turkey's Presidency of Defense Industries ("SSB"), Turkey's primary defense procurement entity with responsibilities in defense industrial development. SSB was sanctioned pursuant to Section 231 of CAATSA for knowingly engaging in a significant transaction with Rosoboronexport ("ROE"), Russia's main arms export entity, by procuring the S-400 surface-to-air missile system. Section 231 of CAATSA requires the imposition of at least five of the twelve sanctions described in Section 235 of CAATSA on any person determined to have knowingly engaged in a significant transaction with a person that is a part of, or operates for or on behalf of, the defense or intelligence sectors of the Russian government. ROE is identified on the CAATSA "List of Specified Persons" ("LSP") for operating on behalf of the defense sector of the Russian government.

The State Department, in consultation with OFAC, has imposed the following non-blocking menu-based sanctions on SSB, which is the first and only entity on the NS-MBS List to date:

- a prohibition on loans or credits by US financial institutions to SSB totaling more than \$10 million in any 12-month period (Section 235(a)(3));
- a prohibition on granting specific US export licenses and authorizations for any goods or technology transferred to SSB (Section 235(a)(2));

- a ban on US Export-Import Bank assistance for exports to SSB (Section 235(a)(1));
- a requirement for the United States to oppose loans benefitting SSB by international financial institutions (Section 235(a)(4)); and
- the imposition of full asset blocking and visa restrictions (Section 235(a) (7), (8), (9), (11), and (12)) on four of SSB's principal executive officials, including the president and vice president. These four individuals have been added to the SDN List with the chosen menu-based sanctions listed in their respective SDN List entries.

In its <u>press release</u>, the US Department of Statement indicated that the sanctions are not intended to undermine the military capabilities or combat readiness of Turkey or any other US ally or partner, but rather to impose costs on Russia "in response to its wide range of malign activities."

US Government removes Sudan from State Sponsor of Terrorism list

On December 14, 2020, the US Government <u>announced</u> Sudan's removal from the list of State Sponsors of Terrorism (the "SST List"). This rescission of Sudan as an SST follows an agreement in October for Sudan to be removed from the list and the lapse of a 45 day congressional notification period. The federal register notice regarding the rescission is available <u>here</u>. As detailed in our previous blog post <u>here</u>, the US Government revoked Sudan sanctions in October 2017, but Sudan's continuing inclusion on the SST List resulted in lingering stringent export and investment restrictions. The removal of Sudan from the SST List marks another fundamental change in removing trade restrictions and encouraging greater collaboration and support for transactions with Sudan.

As a result of Sudan's removal from the SST List, several export controls and sanctions provisions will likely be revised, though we note that to date, such changes have <u>not</u> yet been implemented. The regulations that remain in place but are expected to be lifted and/or revised in due course are as follows:

- Export Controls Revisions: The revocation of the sanctions are anticipated to effectuate changes in the export/reexport controls related to Sudan under the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), which are maintained by the US Commerce Department's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS). This would include the removal of Sudan from Country Group E:1 (terrorist supporting countries) in Supplement No. 1 to EAR Part 740, which would ultimately result in (i) a change of applicable de minimis level of US content in foreign-made items destined for Sudan from 10% to 25% and (ii) a change in certain licensing exceptions. Though according to the Reginfo.qov website such changes are under review, they have not yet been implemented.
- OFAC General License: With the lifting of sanctions on Sudan while it remained on the SST List, the Treasury Department was obligated to continue requiring licenses for certain exports/reexports to Sudan of agricultural commodities, medicine, and medical devices pursuant to the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000. Since June 2018 such items have been authorized via a general license encompassed in Section 596.506 of the Terrorism List Government Sanctions Regulations, which authorizes all exports/reexports of agricultural commodities, medicine, or medical devices to the Government of Sudan or to any entity in Sudan or to any person in a third country purchasing for resale to any of the foregoing, provided that shipment was made within 12 months of signing a contract for export/reexport.. (See previous Federal Register notice.) With the removal of Sudan from the SST List, we would anticipate such licensing re-

quirements to no longer be necessary, and thus the elimination of the general license is likely on the horizon. Though OFAC has not implemented such changes to date, Secretary Mnuchin issued a <u>statement</u> providing that the rescission of Sudan from the SST List opens a new chapter in US-Sudanese relations.

