On 15 February 2021, the WTO [announced](#) that its members made history when the General Council agreed by consensus to select Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala of Nigeria as the organization's seventh Director-General. When she takes office on 1 March, Dr Okonjo-Iweala will become the first woman and the first African to be chosen as Director-General. Her term, renewable, will expire on 31 August 2025.

CANADA

Canada imposes additional sanctions against Myanmar officials for human rights violations

On 18 February 2021, Canada [announced](#) sanctions against 9 Myanmar military officials, under the *Special Economic Measures (Burma) Regulations* (the Regulations). With the addition of these 9 individuals Canada now imposes sanctions against 54 individuals and 44 entities. The sanctions imposed by the Regulations include a prohibition on persons in Canada and Canadians outside of Canada from dealing in any property of listed individuals or providing financial or related services to them.

The newly listed individuals are all senior officials in Myanmar's military that were either directly involved in the coup d'état perpetrated by the Myanmar Armed Forces, or

are members of the military regime's new governing body, the State Administrative Council. The names of the newly listed individuals are:

Government of Canada lists 13 new groups as terrorist entities and completes review of seven others

On February 3, 2021, [Public Safety Canada](#) announced that the Government of Canada has placed 13 new groups on the *Criminal Code* list of terrorist entities, including four ideologically motivated violent extremist groups: Atomwaffen Division, the Base, the Proud Boys and Russian Imperial Movement.

In addition, Canada has also listed:

- three Al Qaida affiliates: Jama'at Nusrat Al-Islam Wal-Muslimin, Front de Libération du Macina, and Ansar Dine
- five Daesh affiliates: Islamic State West Africa Province, Islamic State in the Greater Sahara, Islamic State in Libya, Islamic State East Asia, and Islamic State - Bangladesh
- Hizbul Mujahideen

Based on their actions, each group meets the legal threshold for listing as set out in the *Criminal Code*, which requires reasonable grounds to believe that an entity has knowingly participated in or facilitated a terrorist activity, or has knowingly acted on behalf of, at the direction of, or in association with such an entity.

The *Criminal Code* mandates severe penalties for people and organizations that deal with property or finances of a listed entity. A listing can also support the denial or revocation of a Canadian organization's charitable status if it maintains connections to listed entities. Furthermore, persons seeking entry into Canada may be inadmissible if they are found to be associated with a listed entity. A listing also helps to facilitate the removal of an entity's online content.

The Government of Canada will continue to identify and target entities that meet the threshold for listing, regardless of their ideology, as a means to apply significant consequences on these groups and the individuals that support them.

US Government imposes sanctions against Burma

On February 10, 2021, President Biden issued [Executive Order 14014](#) “Blocking Property with Respect to the Situation in Burma” (EO 14014), which provides for the imposition of sanctions on certain Burmese parties in response to the Burmese military’s coup against the democratically elected civilian government in Burma. In parallel with the issuance of EO 14014, the US Treasury Department’s Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) designated [thirteen parties](#) on February 10, 2021 and [two parties](#) on February 22, 2021 connected to the military apparatus responsible for the coup. OFAC terminated the previous Burma sanctions program on October 7, 2016 through the issuance of Executive Order 13742. Our blog post on the termination of the previous Burma sanctions regime is available [here](#).

Further, on February 17, 2021, the US Commerce Department’s Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) issued a [notification](#) that it will apply a presumption of denial for license applications for the export and re-export of items to Burma’s military and security services.

EO 14014 Sanctions

The new sanctions target those who played a leading role in the overthrow of Burma’s democratically elected government and do not prohibit dealings with Burma or the Government of Burma per se. Unlike past sanctions against Burma, the new sanctions also do not restrict investment or the export of financial services to Burma. Rather, EO 14014 authorizes the designation as a Specially Designated National

(“SDN”) of any party determined by OFAC, in consultation with the Department of State, to:

- operate in the Burmese defense sector;
- be responsible for or complicit in actions or policies that (a) undermine democratic processes in Burma, (b) threaten Burma’s peace, security or stability, (c) prohibit, limit or penalize the exercise of freedom of expression or assembly or access to print, online or broadcast media, or (d) constitute arbitrary detention or torture or other serious human rights abuses;
- be a leader or official of (a) the Burmese military or security forces, (b) the Government of Burma on or after February 2, 2021, or (c) an entity that has engaged in activities described above or is designated under EO 14014 as a result of the leader’s or official’s tenure;
- be a political subdivision, agency or instrumentality of the Government of Burma or that is owned or controlled by or that has acted on behalf of the military or security forces of Burma or any person designated under the order;
- be a family member of an individual who is designated pursuant to EO 14014; or
- have materially assisted or supported an SDN designated pursuant to EO 14014.

“US Persons” are generally prohibited from engaging in transactions involving SDNs and any entities 50% or more owned by these SDN and property and interests in property of an SDN that comes within the United States or within the possession or control of a US Person must be blocked. The term “US Persons” include (i) entities organized under US laws and their non-US branches, (ii) individuals or entities in the United States, and (iii) US citizens or permanent resident aliens (“Green Card” holders) wherever located or employed.

Export Restrictions

Effective February 17, 2021, BIS will apply a presumption of denial for items requiring a license for export and reexport to Burma’s Ministry of Defense, Ministry of Home Affairs, armed forces, and security services. BIS is also suspending certain license exceptions, in whole or in part, that were previously available to Burma as a result of its current Country Group placement under the *Export Administration Regulations* (EAR), including Shipments of Limited Value (LVS), Shipments to Country Group B Countries (GBS), Technology and Software under Restriction (TSR), and Computers (APP).

In addition, BIS has [announced](#) that it is revoking certain previously issued licenses to these departments and agencies that have not been fully utilized, and that it is assessing additional actions relating to Burma, such as Entity List designations, adding Burma to the list of countries subject to the EAR’s military end use and end user (MEU) and military intelligence end use and end user (MIEU) restrictions, and downgrading Burma’s Country Group status in the EAR.