• Other Restrictions: Lastly, the removal of Sudan from the SST List means that the restrictions on economic assistance, financial transactions, and other activities under federal statutes no longer apply.

The removal of Sudan from the SST List does not and is not anticipated to impact in the future the following regulations related to Sudan:

- Darfur Sanctions: OFAC sanctions related to the conflict in Darfur remain in place, and US Persons remain prohibited from engaging in any transactions with Specially Designated Nationals (SDNs) identified under the [DARFUR] tag on OFAC's Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons List ("SDN List").
- Dealings with Sudanese SDNs: US Persons remain prohibited from engaging in dealings with Sudanese SDNs designated pursuant to any sanctions authorities other than <u>Executive Order 13412</u>, including, e.g., SDNs designated for activities related to South Sudan (i.e., identified under the [SOUTH SUDAN] tag on the SDN List) or terrorism-related activities (i.e., identified under the [SDGT] tag on the SDN List).

In a related matter, on December 23, 2020, the Department of State published in the Federal Register a determination by the Secretary of State [Public Notice: 11287], in accordance with section 5 of Presidential Proclamation No. 6958, of November 22, 1996 that the suspension of entry into the United States of members or officials of the Government of Sudan (GOS) and members of the Sudanese armed forces is no longer necessary and should be terminated given the termination of the restrictive measures in UN Security Council Resolution 1054 and its successor resolution UNSCR 1070, and the significant shift in U.S. foreign policy toward Sudan following the installation of the new Sudanese Civilian-Led Transitional Government. Restrictions imposed in said proclamation, pursuant to Section 212(f) and 215 of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. 1182(f) and 3 U.S. Code section 301 shall therefore lapse, and said proclamation shall terminate effective immediately.

Four additional Chinese entities subject to restriction on US securities transactions

On December 3, 2020, the Department of Defense <u>announced</u> its third list of "Communist Chinese military companies" operating in the United States, pursuant to Section 1237 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 1999, as amended ("Section 1237"). The practical impact of the announcement is that these four companies become subject to <u>Executive Order 13959</u>, which restricts US investment in these companies. The first and second lists also issued pursuant to Section 1237 are found <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>.

The following companies are identified this time:

- 1. China Construction Technology Co. Ltd.;
- 2. China International Engineering Consulting Corp.;
- 3. China National Offshore Oil Corp. ("CNOOC"); and
- 4. Semiconductor Manufacturing International Corp. ("SMIC")

Executive Order 13959 prohibits US persons from acquiring publicly traded securities of companies identified pursuant to Section 1237, effective 60 days following their designation, *i.e.*, starting February 1, 2021. Transactions made solely to divest from securities held in the above companies as of February 1, 2021 will be authorized until December 3, 2021. This third round of identifications bring the total to 35 entities identified under Section 1237. Subsidiaries of identified companies are not subject to the securities restrictions unless they are also listed. State extends temporary suspensions, modifications and exceptions due to Covid19

On December 11, 2020 the Department of State published in the *Federal Register* a <u>document</u> [Public Notice: 11274] t to inform the public of a second extension to certain temporary suspensions, modifications, and exceptions to certain provisions of the *International Traffic in Arms Regulations* (ITAR) to provide for continued telework operations during the current SARS-COV2 public health emergency. This extension will terminate on June 30, 2021 unless otherwise extended in writing by the Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC). This action is taken in order to ensure continuity of operations among members of the regulated community.

BIS issues correcting amendments to Wassenaar Arrangement 2018 Plenary Decisions implementation; and other revisions related to national security controls

On December 4, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published in the Federal Register amendments [Docket No. 201118–0305] to the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) by making corrections to address errors that were inadvertently introduced with the September 11, 2020, Federal Register publication of "Wassenaar Arrangement 2018 Plenary Decisions Implementation; and Other Revisions Related to National Security Controls (Final Rule)".

BIS seeks comments on the impact of the CWC on legitimate business activities

On December 1, 2020, the Bureau of Industry and Security published in the *Federal Register* a notice of inquiry [Docket No. 201118-0304] seeking public comments on the impact that implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC), through the *Chemical Weapons Convention Implementation Act of 1998* and the *Chemical Weapons Convention Regulations*, has had on commercial activities involving "Schedule 1" chemicals during calendar year 2020. The purpose of the notice of inquiry is to collect information to assist BIS in its preparation of the annual certification to the Congress on whether the legitimate commercial activities and interests of chemical, biotechnology, and pharmaceutical firms are harmed by such implementation. This certification is required under Condition 9 of Senate Resolution 75 (April 24, 1997), in which the Senate gave its advice and consent to the ratification of the CWC. Comments must be received by December 31, 2020.