US Government issues Executive Order to address the use of US IaaS products by foreign malicious cyber actors

On January 19, 2021, then President Trump issued [Executive Order 13984](#) (“EO 13984”), “Taking Additional Steps To Address the National Emergency With Respect to Significant Malicious Cyber-Enabled Activities” which amends and expands Executive Order 13694 of April 1, 2015, to detect and deter the use of US infrastructure as a service (“IaaS”) products by foreign malicious cyber actors. Specifically, EO 13984

directs the US Department of Commerce (Commerce) to (i) issue regulations to detect and deter the use of US IaaS products in malicious cyber-enabled activities primarily via identity verification requirements and to (ii) coordinate with other US government agencies to impose “special measures” against certain foreign persons and/or foreign jurisdictions.

There is no immediate regulatory change resulting from EO 13984, and the Biden administration may or may not delay or change the implementation of the regulations directed under EO 13984. However, cloud service providers and other IT service providers should closely monitor for any proposed regulations or other developments. Below we provide a summary of key issues under EO 13984.

Identity Verification Requirements

EO 13984 directs Commerce to propose regulations by July 18, 2021 (“Proposed Regulations”) to require US IaaS providers to verify the identity of foreign persons using their services. In doing so, the Proposed Regulations must set forth the minimum standards for US IaaS providers to verify the identity of foreign IaaS account holders, including:

- the documentation and procedures required to verify the identity of foreign lessees/sub-lessees of IaaS products;
- records that US IaaS providers must maintain regarding foreign IaaS account holders (e.g., a foreign account holder’s name, national identification number, address, payment methods, and associated financial identifiers, including credit card number, email address, phone number, IP address, and date and time of the foreign account holder’s activities in connection with the account); and
- methods for securing the above information.

However, Commerce may also exempt any US IaaS provider if Commerce finds that such US IaaS provider complies with security best practices to otherwise deter abuse of IaaS products.

US IaaS provider is defined as any United States person (US citizen, lawful permanent resident, entity organized under the laws of the United States or any jurisdiction within the United States (including foreign branches) or any person located in the United States) that offers an “IaaS product”, itself defined to mean *“any product or service offered to a consumer, including complementary or ‘trial’ offerings, that provides processing, storage, networks, or other fundamental computing resources, and with which the consumer is able to deploy and run software that is not predefined, including operating systems and applications. The consumer typically does not manage or control most of the underlying hardware but has control over the operating systems, storage, and any deployed applications...”* The definition of IaaS product is not limited to “dedicated” environments and expressly includes *“‘virtualized’ products and services, in which the computing resources of a physical machine are split between virtualized computers accessible over the internet.”*

“Special Measures” for Certain Foreign Jurisdictions or Foreign Persons

EO 13984 also directs the Proposed Regulations to address “special measures” for IaaS providers to take against certain foreign jurisdictions and/or foreign persons. “Special measures” can include prohibitions or conditions on the opening or maintaining of an “IaaS Account,” including a “Reseller Account,” in respect of:

- (i) a foreign jurisdiction which has a significant number of foreign persons offering or obtaining US IaaS products to be used for malicious cyber-enabled activities (i.e., activities that

seek to compromise or impair the confidentiality, integrity, or availability of computer, information, or communications systems, networks, physical or virtual infrastructure controlled by computers or information systems, or information resident thereon); and

(ii) a foreign person who has a pattern of offering or obtaining US laaS products to be used in malicious cyber-enabled activities.

“laaS Account” means a formal business relationship established to provide laaS products to a person in which details of such transactions are recorded, and “Reseller Account” means an laaS account established to provide laaS products to a person who will then offer those products subsequently, in whole or in part, to a third party.

EO 13984 also requires Commerce to consider several factors before imposing “special measures” against a foreign jurisdiction: (i) evidence that foreign malicious cyber actors have obtained US laaS products offered in that foreign jurisdiction; (ii) the extent to which that foreign jurisdiction is a source of malicious cyber-enabled activities; and (iii) the difficulty in detecting and punishing malicious activities involving US laaS products and relating to that jurisdiction. Regarding a foreign person, Commerce should consider (i) the extent to which a foreign person uses or offers US laaS products for malicious cyber-enabled activities vis-à-vis legitimate purposes; and (ii) effective alternatives to the imposition of special measures.

EO 13984 also directs Commerce and other agencies to engage and solicit feedback from industry by May 19, 2021 on how to increase information sharing and collaboration among US laaS providers and between US laaS providers and relevant agencies. Agencies are also required to submit a report to the President by September 16, 2021, to give recommendations on encouraging information sharing and collaboration as well as on facilitating the defection of laaS accounts and activities that involve foreign malicious cyber actions.

While EO 13984 raises important concerns with respect to implementing safeguards to reduce the use of laaS products and services in the United States by malicious foreign actors, the standards that will be addressed in the Proposed Regulations may have a significant impact on many businesses operating in the United States given the broad definition of laaS products. EO 13984 does not address any of the concerns that might be raised with respect to what measures can be implemented to respect individual privacy rights, nor does it address what measures can be taken to minimize the potential additional liability of requiring companies to store and maintain certain categories of sensitive personal data, including financial account information. For now, companies currently providing laaS products should continue to monitor and evaluate Commerce’s actions and look for opportunities to engage in meaningful industry dialogue with Commerce on the scope of such Proposed Regulations.

USITC determines that increased imports of fresh, chilled, or frozen blueberries do not seriously injure US Industry

On February 11, 2021, the US International Trade Commission (USITC) [determined](#) that fresh, chilled, or frozen blueberries are not being imported into the United States in such increased quantities as to be a substantial cause of serious injury, or the threat of serious injury, to the domestic industry producing an article like or directly competitive with the imported article.

The determination was made in the context of an investigation [Inv. No. TA-201-077] initiated on September 29, 2020, under section 202 of the *Trade Act of 1974* (19 U.S.C. § 2252) at the request of the US Trade Representative.

As a result of 5-0 vote, the investigation will end, and the USITC will not recommend a remedy to the President. The USITC will submit its report containing its injury determination and the basis for it to the President by March 29, 2021.

USTR confirms 2021 TRQs for UK exports

On February 8, 2021, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) confirming that the United Kingdom (UK) in 2021 continues to be eligible to export under US tariff-rate quotas (TRQs) allocated to the member countries of the European Union (EU) pursuant to Additional US Notes (AUSN) 6, 16 to 23, and 25 to Chapter 4 and Note 5 to Chapter 24 of the *Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States* (HTSUS). Under the above AUSNs the United States maintains TRQs for imports from specific countries or customs areas, including the EU (designated in the HTSUS as the EU27 and including the UK).

Additional information about certain dairy TRQs is available in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's notice *Information on Dairy Import Licenses for the 2021 Tariff-Rate Quota (TRQ) Year – United Kingdom Designation of Importers for Dairy Import Licenses* (85 FR 70127), which provides, in part, that for the 2021 quota year, the UK Government may designate importers for licenses for the quantities of cheese that have historically been supplied by UK exporters under designated licenses for Cheese and Curd (Note 16), Blue Mold (Note 17), and Cheddar (Note 18)

USTR declines to adjust Sec. 301 action in Large Civil Aircraft dispute

On February 12, 2021, the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) stating that the USTR together with the affected United States industry have agreed that it is unnecessary at this time to revise the action in the Section 301 investigation involving the enforcement of US rights in the World Trade Organization (WTO) dispute involving Large Civil Aircraft subsidies provided by certain current or former member States of the European Union. The USTR will continue to consider the action taken in the investigation.

The most recent revision to the list of goods subject to additional duties was effective on January 12, 2021. See 86 FR 674 (January 6, 2021). In light of the recent revision, USTR has agreed with the affected US industry that it is unnecessary at this time to revise the action. The USTR will continue to consider the action taken in this investigation.

Biden reverses Trump's adjustments on UAE aluminum imports and reinstates 10% duty

On February 1, 2021, before Proclamation 10139 (described below) was to take effect, President Biden issued [Proclamation 10144](#) revoking Proclamation 10139 and restoring the 10% duties for the UAE.

[Proclamation 10139 of January 19 - Adjusting Imports of Aluminum Into the United States](#), modified the terms of Proc. 9704 of March 8, 2018, imposing a 10% additional ad valorem duty on aluminum imports from most countries under section 232 of the *Trade Expansion Act of 1962*, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1862). Proclamation 10139 added the United Arab Emirates (UAE) to the list of countries exempt from the 10% additional duties and replaced the 10% duties with a quota and made corresponding changes to the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States. The changes were to be effective for aluminum articles entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. EST on February 3, 2021,

.CBP GUIDANCE ON SECS. 201, 232 AND 301 ACTIONS

CBP issued guidance on the UAE Sec. 232 aluminum quotas but then issued CSMS continuing previous procedures

On January 27, 2021, CBP issued [CSMS #45967303 - United Arab Emirates Section 232 Aluminum Absolute Quota limits beginning February 3, 2021](#), to implement [Presidential Proclamation 10139](#). However, on February 1, 2021, President Biden revoked Proclamation 10139 before it was to take effect and restored the 10% duties for aluminum from the UAE. As a result, CBP issued [CSMS #46027083 - United Arab Emirates Section 232 Aluminum Presidential Proclamation 10139 REVOKED February 1, 2021](#), which stated that UAE aluminum imports will continue to be processed as established under Section 232 duty filing.

State proposes extension and amendment of US-Egypt Cultural Property Agreement

On February 5, 2021, the Department of State published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) [Public Notice: 11347] proposing to extend and amend the *Memorandum of Understanding Concerning the Imposition of Import Restrictions on Categories of Archaeological Material of the Arab Republic of Egypt* pursuant to 19 U.S.C. §

2602(f)(1). A copy of the Memorandum of Understanding, the Designated List of categories of material restricted from import into the United States, and related information can be found at the [Cultural Heritage Center website](#).

State receives Albanian request for cultural property protection

On February 5, 2021, the Department of State published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) [Public Notice: 11346] of receipt on November 9, 2020, of a request for cultural property protection from the Government of the Republic of Albania, under Article 9 of the 1970 UNESCO *Convention on the Means of Prohibiting and Preventing the Illicit Import, Export and Transfer of Ownership of Cultural Property*. Albania's request seeks US import restrictions on archaeological and ethnological material representing Albania's cultural patrimony. A public summary of Albania's request and information about US implementation of the 1970 UNESCO Convention will be available at the [Cultural Heritage Center web site](#).

DHS/CBP extend land and ferry travel restrictions to/from Mexico and Canada

On February 23, 2021, Office of the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a [notification of continuation of temporary travel restrictions](#) at land ports of entry and ferries between the United States and Mexico from February 22, 2021 until March 21, 2021. For purposes of the temporary alteration in certain designated ports of entry operations authorized under 19 U.S.C. 1318(b)(1)(C) and (b)(2), travel through the land ports of entry and ferry terminals along the United States-Mexico border shall be limited to "essential travel." At this time, this Notification does not apply to air, freight rail, or sea travel between the United States and Mexico, but does apply to passenger rail, passenger ferry travel, and pleasure boat travel between the United States and Mexico.

On the same date, a [similar notification](#) was published by DHS/CBP in the *Federal Register* that continues to temporarily limit the travel of individuals from Canada into the United States at land ports of entry and ferries along the United States-Canada border through March 21, 2021.

Given the definition of "essential travel" in each notification, the temporary alteration in land ports of entry operations should not interrupt legitimate trade between the two nations or disrupt critical supply chains that ensure food, fuel, medicine, and other critical materials reach individuals on both sides of the two borders. COAC to hold meeting on March 17, 2021

On February 19, 2021, US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) published in the *Federal Register* a [notice](#) [Docket No. USCBP-2021-0006] that the Commercial Customs Operations Advisory Committee (COAC) will hold its quarterly meeting on Wednesday, March 17, 2021. The meeting will be open to the public via webinar only. There is no on-site, in-person option for this quarterly meeting. The webinar link and conference number will be provided to all registrants by 5:00 p.m. EDT on March 16, 2021. See notice for information on how to register. Comments must be submitted in writing no later than March 16, 2021.