PERU

AD/CVD anti-circumvention law enacted

On 11 December 2020, the President signed <u>Law № 31089</u>, a law that addresses the avoidance of anti-dumping and countervailing duties and provides procedures for investigating allegations of such activities. It was published in *El Peruano* on 12 December. The purpose of the law is to combat circumvention, in order to effectively counteract distortions caused by unfair practices, guaranteeing a greater balance in the process of insertion of Peru into world trade. Article 4 of the law provides an illustrative list of circumvention practices.

AUSTRALIA

PACER Plus enters into force 13 December 2020

The Pacific Agreement on Closer Economic Relations (PACER) Plus will enter into force on 13 December 2020. Goods must meet the requirements outlined in Division 1GA of Part VIII of the *Customs Act 1901* (Customs Act) to be considered Pacific Islands originating goods. Schedule 8A of the *Customs Tariff Act 1995* (Customs Tariff Act) outlines the preferential rates of customs duty that apply to Pacific Islands originating goods. All Pacific Islands originating goods classified to tariff subheadings that are not listed in Schedule 8A have a 'Free' rate of customs duty at entry into force of PACER Plus. Excise-equivalent goods that

are classified to tariff subheadings listed in Schedule 8A will be indexed with the equivalent rates listed in Schedule 3 of the Customs Tariff Act.

The preferential rates of customs duty for Pacific Islands originating goods will be available on the Online Tariff from the entry into force of the agreement. The Parties to PACER Plus are Australia, Cook Is., Kiribati, New Zealand, Niue, Samoa, Solomon Is. and Tonga.

MALAYSIA

Malaysia Refines its Service Tax on Imported Digital Services In brief

Malaysia caught up with the global trend of taxing cross-border supplies of digital services by introducing a 6% service tax on imported digital services (SToDS), starting January 1, 2020. That said, unlike similar goods and services tax (GST) or value-added tax (VAT) regimes in other countries, the Malaysian SToDS regime imposes the tax on both individual and business consumers in Malaysia, which took most Malaysian businesses by surprise.

Business raised various concerns regarding the implications of the widening of the service tax net to capture cross-border supplies of digital services and the Malaysian government has since introduced measures to refine the SToDS regime in response to the concerns raised.

European Union and EFTA

EU, UK reach post-BREXIT deal at last minute!

On 24 December 2020, European Commission President Ursula von Der Leyen and UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson <u>announced</u> that the European Union and the United Kingdom had reached an agreement on their future trading relationship. The agreement comes just a week before the UK's transition period ends. If an agreement had not been reached, goods from the UK would be subject to WTO duties and quotas. The agreement requires the approval of all 27 EU member states, as well as the both the British and EU parliaments, although it may be provisionally applied before all approvals are obtained. The UK transition period will end on 31 December.

EU export controls: Updated Dual-Use List enters into force

On 7 October 2020, the European Commission adopted the revised Annex I (the "Dual-Use List") to Regulation 428/2009 (the "Dual-Use Regulation") (see here). The new Dual-Use List came into force on 15 December 2020.

The Dual-Use List is refreshed on an annual basis to take into account updates to international non-proliferation regimes and export control arrangements. The latest updates reflect changes from reviews carried out by the Wassenaar Arrangement in particular, and also from reviews by the Australia Group, the Missile Technology Control Regime and the Nuclear Suppliers Group.

Key changes to note including the following:

Cyber Security Controls

- New entry in respect of systems, equipment and components for defeating, weakening or bypassing "information security" (5A004.b) – including a Technical Note and two related decontrol notes.
- New entry for certain "softw are" specially designed for monitoring or analysis by law enforcement (5D001.e.1., .2.) including new Technical Notes 1 and 2, and a related decontrol note.

Cryptographic Items Decontrols

- A number of important amendments have been made to the cryptography decontrols in 5A002, as follows:
 - 5A002.a., Note 2.f. rew ritten to cover items "w here the "information security" functionality is limited to w ireless "personal area network" functionality, implementing only published or commercial cryptographic standards".
 - 5A002.a., Note 2.h. entry amended to include "gatew ays", where "the "information security" functionality is limited to the tasks of "Operations, Administration or Maintenance" implementing only published or commercial cryptographic standards".
 - 5A002.a. entry amended to state that control applies where the cryptographic capability "is usable, has been activated, or can be activated by any means other than secure "cryptographic activation"".