The COAC will hear from the current subcommittees on the topics listed below and then will review, deliberate, provide observations, and formulate recommendations on how to proceed:

1. The **Next Generation Facilitation Subcommittee** will provide an update on the following working groups: the Unified Entry Processes Working Group will provide an update on the current status of the development of objectives for the future entry environment to enable faster and more secure entry processing; the Emerging Technologies Working Group will provide an update on the University of Houston's block chain assessment report; and, the One U.S. Government Working Group will provide an update on several key projects, including the Partner Government Agency Disclaim Handbook and the automation of currently required original/hard copy documents at time of entry.

2. The **Rapid Response Subcommittee** will provide an update on the progress of the Broker Exam Modernization Working Group efforts to improve the testing experience for the April 2021 exam, as well as future broker exams. The U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) Working Group has reconvened and will provide an update regarding its goals and objectives.

3. The **Intelligent Enforcement Subcommittee** will provide updates on the following Working Groups: the Bond Working Group will report on the continued work with CBP on the Monetary Guidelines of Setting Bond Amounts as part of a larger risk-based bonding initiative; the Anti-Dumping and Countervailing Duty (AD/CVD) Working Group will report on the discussions surrounding non-resident importers and the impact this has on AD/CVD enforcement along with recommended solutions; the Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Process Modernization Working Group will provide updates on development of several recommendations put forth during the April 2020 COAC meeting and will submit recommendations furthering the modernization of the IPR Process; and, the Forced Labor Working Group will provide a summary of the areas of focus that will be in its scope for the upcoming quarter.

4. The **Secure Trade Lanes Subcommittee** will present updates on the following Working Groups: the Trusted Trader Working Group's progress in developing the CBP White Paper for the Implementation of C-TPAT Trade Compliance Requirements for Forced Labor; the In-Bond Working Group's ongoing work with the technical enhancements that have been shared with the Trade Support Network, as well as the review of regulatory recommendations for future development; the Export Modernization Working Group's progress in developing the Export Operations for the 21st Century White Paper mentioned during the October 7, 2020 COAC meeting; and, the Remote and Autonomous Cargo Processing Working Group's progress reviewing the various modes of conveyance and automation opportunities.

EXPORT CONTROLS AND SANCTIONS

OFAC issues General License 1A concerning restrictions on Communist Chinese Military Companies and related FAQs

On January 27, 2021, the US Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) issued [General License 1A](#), "Authorizing Transactions Involving Securities of Certain Communist Chinese Military Companies," (GL 1A) in relation to OFAC's Communist Chinese Military Companies (CCMCs) sanctions program as implemented pursuant to Executive Order 13959 ("EO 13959") and amended by Executive Order 13974. OFAC concurrently published frequently asked questions (FAQs) [878](#) and [879](#), which clarify OFAC's previous guidance on subsidiary entities with names that "closely match" the name of a CCMC. Our blog posts on EO 13959 and OFAC's prior guidance on the CCMC sanctions program are available [here](#) and [here](#).

As with the original GL 1, GL 1A authorizes US persons to engage in all transactions and activities otherwise prohibited by EO 13959 involving publicly traded securities (as well as publicly traded securities that are derivative of, or are designed to provide investment exposure to such securities) of any entity whose name "*closely matches, but does not exactly match,*" the name of a company on OFAC's [Non-SDN Communist Chinese Military Companies List](#) ("NS-CCMC List"). This authorization has been extended until 9:30 a.m. eastern daylight time on May 27, 2021 (from the original January 28, 2021 cut-off.)

New to GL 1A is paragraph (b), which provides that GL 1A does **not** authorize transactions involving publicly traded securities of entities identified on the NS-CCMC List or otherwise identified pursuant to EO 13959, including subsidiary entities that were added to the NS-CCMC List on January 8, 2021, *i.e.*, CNOOC Limited, China Mobile Limited, China Telecom Corporation Limited, China Unicom (Hong Kong) Limited ("Listed CCMC Subsidiaries"). A note to GL 1A clarifies that the Listed CCMC Subsidiaries are considered to have been added to the NS-CCMC List on January 8,

2021, such that the prohibitions of EO 13959 on transactions involving these entities' publicly traded securities would apply 60 days after the listing, *i.e.*, March 9, 2021.

GL 1A and FAQs 878 and 879 appear to have been issued in part to clarify prior OFAC guidance suggesting that CCMC sanctions under EO 13959 would automatically apply to subsidiaries of listed CCMCs if a subsidiary's name "*closely matches*" the name of its listed parent. That earlier guidance appeared to conflict with FAQ [857](#), which indicates that non-listed subsidiaries are not automatically covered by EO 13959. This contradiction had resulted in uncertainty as to whether the Listed CCMC Subs were considered to have been added to the NS-CCMC List on January 8, 2021 or on the earlier date their parent companies were added to the NS-CCMC List. Given that the restrictions take effect 60 days after such listing, this is an important distinction.

Now, the addition of the Note to GL 1A along with FAQs 878 and 879 make clear that CCMC subsidiaries with names that "*closely match*" the names of their listed parent companies are **not** considered to be subject to the same sanctions until such time as they themselves are added to the NS-CCMC List or until GL 1A expires.

Trump Administration designates Ansarallah and issues humanitarian general licenses; Biden Administration issues general license temporarily authorizing most Ansarallah transactions

On January 19, 2021, the US State Department [designated](#) Ansarallah, a political movement and militia group in Yemen also known as the Houthis, as a Foreign Terrorist Organization (FTO) and Specially Designated Global Terrorist (SDGT), and also designated three of its leaders as SDGTs. OFAC designated Ansarallah on the Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons List ("SDN List") and updated the entries for the same individuals on the SDN List who had already been designated under other sanctions programs. Concurrently, OFAC issued four general licenses (GLs) to help facilitate the flow of humanitarian assistance to Yemen that would otherwise be prohibited as a result of the designations and published three FAQs. After President Biden was inaugurated, OFAC [issued](#) an additional GL on January 25, 2021 that temporarily authorizes most otherwise prohibited transactions involving Ansarallah or any entity in which Ansarallah directly or indirectly owns a 50% or greater interest (hereinafter, "Ansarallah") until 12:01 AM EST on February 26, 2021.

The five GLs related to Ansarallah are the following:

- [GL No. 9](#) authorizes transactions and activities involving Ansarallah that are for the conduct of the official business of the US government.
- [GL No. 10](#) authorizes transactions and activities involving Ansarallah that are for the conduct of the official business of the United Nations, the International Committee of the Red Cross, and the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies. The GL also says that it does not authorize transactions or activities involving the Iranian Red Crescent Society.
- [GL No. 11](#) authorizes NGOs to engage in transactions and activities involving Ansarallah that are ordinarily incident and necessary to activities in support of a range of humanitarian, democracy building, educational, non-commercial development, and environmental protection activities in Yemen. The authorized transactions include the processing and transfer of funds, the payment of taxes, fees, and import duties, and the purchase or receipt of permits, licenses, or public utility services.

- [GL No. 12](#) authorizes transactions and activities involving Ansarallah that are ordinarily incident and necessary to the export or reexport of agricultural commodities, medicine, medical devices, replacement parts and components for medical devices, or software updates for medical devices to Yemen, or to persons in third countries purchasing specifically for resale to Yemen. The GL also says that it does not relieve exporters from compliance with US export control laws.
- [GL No. 13](#) temporarily authorizes all transactions and activities involving Ansarallah that would otherwise be prohibited in connection with its designation as an SDGT and FTO until 12:01 AM EST on February 26, 2021. The GL also indicates that it does not authorize the unblocking of any funds in Ansarallah accounts that were blocked as of 12:01 AM EST on January 25, 2021 or authorize any transactions or activities with any other SDNs, including the three designated Ansarallah leaders.

The following points in OFAC's FAQs concerning the implications of the Ansarallah designations and the scope of the GLs are noteworthy:

- [FAQ 875](#) indicates that GLs Nos. 9-12 are intended to facilitate the "uninterrupted flow of humanitarian assistance and certain other critical commodities to the people of Yemen."
- [FAQ 876](#) indicates that non-US persons may engage in or facilitate transactions involving Ansarallah without risking exposure to secondary sanctions under the counter-terrorism-related Executive Order 13224 ("EO 13224") provided that such activities would be authorized under GLs Nos. 9-13 if engaged in by a US person. It also indicates that non-US financial institutions do not risk exposure to correspondent and payable-through account sanctions under EO 13224 if they knowingly conduct or facilitate a transaction on behalf of Ansarallah that would be authorized under GLs Nos. 9-13 if engaged in by a US person.
- [FAQ 877](#) indicates that US and non-US persons may provide COVID-19-related humanitarian assistance in Yemen according to the terms of GLs Nos. 9-12. In particular, it indicates that GL No. 12's authorizations extend to the export and reexport of items that may be used against COVID-19, including personal protective equipment, respirators and masks, ventilators, and a variety of other related items.

BIS amends the EAR to enhance certain end-use and end-user controls as well as controls on certain activities of US Persons

On January 15, 2021, the Commerce Department's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published an [interim final rule](#) ("Rule") amending various provisions of the *Export Administration Regulations* (EAR) to implement certain provisions of the *Export Control Reform Act of 2018* (ECRA). Among other things further outlined below, the Rule imposes new restrictions on specific activities of US persons. By way of brief background, the EAR generally controls transactions involving US origin items (i.e., goods, software, technology) regardless of whether US or non-US persons are involved. One narrow exception to this has existed prohibiting certain nuclear activities by US persons regardless of whether they involve items subject to the EAR. This Rule expands such controls on the activities of US persons.

Though the Rule was set to take effect on March 16, 2021, reports indicate that its implementation could be delayed due to a regulatory freeze put in place by the Biden Administration, as [announced](#) on January 20, 2021, by the White House. We therefore anticipate further guidance as to whether the current administration will implement the Rule and, if so, when prior to its effective date.

I. Expanding Restrictions on Specific Activities of US Persons

The current EAR § 744.6 already imposes license requirements on US persons' specific activities in connection with nuclear explosive devices, missiles, chemical or biological weapons, and whole plants for chemical weapons precursors. The Rule expands these existing restrictions by

- broadening the scope of activities restricted as to US persons in EAR §§ 730.5, 734.5, and 736.2(b)(7) to include not only activities in connection with nuclear explosive devices, missiles, chemical and biological weapons, and whole plants for chemical weapons precursors, but also activities supporting military intelligence end-uses and end-users absent a license from BIS;
- expanding the destinations with respect to which US persons' activities are restricted (i) in connection with nuclear explosive devices to include any country not included in the list of "Countries Not Subject to Certain Nuclear End-Use Restrictions" (contained in Supplement No. 3 to Part 744) and (ii) in connection with certain "missile" end uses to include Cuba; and
- making several changes to EAR § 744.6, including,
 - broadening the scope of prohibited activities of US persons to include not only exports and reexports, but any acts of shipping or transmitting, which serves to emphasize that the restrictions on US persons' activities apply to foreign-origin items not subject to the EAR;
 - providing a list of examples of types of activities that are licensable as to US persons;
 - imposing licensing requirements for those US persons that "support" the end-uses and end-users enumerated in EAR § 744.6, with the term "support" broadly defined; and
 - adding a new restriction on the activities of US persons that support certain "military-intelligence end uses" and "military-intelligence end-users," as these terms are defined in the newly added EAR § 744.22(f) (see below).

BIS clarifies in the Rule that the scope of US person activities controlled under EAR § 744.6 does not include activities that are subject to regulatory controls (*i.e.*, a license requirement or general prohibition) administered by a federal agency other than the Department of Commerce (such as the Department of Energy, the Department of State, and the Department of the Treasury).