Electronics

 New Technical Note added for the control on computational lithography software (3D003), which defines computational lithography as "the use of computer modelling to predict, correct, optimise and verify imaging performance of the lithography process over a range of patterns, processes, and system conditions".

Pharmaceutical

 Inclusion of an explicit decontrol note for "vaccines" in 1C353, and the addition of "Middle East respiratory syndrome-related coronavirus" as a new virus in IC351.

Machine Tools

2B001 – new Note 4 added, stating that machine tools "having an additive manufacturing capability in addition to a turning, milling or grinding capability" must be evaluated against each applicable control entry.

Other Key Changes

- New control entry for "sub-orbital craft" (9A004): This is defined as a craft having
 an enclosure designed for the transport of people or cargo which is designed to
 operate above the stratosphere, perform a non-orbital trajectory, and land back
 on Earth with the people or cargo intact.
- Aerospace: Amendment to the entry for turbojet and turbofan engine (9A101.a.1. .a.2.) and new Technical Note for clarification on determination of specific fuel consumption (9A101.a. Technical Note 2) and amendment to the control entry in respect of "fan blades" (9E003.a.11).
- Chemicals: New entries for 24 chemicals, including Novichok nerve agent precursors (1C350.66. to 1C350.89).

Commission issues tariff classification regulations

Amendments to the CN Explanatory Notes

No amendments to the *Explanatory Notes to the Combined Nomenclature of the European Union* were published in the *Official Journal* during the period covered by this Update.

Binding Tariff Information

The European Community has created the Binding Tariff Information (BTI) system as a tool to assist economic operators to obtain the correct tariff classification for goods they intend to import or export.

Since 1 October 2019 all BTI correspondence between the economic operator and the customs authority is happening through the <u>Trader Portal</u>. This includes among others applications by economic operators for BTI decisions, requests by the customs authority for further information on the product being classified and the economic operators' replies to those questions. A list of customs authorities designated by Member States for the purposes of receiving applications, or taking decisions relating to binding tariff information may be found <u>here</u>.

Depending on the Member State an economic operator has to access either the <u>EU Customs trader portal</u> or the <u>national trader portal</u>. You can search and consult existing BTIs on the <u>EBTI-database</u>.

Import-export related measures

The following import, export or antibribery measures were published in the online editions of the official gazettes of the countries shown during the period covered by this Update. SWITZERLAND

Switzerland extends sanctions against Belarus

On 11 December, the Swiss Federal Council extended sanctions against Belarus. Financial sanctions and travel bans were imposed on 15 individuals, including President Alexander Lukashenko. The new measures entered into force at 6pm on 11 December. The sanctions are in line with the decisions taken by the EU on 6 November 2020. The 15 persons newly added to the list in Annex 1 to the Ordinance on Measures against Belarus are alleged to be responsible for the use of violence and arbitrary arrests following the contested elections in Belarus. Those subject to the sanctions include President Alexander Lukashenko and his son and national security advisor, Viktor Lukashenko. The individuals concerned have been banned from entering or travelling through Switzerland. Their assets are to be frozen and must be reported to SECO without any delay. The Federal

Council also decided to amend the Ordinance to include an embargo on armaments and goods that may be used for internal repression. The EU imposed a similar embargo already in 2011. Switzerland has to date largely implemented that embargo based on its existing war material and dual-use goods legislation. In adopting the embargo on armaments and goods that may be used for internal repression, the Swiss Government is reacting to the ongoing repression of civil society and opposition groups in Belarus. On 12 October 2020, in response to the events following the presidential elections, the competent Department already added the names of 40 persons to the sanctions list in the Annex to the Ordinance. Switzerland thereby followed the precedent of EU, which had imposed sanctions on 2 October 2020. Also in line with the EU, the Swiss Government first decided to take coercive measures against Belarus on 28 June 2006. The Ordinance on Measures against Belarus, together with its annex on individuals, entities and organisations that are subject to sanctions, has since been revised on several occasions. The Ordinance has now been completely revised in order to adopt the new measures.

EU, UK reach post-BREXIT deal at last minute!