II. Broadening Restrictions on Military-Intelligence End-Uses and End-Users

In April 2020, BIS amended the EAR § 744.21 to tighten military end-use and end-user controls against China, Russia, and Venezuela. As amended at that time, EAR § 744.21 imposed a license requirement on the export, reexport, and transfer (in-country) of items listed in Supplement No. 2 to Part 744 of the EAR to military end-uses or military end-users in China, Russia, or Venezuela. Please see our [prior blog post](#) for details about the amendments.

This Rule adds a new EAR § 744.22, which imposes supplemental license requirements on the export, reexport, or transfer (in-country) of ***all items subject to the EAR*** when the items are intended for "military-intelligence end-uses" or "military-intelligence end-users" in China, Russia, Venezuela, or a country in Country Groups E:1 and E:2 (currently including Cuba, Iran, North Korea, and Syria). Conforming changes were also made to military end-use/end-user controls in EAR § 744.21 so as to avoid licensing overlap between the provisions. According to the Commerce Department's [press release](#), the foreign military-intelligence organizations impacted by the amendments are:

- Cuba's Directorate of Military Intelligence (DIM) and Directorate of Military Counterintelligence (CIM)
- China's Intelligence Bureau of the Joint Staff Department
- Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps Intelligence Organization (IRGC-IO) and Ar-tesh Directorate for Intelligence (J2)
- North Korea's Reconnaissance General Bureau (RGB)
- Russia's Main Intelligence Directorate (GRU)
- Syria's Military Intelligence Service
- Venezuela's General Directorate of Military Counterintelligence (DGCIM).

III. Expanding Restrictions on Certain Chemical and Biological Weapons End-Uses

The existing EAR § 744.4 imposes license requirements on exporting, reexporting, or transferring (in-country) an item subject to the EAR if the item is intended for certain end-uses in connection with chemical or biological weapons in or by any country or destination. To advance US weapons of mass destruction (WMD) nonproliferation policy as set forth in ECRA, BIS amends EAR § 744.4 by expanding the scope of restricted end-uses by adopting a broader definition of “use”, as well as broadens the scope of restricted items. Below please find a chart illustrating the amendments.

IV. Activities Associated with “Use”

Sections 744.3 and 744.4 of the EAR, respectively, impose license requirements on the exports, reexports, or transfers (in-country) of all items subject to the EAR for specified end-uses (including “use”) in connection with certain rocket systems, unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), or chemical or biological weapons. Likewise, EAR 744.6 imposes a license requirement on specific US person activities in support of certain end uses in connection with nuclear explosive devices, rocket systems, UAVs, or chemical or biological weapons. BIS is expanding the definition of “use” in each of EAR §§ 744.3, 744.4, or 744.6 to make clear that any one of the following activities (and not all activities together) would trigger a license requirement: operation, installation (including on-site installation), maintenance (checking), repair, overhaul, or refurbishing).

V. Establishing Restrictions on Transactions Intended to Circumvent Entity List-Based License Requirements

EAR § 744.11 imposes license requirements on a transaction to which an entity on the Entity List (Supplement No. 4 to Part 744 of the EAR) is a “party”. The Entity List-based license requirements generally only apply to listed entities and not to parties that are not on the Entity List but are affiliated with listed entities (e.g., parties that co-located with, or that are subsidiaries, parent companies, or sister companies, of the listed entity). However, transactions involving affiliated parties give rise to risks that an affiliated entity is acting as an agent, front, or a shell company for the listed entity to circumvent the license requirement, or that the items in the transaction may ultimately be diverted to the listed entity.

This addition is consistent with other provisions of Part 744 (i.e., EAR §§ 744.2(b), 744.3(b), 744.4(b), 744.9(b), 744.17(b), 744.21(b), and 744.22(b)) that authorize BIS to inform exporters, reexporters, or transferors of a license requirement based on an unacceptable risk of use in, or diversion to, specified end-uses or end-users.

Comments on the Rule must be received by BIS by March 1, 2021.

BIS implements the rescission of Sudan’s designation as a State Sponsor of Terrorism

On January 14, 2021, the US Commerce Department’s Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) [amended](#) the *Export Administration Regulations* (EAR) to remove Sudan’s designation as a State Sponsor of Terrorism (SST) (the “Amendments”). The Amendments implement the rescission of Sudan as an SST as announced by the Trump Administration in December 2020 by removing Anti-Terrorism (AT) and related controls on Sudan, which had remained in force following the US Government’s revocation of comprehensive sanctions in October 2017. Our previous blog posts on these developments are available [here](#) and [here](#).

Although list-based sanctions remain in force targeting certain Sudanese persons and designating them as Specially Designated Nationals (SDNs), the removal of Sudan’s SST designation eliminates licensing requirements under the EAR for a number of items destined to Sudan. On January 19, 2021, BIS also issued a set of [Frequently Asked Questions](#) (“Sudan SST Rescission FAQs”) that provide guidance on the changes brought about by the Amendments.

Amendments to the EAR

The Amendments to the EAR include the following significant changes:

- Removal of Anti-Terrorism (AT) Controls and Removal from Country Group E:1/Changes to License Review Policy:** The Amendments remove AT controls from Sudan, which has therefore also been removed from Country Group E:1. As a result, EAR § 742.10 (Anti-Terrorism: Sudan) has been removed in its entirety. Pursuant to § 742.10 of the EAR, a license was previously required for the export/reexport to Sudan of all items on the Commerce Control List (CCL), including items controlled for AT reasons only, and license applications for such exports/reexports were subject to a general policy of denial. Sudan is now subject to licensing requirements applicable to items on multilateral export control lists and certain items subject to unilateral controls for Crime Control (CC) or Regional Stability (RS) reasons. License applications for exports/reexports to Sudan will now be dependent upon the relevant items’ reasons for control, the end-uses, and the end-users.

- **Change to Applicable *De Minimis* Level:** The EAR apply to foreign-made items outside the United States that contain more than a *de minimis* amount of controlled US-origin content by value. Sudan's removal from Country Group E:1 raises the applicable *de minimis* level for most items destined to Sudan to 25 percent. This 25 percent *de minimis* level also applies to certain foreign-made encryption items that are destined for Sudan and that meet criteria specified in EAR § 734.4(b)(1). There is no *de minimis* level for foreign-made items that incorporate US-origin 9×515 or "600 series" paragraphs a. through x. content when such items are destined to Sudan.
- **Addition to Country Group B and Availability of EAR License Exceptions:** Sudan has been added to Country Group B. Generally, countries in Country Group B are eligible for a broad range of license exceptions and are subject to flexible license review policies, and exports/reexports to Sudan are now eligible for a range of EAR license exceptions, provided that the relevant eligibility criteria are met. However, exports/reexports destined to Sudan are not eligible for License Exceptions Shipments to Country Group B Countries (GBS) (EAR § 740.4) or Technology and Software under Restriction (TSR) (EAR § 740.6).

The Amendments do not affect list-based sanctions maintained by the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) relating to the conflicts in Darfur and South Sudan. US Persons remain prohibited from engaging in any transactions with Sudanese Specially Designated Nationals designated under the Sudan Darfur and South Sudan OFAC sanctions programs or for terrorism-related activities.

Sudan SST Rescission FAQs

BIS' Sudan SST Rescission FAQs clarify the impact the Amendments will have on certain items and on current licenses for items controlled only for AT reasons. The FAQs confirm that a license is no longer required for the permanent export or reexport of civil aircraft to Sudan and that aircraft on temporary sojourn to Sudan no longer need to rely on License Exception Aircraft, Vessels or Spacecraft (AVS) (EAR § 740.150). The FAQs also emphasize that telecommunications items with encryption capabilities still require a license for export/reexport to Sudan if the item is controlled for any other reason than AT in the CCL. Importantly for current license holders, the FAQs note that transfers of items that are controlled only for AT reasons and that are currently in Sudan must be reauthorized by BIS if the terms of the current license prohibit in-country transfers of the items.

CHINA (INCLUDING HONG KONG SAR)

China and New Zealand sign free trade agreement upgrade protocol

The Ministry of Commerce (MOFCOM) [announced](#) that on January 26th, 2021, Wang Wentao, China's Commerce Minister, and Damien O'Connor, New Zealand's Minister for Trade and Export Growth, held a virtual meeting to sign the *Protocol on Upgrading the Free Trade Agreement between the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Government of New Zealand*.

Areas covered by the FTA Upgrade

The Upgrade improves upon the FTA's existing commitments and adds to the 2008 Agreement in a number of areas including:

- Technical barriers to trade
- Customs procedures, cooperation and trade facilitation
- Rules of origin
- Goods market access
- Services
- Competition policy
- E-commerce
- Agricultural cooperation
- Environment
- Government procurement

The Chinese government said that the “Upgrading Protocol” goes beyond the “Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement” (RCEP). China has further

expanded the opening up of aviation, education, finance, pension, and passenger transportation to New Zealand. New Zealand has relaxed the review threshold for Chinese investment and confirmed that it will grant Chinese investment the same review threshold treatment as members of the *Comprehensive and Progressive Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement (CPTPP)*.

The two parties will perform relevant domestic procedures as soon as possible, so that the Upgrade will take effect as soon as possible.

The European Community has created the Binding Tariff Information (BTI) system as a tool to assist economic operators to obtain the correct tariff classification for goods they intend to import or export.

Since 1 October 2019 all BTI correspondence between the economic operator and the customs authority is happening through the [Trader Portal](#). This includes among others applications by economic operators for BTI decisions, requests by the customs authority for further information on the product being classified and the economic operators' replies to those questions. A list of customs authorities designated by Member States for the purposes of receiving applications, or taking decisions relating to binding tariff information may be found [here](#).

Depending on the Member State an economic operator has to access either the [EU Customs trader portal](#) or the [national trader portal](#). You can search and consult existing BTIs on the [EBTI-database](#).

The UK imposes additional sanctions against Myanmar officials for human rights violations

On 18 February 2021, the UK [announced](#) sanctions against Myanmar military generals for serious human rights violations, which come into force immediately. The Foreign Secretary Dominic Raab has announced there are 3 individuals subject to immediate asset freezes and travel bans for serious human rights violations by the military and police force (these are in addition to the current 16 sanctioned individuals). These individuals are:

1. General Mya Tun Oo (Minister of Defence)
2. Lt General Soe Htut (Minister for Home Affairs)
3. Lt General Than Hlaing (Deputy Minister for Home Affairs)

In addition, further safeguards are being put in place to stop UK businesses working with Myanmar's military and to prevent UK aid indirectly supporting the military-led government. This is following the conclusion of an aid review, announced immediately after the coup. Support for government-led reforms has been withdrawn and planned programmes will close. The UK government has announced that it will put in place measures to ensure aid is reaching 'only the poorest and most vulnerable' in Myanmar.

UKRAINE

Ukraine: Sanctions for doing business in the Crimea and occupied territories in the East of Ukraine

On 19 February 2021, Ukraine imposed via [Presidential Decree No. 64/2021 dated 19 February 2021 “On the Decision of the National Security and Defense Council “On Imposition and Amendment of Personal Special Economic and other Restrictive Measures \(Sanctions\)”](#) (the “Sanctions Decision”) personal sanctions against a number of companies and individuals doing business in the Crimea and on the occupied territories of Donetsk and Luhansk regions (“Temporary Occupied Territories”) and suspected of terrorism financing, as well as on certain Russian-owned businesses. The sanctions were imposed against:

- Trading House Donskiye Ugli LLC, which allegedly sold coal produced on the Temporary Occupied Territories to the Russian Federation
- Novoshakhtinsky Refinery Plant JSC for allegedly selling petroleum products to the Temporary Occupied Territories
- IT companies Indusoft LLC and ISS Soft LLC
- Sportmaster Operations Pte. Ltd, the owner of the major sportswear retail shop
- pharmaceutical company Biotech LLC
- medical equipment producers Haemogenics LLC and Medoborudovaniye LLC
- Russian individuals — shareholders and managers of companies doing business on the Temporary Occupied Territories
- pro-Russian politician Viktor Medvedchuk, notorious for his ties with the Russian president Vladimir Putin; Oksana Marchenko, the wife of Viktor Medvedchuk, and Natalia Lavrenyuk, the wife of the media tycoon Taras Kozak, who was sanctioned earlier this month
- airway companies that operated illegal flights from Kyiv to Moscow

The Sanctions Decision imposes a broad set of restrictions on the sanctioned companies and individuals including:

- assets freeze
- restriction or full prohibition of trade transactions
- suspension of performance of economic and financial obligations
- prevention of the withdrawal of capital from Ukraine

The full list of sanctioned persons and applicable sanctions restrictions is set forth in the annexes to the Sanctions Decision.

Any counterparty dealing with entities or individuals on the sanctions lists must carefully assess the exact scope of the sanctions imposed and the implications of dealing with such entities and individuals.

Ukraine imposes its first-ever sectoral sanctions

In response to opening the consulate of the Republic of Nicaragua in the temporarily occupied Crimea, on 2 February 2021 the Parliament of Ukraine for the first time in its history approved [sectoral sanctions against the Republic of Nicaragua](#) ("Sectoral Sanctions").

The Sectoral Sanctions are effective for a period of five years and include, in particular, the following restrictions:

- prohibition of export to and import from Nicaragua of coffee, tea, mate tea, spices, fruits, nuts, tobacco and industrial tobacco substitutes
- full termination of transit of resources, flights and transportation through the territory of Ukraine
- restrictions on the withdrawal of capital from Ukraine
- suspension of the performance of economic and financial obligations
- prohibition of issuing permits, licenses of the National Bank of Ukraine for making investments in the Republic of Nicaragua, and placement of currency values on accounts and deposits in the territory of the Republic of Nicaragua
- termination of issuing permits, licenses for import to Ukraine from the Republic of Nicaragua or export from Ukraine of currency values and restriction of cash withdrawals from payment cards issued by residents of the Republic of Nicaragua
- prohibition of registration by the National Bank of Ukraine of a participant in an international payment system where the payment organization is a resident of the Republic of Nicaragua
- prohibition of transfer of technologies and IP rights to Nicaraguan residents

Since the Sectoral Sanctions have been applied for the first time in Ukraine since the approval of the Law of Ukraine "On Sanctions" No. 1644-VII dated 14 August 2014 ("Sanctions Law"), we anticipate further official clarifications and new enforcement practice from the Ukrainian authorities clarifying the exact scope of the application of the Sectoral Sanctions.

We recommend that Ukrainian residents and foreign companies doing business in Ukraine carefully assess any dealings involving Nicaragua for their compliance with the Ukrainian sanctions restrictions.

Ukraine imposes a new set of personal sanctions

Between 28 January and 2 February 2021, the president of Ukraine enacted three decisions of the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine:

- [Presidential Decree No. 29/2021 dated 28 January 2021 "On the Decision of the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine dated 28 January 2021 "On Amending the Decision of the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine dated 14 December 2020 enacted by Presidential Decree No. 564-27r dated 14 December 2020.""](#) effective from 30 January 2021.
- [Presidential Decree No. 36/2021 dated 29 January 2021 "On the Decision of the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine dated 29 January 2021 "On Imposing Personal Special Economic and Other Restrictive Measures \(Sanctions\)."](#) effective from 2 February 2021.

- [Presidential Decree No. 43/2021 dated 2 February 2021 “On the Decision of the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine dated 2 February 2021 “On Imposing Personal Special Economic and Other Restrictive Measures \(Sanctions\).”](#) effective from 4 February 2021.

(“Sanctions Decisions”) imposing personal special economic and other restrictive measures (sanctions). The Sanctions Decisions target the following persons:

- Chinese nationals Wang Jing, Du Tao, Cheng Huisheng and companies Skyrizon Aircraft Holdings Limited, Hong Kong Skyrizon Holdings Limited, Beijing Skyrizon Aviation Industry Investment Co. Ltd., Beijing Xinwei Technology Group Co. Ltd. and Twinstar Holdings S.A. (“Chinese Investors”) — the current and prospective shareholders of Motor Sich PJSC, a Ukrainian aircraft engines manufacturer. The aim of the sanctions is to prevent the concentration of shares of Motor Sich, one of the world's largest manufacturers of aircraft engines, in the hands of the Chinese Investors.
- JET4U, an airline company operating flights to the Crimea.
- Ukrainian media tycoon Taras Kozak allegedly related to the pro-Russian politician Viktor Medvedchuk.
- Ukrainian TV channels 112 TV, Zik, Newsone and certain other media companies beneficially owned by Taras Kozak (“**Media Companies**”).

The Sanctions Decisions impose the following restrictions:

- assets freeze — temporary restriction of the right of a person to use and dispose of their property
- restriction of trade transactions
- restriction on the withdrawal of capital from Ukraine

The sanctions imposed against the Chinese Investors also include the following restrictions:

- The Chinese Investors are prohibited from acquiring new shares in Motor Sich PJSC.
- The increase of share capital in the Ukrainian companies in which the Chinese Investor directly or through other entities owns 10% and more of the share capital or otherwise exercises influence on the management of the company is prohibited.
- Ukrainian residents are prohibited from entering into any transaction with respect to the securities issued by the Chinese Investors.

The sanctions imposed against TV channels 112 TV, Zik, Newsone and the Media Companies additionally prohibit:

- the broadcasting of TV channels 112 TV, Zik, Newsone and the distribution of TV programs of the Media Companies
- the provision of telecommunication services to the Media Companies and of the use of public telecommunication networks by the Media Companies
- the transfer of technologies and IP rights to and from the Media Companies