On 31 December, the European Union (Future Relationship) Act 2020 passed Parliament and received Royal Assent. It approves and implements the Trade and Cooperation Agreement with the EU and makes further provision in connection with the United Kingdom's future relationship with the EU and its member States; and makes related provision about passenger name record data, customs and privileges and immunities. On the same date, the Minister for the Cabinet Office made SI 2020/1662 - The European Union (Future Relationship) Act 2020 (Commencement No. 1) Regulations 2020. These Regulations bring into force provisions of the European Union (Future Relationship) Act 2020 (c. 29) ("the Act"), the Bill for which received Royal Assent earlier in the day on which these Regulations were made. These are the first commencement regulations under the Act. Regulation 2 brings the majority of the provisions set out in these Regulations into force on IP completion day and regulation 3 brings other provisions into force on 1st March 2021. "IP completion day" is defined in Schedule 1 to the Interpretation Act 1978 (c. 30) by reference to section 39(1) to (5) of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020 (c. 1) and means 31st December 2020 at 11 p.m..

UK and Viet Nam sign Free Trade Agreement

On 11 December 2020, the UK and Viet Nam jointly announced the conclusion of the *UK-Viet Nam Free Trade Agreement* (FTA). The announcement said that the UK and Viet Nam enjoy excellent diplomatic relations and increasingly common goals. This is demonstrated by the renewing of the UK-Viet Nam Strategic Partnership for a further ten years in September this year. The Partnership provides a framework for a strong bilateral relationship and outlines key priorities, including low-carbon development, multilateralism, the promotion of human rights, and trade. Under Viet Nam's effective role as chair of ASEAN in 2020, the UK has

taken the significant step of requesting to become a Dialogue Partner of ASEAN. The announcement further stated:

- 1. The UK and Viet Nam share a strategic commitment to global trade, and the free flow of capital and investments. The bilateral Free Trade Agreement provides vital continuity for our fast-growing and dynamic trading relationship. In 2019, UK businesses exported goods to Viet Nam worth over £600 million. In the same year, Vietnamese businesses exported goods to the UK worth around £4.6 billion.
- The bilateral FTA locks in benefits of our existing trading relationship through the EU-Viet Nam Agreement. Trade in goods ranging from clothing and footwear to seafood and pharmaceutical products can continue uninterrupted. Trade in services, in particular financial services and e-commerce, can continue to flourish.
- 3. Companies can continue to benefit from reduced tariffs on imports and exports, from increased access to services and from the protection of key British and Vietnamese products. This includes 65% of all tariffs that have already been eliminated on UK-Vietnam trade. This will increase to 99% of tariffs by the time of full implementation. Vietnam stands to benefit from tariff savings of £114 million on Vietnamese exports. For UK exports, this figure will be £36 million.
- 4. This bilateral agreement therefore represents the beginning of a new phase in the relationship between our two countries in developing key areas of trade. Not only does the FTA liberalise goods and services trade, it incorporates many other important elements, such as working towards clean growth and sustainable development.
- 5. This agreement is also a key step towards the UK joining the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP). As a founding member of the group, Vietnam has welcomed the UK's interest in joining the CPTPP agreement and publicly shown their support for the UK's accession to the CPTPP in the future. Accession to the CPTPP is a priority for the UK Government, which plans to apply for this in early 2021. CPTPP is one of the most important free trade agreements in the world, accounting for 13% of global GDP in 2019. This would rise to 16% of global GDP if the UK were to join. The UK and Vietnam look forward to working closely on this.

Trade Continuity Agreement with Canada replicates the effects of the EU-Canada Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA)

On 10 December 2020, the Department for International Trade (DIT) published a <u>summary of the Trade Continuity Agreement with Canada</u>, The agreement establishes an economic partnership between the UK and Canada, including a comprehensive free trade area. It maintains the effects of the EU-Canada CETA.

The UK-Canada agreement covers:

- trade in goods including provisions on preferential tariffs, tariff rate quotas and rules of origin
- sanitary and phytosanitary measures
- trade in services
- intellectual property, including geographical indications
- government procurement

The agreement is intended to take effect from 1 January 2021 (or as soon as possible thereafter).

UK announces new approach on US tariffs

On 8 December 2020, the Department for International Trade (DIT) <u>announced</u> its independent approach to the longstanding trade conflicts between the EU and US around steel, aluminium and aerospace tariffs.

To defend the UK steel industry, International Trade Secretary Liz Truss is rolling over tariffs in response to the unjustified 'Section 232' tariffs imposed by the US on aluminium and steel imports. These tariffs will continue from January 1st when the UK becomes an independent trading nation once again.

The Department for International Trade will launch a consultation to ensure these tariffs are shaped to UK interests and tailored to the UK economy, based on evidence and input from key stakeholders. Details of the scope and timing of the consultation will be confirmed in due course.

In parallel, the UK government is suspending retaliatory tariffs resulting from the Boeing dispute in an effort to bring the US towards a reasonable settlement and show that the UK is serious about reaching a negotiated outcome. The government reserves the right to impose tariffs at any point if satisfactory progress towards an agreeable settlement is not made.

The twin announcements are part of the government's strategy to de-escalate trade tensions so the US and UK can move forward to the next phase of their trading relationship, and ultimately draw a line under a dispute that harms industry on both sides of the Atlantic.

UK government publishes guidance on UK implementation of EU Blocking Regulation post-Brexit

The UK Department for International Trade has recently published guidance on how the UK will transpose and implement the EU Blocking Regulation (Council Regulation (EC) 2271/96) post-Brexit.

The EU Blocking Regulation seeks to counter the extra-territorial impact of certain US sanctions (the "proscribed US sanctions"), currently in respect of Iran and Cuba (please see our previous blog post on updates of the EU Blocking Regulation in respect of Iran here). During the transition period, the EU Blocking Regulation continues to have direct effect in the UK. However, from 1 January 2021, the EU Blocking Regulation and Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2018/1101 will form part of the retained EU law applying in the UK.

The UK Government's guidance provides details on how the UK will implement and enforce the EU Blocking Regulation regime post-Brexit, and includes details on the following aspects of the UK's regime:

- Juris dictional scope of "Protected persons" i.e. the UK persons and entities
 w hich (i) are prohibited from "complying" w ith the proscribed US sanctions, (ii)
 must report to the UK Secretary of State for International Trade w here their economic interests have been affected by the proscribed US sanctions, and (iii) may
 recover damages caused by the proscribed US sanctions;
- Enforcement for breaches of the UK's regime breaches will continue to be criminal offences, how ever in line with the current approach under the EU Blocking Regulation, the guidance notes that the intention of the legislation is to protect UK persons from the extraterritorial effect of the relevant US legislation;
- Licensing the guidance sets out how protected persons may apply for an authorisation from the Secretary of State for International Trade to "comply" with the

proscribed US sanctions post-Brexit. The guidance notes that applying for a licence from relevant US authorities in respect of the proscribed US sanctions would amount to "complying" with those sanctions and thus require authorisation under the retained EU Blocking Regulation. It is clarified that existing authorisations granted in the EU prior to (but not after) the end of the transition period will remain valid in the UK.

- Reporting the guidance sets out the notification requirements where a protected person's economic interests have been affected by the proscribed US sanctions, noting that a contact form will be available and the Secretary of State for International Trade will consider whether to investigate the notified matter; and
- Damage recovery the guidance re-iterates the ability of protected persons to recover damages arising from the application of the proscribed US Sanctions.

The UK government's guidance follows the prior publication of the UK Statutory Instrument on the transposition of the EU Blocking Regulation into UK law post-Brexit (The Protecting Against the Effects of the Extraterritorial Application of Third Country Legislation (Amendment) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019).

New figures released for export controls fines against UK exporters show enforcement on the increase

- The Department for International Trade has revealed in a <u>notice</u> to exporters that HMRC has received settlements totalling £700,368.01 for export control violations between March and September 2020.
- Fines of up to £211,250 were issued to exporters across 19 settlement actions for unlicensed exports of dual use goods, military goods and related activity controlled by the Export Control Order 2008. This is the highest annual total for export control fines to date.
- HMRC has a discretionary power to impose civil monetary penalties in lieu of criminal prosecution for violations of the UK's export control laws. These powers to issue monetary penalties exist alongside prosecutorial enforcement options, which can result in the imposition of criminal fines or imprisonment. Depending on the seriousness of the offence, any intent, compliance steps taken, and other aggravating and mitigating factors, HMRC may decide to issue a compound penalty, for example if the exporter has taken remedial actions to correct compliance issues and has voluntarily made a full and comprehensive disclosure of violations.
